

Saint Maria Maravillas was born in Madrid in 1891. She entered Carmel on October 12.1919.

She emphasized prayer and self-sacrifice with a passionate zeal for the glory of God and the salvation of souls. Even while living a life of poverty in the cloister, she helped those in need, initiating apostolic,

social and charitable works. In Spain she founded a Carmel convent at Cerro de Los Angeles and 9 others throughout Spain and 1 in India. She died on Dec. 11, 1974, canonized by St. John Paul II in Madrid on May 4, 2003.



Gregorian chant is another name for the traditional plain chant — a melody sung without musical accompaniment — that is used to intone liturgical prayer. It recalls the role that music-loving *Pope St. Gregory I, the Great* (540-604) took in organizing, improving, and establishing norms for liturgical music. *Pope St. Gregory* had been a Benedictine monk before his election to the Papacy, and brought that tradition of plain chant to the whole Church.



DID POPE FRANCIS CHANGE CHURCH TEACHING?

"I felt like there was a seismic shift in Church teaching concerning transgenderism in recent weeks. And that's because so many headlines got the story wrong.

The New York Times, for example, reported: "Pope Francis, who has made reaching out to L.G.B.T.Q. Catholics a hallmark of his papacy, has made clear that transgender people can be baptized, serve as godparents and be witnesses at church weddings, furthering his vision of a more inclusive Church."

So what actually happened?

In a doctrinal note issued from the Vatican, Pope Francis and Cardinal Victor Manuel Fernandez offered a nuanced response to several pastoral questions. The document, signed on October 31 and posted for the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith's (DDF) website on November 8, addressed the participation of "transsexual and homo-affective persons" in baptisms and weddings. I'll just address the question whether or not a transgender person, even one who has undergone medical intervention can be baptized.

Before we get to that, recall that Pope Francis has consistently and unequivocally denounced transgender ideology throughout his pontificate.

Speaking in Hungary in April, the Holy Father warned Hungarian civil authorities from falling prey to the "ideological colonization" of gender theory. A month before, he said the same thing to the journalist Elisabetta Pique of La Nacion: "Gender ideology, today, is one of the most dangerous ideological colonizations."

IN 2016, Pope Francis told the bishops of Poland, "Today children – children! – are taught in school that everyone can choose his or her sex. Why are they teaching this? Because the books are provided by the persons and institutions that give you money. These forms of ideological colonization are also supported by influential countries. And this is terrible!"

The Pope has not reversed Catholic teaching. We receive our bodies as male or female. This is settled perennial Catholic teaching, grounded in Scripture and sound philosophy. Under no circumstances can a note from the DDF be read as approval of transgender ideology or the idea of gender identity. So what exactly does the note say? Regarding baptism, the document provides nuanced guidance, emphasizing pastoral prudence. It urges that every situation be carefully considered to safeguard the sacrament, prevent scandal and address any doubts about the moral or subjective disposition of the person involved.

The document instructs that a transgender person be admitted to baptism under the same conditions as the rest of the Faithful. What are those? In order to be baptized, the Church teaches in the Code of Canon Law: "For an adult to be baptized, the person must have manifested the intention to receive baptism, have been instructed sufficiently about the truths of the Faith and Christian obligations, and been tested in the Christian life through the catechumenate." (Canon 865) Accepting JESUS Christ and seeking baptism means renouncing error, rejecting satan and embracing Catholic teaching, including teaching on human sexuality.

The note reaffirms the Church's teaching about baptism, when received without repentance for serious sin, imparts a "sacramental character" that is indelible but does not in that instance confer sanctifying grace.

It would mean, on my reading of the note, inadvisable to admit a post-operative transgender person to the sacrament who has not clearly embraced Catholic teaching. In such a case, scandal and confusion would inevitably ensue. Additionally, no sanctifying grace would be conferred. In a word, the Vatican's recent guidance underscores the Church's duty to accompany her sons and daughters on the path to conversion while upholding the sanctity of the sacraments and avoiding scandal among the Faithful."
