

Incluye Material en Español **DID YOU KNOW.....** that many Catholics (of good will) are unclear or uncertain about Catholic moral teaching as it relates to the issue of voting?

A parishioner, who recently spoke to one of our Priests, told him that her sister in Oregon told her that 'all issues have to be weighed when deciding how to vote.'

That is true, however. . . not all moral acts have the same weight or consequences. (For instance, the moral act of murder is judged and penalized differently than say, the moral act of grand theft. Both are morally wrong, but have very different consequences). All moral acts are not the same, and, all moral issues are not the same.

The Catholic Church defends human life from conception to natural death. Abortion is never a morally acceptable act, without exception. Pope St. John Paul II in Evangelium Vitae ("The Gospel of Life") has clearly taught that abortion is never a morally tolerable option. The American Bishops in their teaching document "Living the Gospel of Life" list different moral issues such as racism, poverty, employment, education, housing, and health care as important matters to consider, and Catholics must work for the best outcome on these very important issues. But to be absolutely clear, the Bishops also say that "being right on such issues can never excuse a wrong choice regarding direct attacks on innocent human life. . . All direct attacks on innocent human life, such as abortion and euthanasia, strike at the very foundation of all other rights." The most fundamental right is the right to life. There is not a single issue or even a list of issues that would justify the killing of even one unborn child.

Bishop Thomas Olmsted, the recently retired Bishop of Phoenix, writes the following in his wonderful "Catholics in the Public Square": "In preparing to vote, Catholics need to understand their faith so that their consciences are properly formed. Subsequent to this formation, it is important to research all of the important issues and candidates that will appear on the ballot.

Only after sufficient preparation and prayer, is a Catholic fully ready to discharge his or her responsibilities as a faithful citizen and cast a meaningful vote."

While the Catholic Church does not 'endorse' candidates for public office, much less a political party, our Bishops, as individuals, and as a National body (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops – website: USCCB), regularly address important issues, as official "teachers of the Faith" and help us to rightly form our consciences, so that we can carry out our civil duties and responsibilities based upon the guidance of the Holy Spirit in union with the Church's teaching. Remember, that as Catholics, we believe that the Church enjoys the guidance and direction of the Holy Spirit in a way that is far greater and more certain than that of the Holy Spirit's guidance of any individual. Our belief in this Spirit-breathed authority, which marks a difference between ourselves and other Christian churches, is called the Magistrium – the teaching Office of the Church – endowed with authority from God and providing clear and certain teaching.

(Copies of Bishop Olmsted's booklet are available at the entrance of the church – take one and read it and be an informed Catholic voter – lives depend upon it!)
