

DID YOU KNOW....

that there is a mandatory retirement age for Deacons, Priests and Bishops?

According to Canon Law all Priests and Deacons are required to submit a formal letter of resignation to the Bishop on their 75th birthday. Catholic Bishops are expected to submit their resignation to the Pope at age 75 and Cardinals lose their right to vote in a conclave (to elect a new Pope) at age 80. While all Priests may retire at age seventy (70), those who are able to do so are encouraged to continue in a diocesan assignment until age seventy-five (75). For good reason and with permission of the Bishop, a Priest may retire earlier based upon health concerns.

Fr. Rob turned 75 last June and Fr. Greg turned 75 last Thursday – both submitted their formal letters of resignation to Bishop Weisenburger in accordance with the Canon Law. A Priest (or Deacon) can request to be allowed to continue in active ministry beyond the age of 75 years – usually on a year-to-year basis, depending on health and the ability to continue in effective pastoral ministry.

The Bishop can grant that permission, and, in most cases does so. (This is not the case with Bishops, who are allowed to remain in Office only until their successor is appointed, usually within a year of their retirement.)

Both *Fr. Rob* and *Fr. Greg* have requested to be allowed to continue to serve in active pastoral ministry at *St. Andrew's/ Good Shepherd* and *Bishop Weisenburger* has granted their requests based on the usual conditions! Please know that this is not 'semi-retirement' – we will continue to serve to the very best of our ability, if fact, *Fr. Rob* has also been asked to become an Oblate of *the Benedictine Monastery of Christ-in-the- Desert*, in New Mexico, and will be spending more time with that Community. And *Fr. Greg* has been appointed State Chaplain for the *Knights of Columbus* and will be serving in that ministry for the next three years. *Fr. Samuel* has been reappointed Father Provincial for the Via Christi Fathers in the U.S. and continues with that important ministry! There is no 'retirement' from Priesthood!

SO. . .in answer to the question, 'Are Fr. Rob or Fr. Greg retiring soon?: No changes in our Pastoral Staff are anticipated at this time. Please pray for the health of our Priests and Deacons! Retirement from active ministry will, of course, come at some point, so continue to pray and work for Vocations!



CATHOLIC QUIZ: This week's Question: "What is the so-called 'Straw of a Genius'?"



The Answer to Last Week's Question: "Who is the Apostle Matthew?" Matthew, whose Feast Day is September 21st, is called *Levi* in the Gospels of Mark and Luke. A despised tax collector for the Roman occupiers of the Holy Land, Matthew was called by our Lord from his 'customs post' in Capernaum to be disciple, and later, an Apostle!

Pope Francis told how he experienced God calling him to the Priesthood at the age of 17, as he was on his way to a picnic on the Feast of St. Matthew – the first Day of Spring in Argentina. He felt the same unexpected mercy that Matthew had felt, and he identified with the Apostle, later adopting as his episcopal motto the words 'Miserando atque eligendo'.

This tightly packed Latin phrase, which *Pope Francis* saw as applying to himself, has the sense:

"He (JESUS) looked at him (Matthew) with eyes of mercy and chose him."



near Amery, WI, where I am in the midst of training for my year serving with NET Ministries!

First, I want to express my gratitude for accompanying me to "go and make disciples" (Matthew 28:19). This mission is vital as young people decide to leave the Church earlier than ever. Your prayers and financial support give me the strength, grace, and opportunity to share Christ with young people throughout the country and carry out this mission alongside the other NET Missionaries.

All 120 missionaries from across the country (and several from Spain, England, Scotland, The Netherlands, and Canada!) arrived in West St. Paul on August 16th to begin five weeks of spiritual formation and ministry training. The beginning of NET Training focuses on deepening our relationship with Christ and growing in the knowledge of our Catholic faith. Considerable time is devoted to establishing a vibrant, daily prayer life where we seek to listen to God's voice. Because we "can't give what we don't have," we dedicate ourselves to receiving God's grace to invite youth into a similar relationship with God. In the next two weeks, all of us missionaries will be assigned either to a retreat team that travels regionally facilitating retreats or to a discipleship team that ministers in a particular community for the entire year. During the second half of training, we'll learn and hone the skills needed to effectively communicate the Gospel to young people: giving presentations, sharing our personal testimonies, and leading small groups. We will also be trained in how to pray with young people and provide them with an opportunity to respond to God's invitation to make Him the center of their life.

Aside from our pattern of daily Mass, prayer, and formational lessons, I participate in a small group, sharing and getting to know the other missionaries. It is encouraging to be immersed in a community so on fire for spreading God's love.

I am excited about the path God has set before me this year and the memories I will make. I know this year will provide opportunities for growth in flexibility, charity, and humility. My life and those of many others around me are already changing. This would not be possible without your generosity and prayers. Throughout the year, I will keep you informed of what God is doing in my ministry.

Sadly, our culture often pits a mother against her children, portraying a false "either/or" choice between her children and her dreams. Inaccurate messages spread the idea that a woman's life is "over" once she becomes a mother.

But we know that countless young mothers have become unexpectedly pregnant and have continued to pursue education. And arguably, they do so not in spite of their children, but because of their children. Even if things don't go exactly according to plan—timelines may shift, and dreams may change—the twists and turns can bring unexpected joy, purpose, and growth.

In The Gospel of Life, Pope St. John Paul II commends "brave mothers... who are ready to make any effort, to face any sacrifice, in order to pass on to [their children] the best of themselves" (EV 86). As members of the Body of Christ, we have a responsibility to help mothers do just that. And

there are simple ways we can help mothers who desire to pursue educational achievements.

We can offer to babysit or do the grocery shopping, so a mom has time to attend an evening class or study for an exam. We can advocate for colleges and universities to provide flexibility for parenting students. We can do these and so many other things. Most importantly, we can pray for mothers to be given the grace and the support they need, and for the wisdom to know how we can help.
