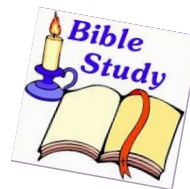

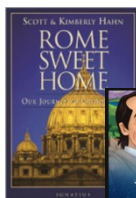

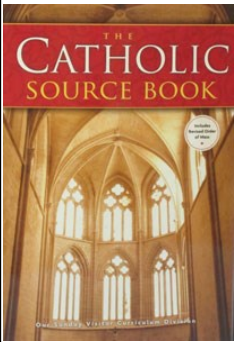

CATHOLIC QUIZ: This week's Question: "What is a 'pastor'?"



The Answer to Last Week's Question: "What is the significance of the Birth of John the Baptist?" While most saints are remembered in the Church's Calendar on the day of their death (or martyrdom), the Church celebrates the Birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary (September 8th) and of John the Baptist, because of their essential roles in the plan of salvation, even from before their births. John, as the Forerunner of Christ, is conceived in miraculous circumstances to elderly parents, and his birth is surrounded by unusual events, filling "the neighbors with awe and the news about these things spread through all the hill country of Judea" (Luke 1:65-66) The Feast of the Birth of John the Baptist is celebrated on June 24th – the longest day of the year ("Midsummer") and 6 months before Christmas Eve. From this day the days will grow shorter, while the days after Christmas grow longer: "He must increase, and I must decrease!" (John 3:30).

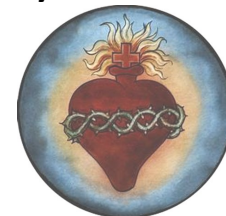

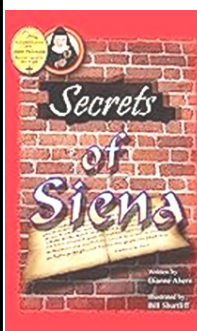

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time—July 2nd, 2023

GriefShare is a nationwide biblical support group that is focused on helping people who are dealing with a loved one's death. Each DVD session features nationally respected grief experts and real-life stories, followed by small group discussion about the topics presented (with workbook support). At each GriefShare session you will find encouragement and help in grieving the death of your loved one. No matter the cause of your loved one's death, this is an opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling. You will learn how to recognize the symptoms of being stuck in grief and how to cope with the normal emotions that come when grieving a death. You will learn valuable information on facing life situations, and you'll gain renewed hope for the future. These sessions are open to anyone regardless of whether your experience is recent or not so recent. The group is led by individuals who have personally experienced grief due to a loved one's death. Each leader is trained in facilitating a GriefShare support group.

Our GriefShare group meets every Wednesday, 5 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. in Madonna Hall, room #3.

We hope you will consider joining us. Please remember your loss is shared by others in this church and what you are experiencing is sometimes easier to bear knowing others are listening and do care. May God's love continue to comfort and strengthen you.

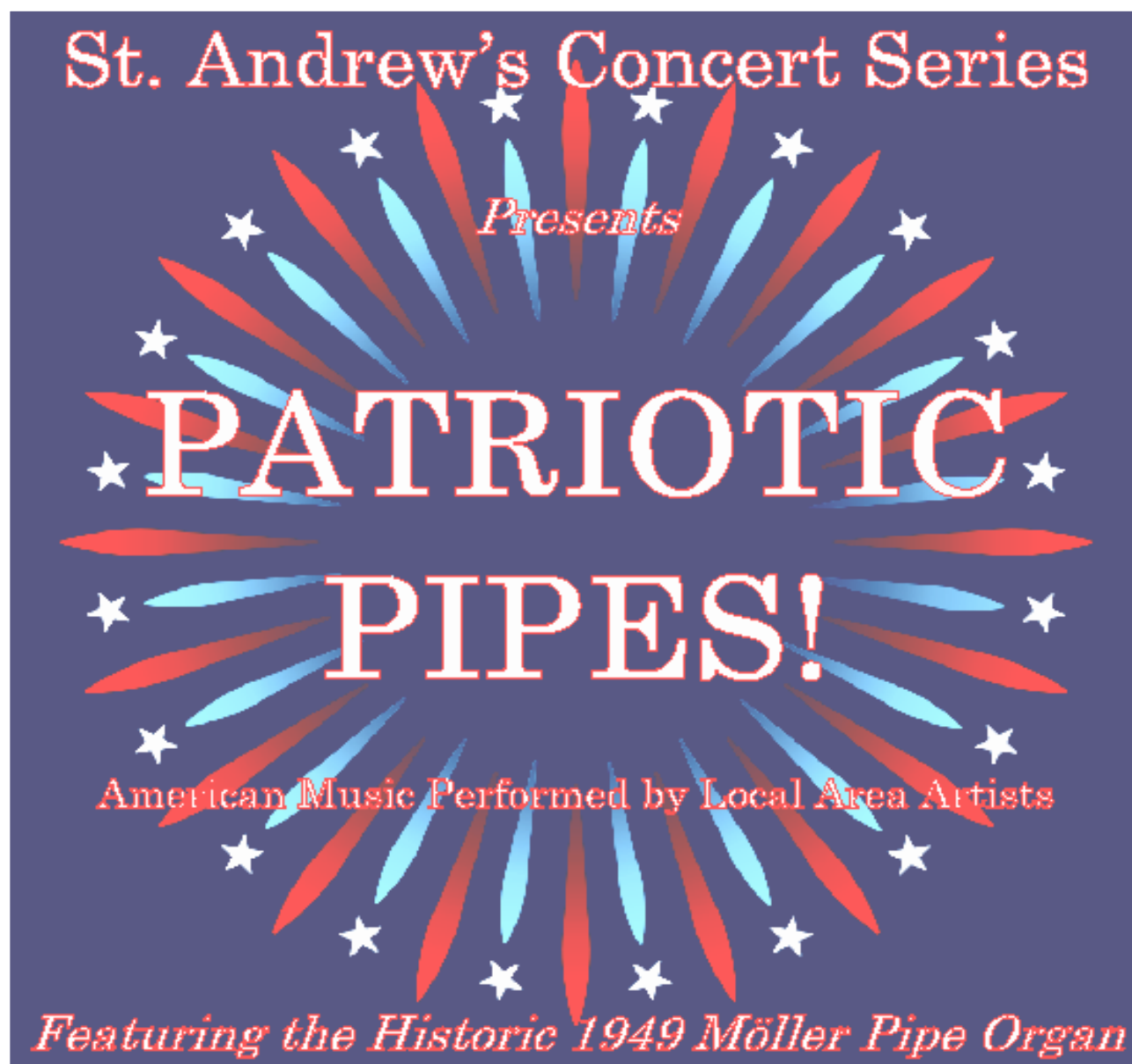

REFLECT

While we often think of pregnancy as culminating in the birth of child, we know that the journey is only just beginning. While motherhood brings with it many joys and blessings, it also involves challenges and difficulties. In raising their children and dedicating themselves to their families, mothers participate in a type of “daily heroism,” one for which they “do not always find support in the world around them” (EV 86). Providing and caring for children as a single mother includes additional hardships. Sadly, today, one in four children are being raised without a father. Certainly, there are many reasons this might occur in any given circumstance. However, it is also true that in a culture that largely rejects the Church’s teachings on marriage, life, and sexuality, women and their children are often disproportionately impacted. It was Pope Paul VI in *Humanae vitae* who warned that, “a man who grows accustomed to the use of contraceptive methods may forget the reverence due to a woman... no longer considering her as his partner whom he should surround with care and affection” (HV 17).

In the midst of this reality, the Church is called to be a beacon of light, hope, and support. May we respond to this call, individually and communally, to surround mothers with assistance and support as they lovingly care for their children.

ACT (choose one)

- Saints Anne and Joachim—whose feast is celebrated on July 26—were the parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Parents often seek the intercession of these married saints as they raise their own children. Offer this prayer (bit.ly/anne-joachim), asking Saints Anne and Joachim to pray for the featured intention.
- Fast from television, social media, music, or electronics altogether for one day. Ask the Lord to use the quiet and stillness to bring you more closely to Him.
- Offer some other sacrifice, prayer, or act of penance that you feel called to do for the featured intention.

June 20th, 2023**

Linda K. called the meeting to order at 5:40 p.m. and Fr. Greg led the group in an opening prayer.

Budget Vote: The Council m/s/c the budget as submitted for 2024.

Board of Directors meeting: The meeting paused to participate in the Board of Directors meeting. Deacon Greg Henderson attended by phone as proxy for Fr. Ed Lucero. (Regular meeting resumed at 5:48 p.m.)

Minutes from the May meeting were approved as written.

Finance (Kate): Income for May was \$74,832 of which \$4,293 were designated to Good Shepherd Mission. Expenses were \$90,118. The Parish general fund level is \$533,804. The Building Our Church fund balance is \$85,324.

Ladies of St A (Fran): Ladies continue collecting donations and preparing for the November Bazaar

Music/Organ (Michelle): The new digital voice has been installed in the pipe organ.

A programming error on the chimes will be corrected before the Patriotic Concert on July 7th.

Members of the Knights of Columbus will provide the Color Guard at the Concert.

ACA update and Building and Grounds (Maryann): Pledges fulfilled have brought the Parish to 113% of goal. A rat nest in the water meter at Good Shepherd mission caused it to malfunction and resulted in a bill of \$1,840. This is a false reading. Liberty Utilities has acknowledged the malfunction and will schedule installation of a new meter as soon as possible. The water is turned off and a portable toilet is in place at the Mission. A parishioner donated the block wall recently installed around the heating and cooling units outside Kino Hall.

St Vincent de Paul Society (Pauline): Thrift Stores sales in May were over \$42,000. 964 food boxes were distributed from the Food Bank, serving 3,124 family members. The Conference staff continue to work with agencies that hope to organize a County-wide food drive.

Knights of Columbus (Larry): Each council will be responsible for having a member that coordinates prayer and faith formation.

St. Andrew Scholarship (Kate for Thad): A anonymous donor gave \$500 to each of the applicants that were not selected for a scholarship.

The Council congratulated Fr. Samuel as he will be sworn in as a US Citizen on Friday the 24th of June.

Pastor Report: Genevieve Rivera has been hired as the new Director of Religious Education. Ilse Garcia will be assuming the responsibilities of Social Media Coordinator. Seminarian Carlos will be assigned to help her when he arrives as this is an area of expertise for him. Fr. Greg and Fr. Rob will no longer be ministering to Tombstone as new Pastor Fr. Mark Stein will assume leadership of the Parish on July 1st. Each Parish has been asked to encourage vocations, and St. Andrew and Our Lady of the Mountains have been working with such a group, the "Seekers."

Bishop Weisenburger will attend the next Seekers meeting this week at Our Lady of the Mountains Parish. The next Diocesan audit will be at the end of September. Randi Burros and Binh Ly are enrolled in the permanent Diaconate formation program. Binh will be the first Vietnamese permanent Deacon in the Diocese. Fr. Greg again thanked the B&G committee headed by Maryann and the maintenance staff and the generous Parishioners that donate so much of their time and expertise on necessary work. The Knights of Columbus will host an ice cream social to bid farewell to Fr. Simon on July 22nd from 2 to 4 pm in Kino Hall.

Linda adjourned the meeting at 6:49 p.m. and Fr Samuel led the group in a closing prayer.
