

# DID YOU KNOW....

that in a presentation to the Clergy of the Diocese of Tucson, Cardinal Joseph Tobin, said that if you want to understand Pope Francis' 'agenda for ministry', it can be summed up in three "M's": MERCY, MISSION, MARGINS? We don't have a "Parish Mission Statement" per se, but it would be difficult to come up with a better or more basic statement for our Parish's 'agenda for ministry' than that of Pope Francis!

We really begin, as everything does in our Catholic Faith, with the Mercy of God! The Mercy of God is not an abstract concept or an ideal of what Mercy could be, but the Mercy of God is actually incarnate (enfleshed) in the God/Man JESUS Christ.

Everything that our Lord says and everything that He does demonstrates what this Mercy is all about, and it is infinite! This Mercy is really the heart of the Good News that we are each called to incarnate in our own daily lives. "Be merciful, as your Father in heaven is merciful." (LUKE 6:36)

We are never to keep this Mercy to ourselves, but we are always 'sent' by the Holy Spirit to live this Mercy in Mission (the meaning of the Latin word 'missio' is "sent")! Recall Pope Benedict XVI's words: "The Church doesn't have a mission; the Church is Mission, or it's not the Church of JESUS Christ!" At the conclusion of the Mass the Deacon (or Priest) proclaims this 'sending': "Go in peace to love and serve the Lord!" And so we take the Mercy which we ourselves have received into a world desperate for mercy! We become ministers/agents of that Mercy in Mission. The Church (all of us!) are being sent! Where? How far? To whom? To the Margins! To the littlest, the least, the most easily overlooked or forgotten, to whoever is 'marginalized' in our society and our neighborhoods! St. Vincent de Paul Food Bank, Good Neighbor Alliance, Forgach House, the County Jail, the Hospital and Nursing Homes, to name but a few!

AND, stretching beyond the immediate neighborhood of our own Parish, we look to the world – Nigeria, Haiti, Ecuador, Mexico, Nepal, Kyrgyzstan, to name but a few places beyond the margins of our own immediate community!

All of our Parish activities, ministries, and priorities should be shaped and informed by the "three M's" and, of course, what is true of the Parish Community should be true of the 'domestic Church': our own homes and families!

FOOD for thought: There is a lot of arrogant criticism of Arizona's 'antiquated' anti-abortion law of 1864. Consider that there is another law that dates back to the same decade. It is the 14<sup>th</sup> Amendment of the Constitution, and it dates to 1868. It states that you cannot treat another human being as someone's personal property: the immorality of slavery was declared illegal. The same principle applies in both laws: you cannot treat a human being as disposable personal property. You can't 'own' another person as a possession. The immorality of abortion should also be illegal.

Linda K. called the meeting to order at 5:32 p.m. and Fr. Greg led the group in an opening prayer.

Minutes from the March meeting were approved as written.

Finance (Kate): Income for March was \$101,236 of which \$1,583 were designated to Good Shepherd Mission. Expenses were \$82,884. Although overall income did exceed monthly expenses, we fell short of the offering plate projection by \$34,000. The Parish general fund level is \$595,842. The Building Our Church fund balance is \$67,050.

Music Ministry (Michelle): Douglas Leightenheimer, an organist currently residing in California will be here on Sunday, April 21st at 2 p.m. for a concert in the Church. The organ tuning contract has been awarded to Dale Sorenson, selected as he is also experienced with repair and refurbishment of pipe organs. Patriotic Pipes will be the theme of the next concert on July 7th.

Building and Grounds (Maryann): The Committee is working on a list of necessary repairs to be included in the capital budget for fiscal year 2025. A plumber will be in to address the problems with the hot water in the Church restrooms. The part needed to repair the heating system at Good Shepherd Mission is on backorder. Additional round tables have been purchased for Kino Hall. It was m/s/c to spend \$3,500 repair the sidewalk on the northwest side of the church, damaged because of tree roots. The Parish groundskeeper, Mark Williams, has retired. Plans are to contract a local vendor for groundskeeping.

Our Lady of the Sierras (Charlie): A large number of pilgrims attended the Holy Week and Easter celebrations at the shrine.

St Vincent de Paul Society (Pauline): Parishioner Kathy Riebock is sponsoring a peanut butter and jelly drive for the Food Bank. Those who donate will be entered into a raffle for a gift basket. A community foundation in Ohio is offering non-profits nationwide the opportunity to apply for a grant. St. Vincent will be applying. 885 food boxes were distributed in March. Pauline continues to work with an architect for design of a canopy to cover the donation area at the Thrift Store. The annual postal worker food drive is scheduled for May 11th.

Knights of Columbus (Larry): There are now 19,000 members in the State of Arizona! The State Council filmed the Stations of the Cross in Sedona on Good Friday.

**Catholic Foundation News** (Ann): Details are being finalized for the annual gala in September.

Fr Samuel related accounts of his time spent at the San Solano Missions during Lent and Easter.

Pastor Report: Poor weather did not deter large numbers of worshippers on Easter Sunday. The March 17th organ concert featuring Carlos Zapien received great reviews. Fr. Greg expressed thanks to the Chouinard Foundation for sponsoring the event. Fr. Bob Gonzales is now residing at the former convent, now known as the St. Francis House. He will be assisting the Parish as needed. 56 young people were confirmed last Sunday. Bishop Weisenburger voiced special appreciation of Pauline Fredericks who served as photographer for the event.

Linda adjourned the meeting at 6:33 p.m., Fr. Greg led the group in a closing prayer, and Fr. Samuel blessed the group.



# HAND CARVED in BETHLEHEM

PLEASE STOP BY THE RELIGIOUS WARES TABLES (Nativity set, rosaries, statues, crucifixes, charms, etc.)

### AFTER ALL THE MASSES THE WEEKEND of May 11 & 12

Ayman Khair is representing about 180 Christian families from Bethlehem. These families have been dependent upon sales of their hand carved religious articles to tourists of the Holy Land. Due to the conflict in the Middle East and the Pandemic, tourism has been stopped completely from March 2, 2020, till February 2022, and now because of what is going on in the Holy Land tourism has stopped completely.

It is very important to support them at this critical time since they have no income and there is no tourism at all. In order to survive, they have turned to Christian communities in the United States to purchase their articles.

These hand carved religious articles are beyond description. Carved from wood of the sacred Olive tree, this workmanship has been traditional for these families for hundreds of years. It is hoped that through the efforts of Mr. Khair, these families who have little income will be able to stay living and survive in the Holy Land.

Sadly enough, the Christian population dropped from 22 % to less than 2% in the last 20 years.



# From Your Parish Library



The Catholic Martyrs of the Twentieth Century – A Comprehensive World History

WENTIETH CENTURY BOBERT ROYAL BOBERT ROYAL by Robert Royal is an in-depth look at the Catholic martyrs of the 20<sup>th</sup> century.

Did you know more Catholics were persecuted and martyred in the 20<sup>th</sup> century than in any previous century? "[this book] presents a wide-ranging history of these martyrs and traces the specific situation of each area and time when martyrdom occurred, and studies the political system and reason for confrontation. Regions and topics include Calvary of Romania, Edith Stein, Miguel Pro and the


