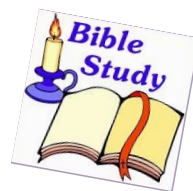

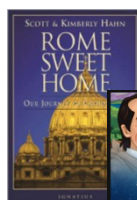

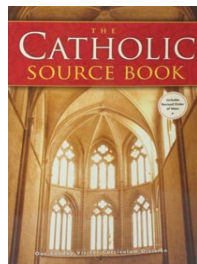

CATHOLIC QUIZ: *The Answer to This Week's Question: "What are the 'O Antiphons'?"*



The Answer to Last Week's Question: "What is the 'Season of Advent'?" The four Sundays leading up the Solemnity of Christmas, mark the 'Season of Advent', which is a liturgical expression of the expectation of the Coming ('Advent') of Christ, and is penitential in tone (hence the violet color used during the Season, and the omission of the "Gloria"). It is four weeks long or slightly less. The first two weeks of Advent focus on Christ's Final Coming as Lord and Judge. The final eight days anticipate His coming in history (Christmas). Since the 10th Century, the First Sunday in Advent has marked the beginning of the Church Year in the Western Church.

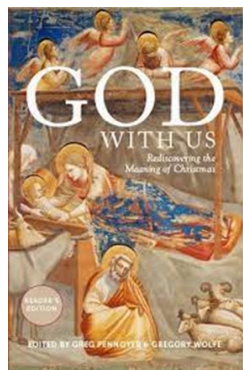

COMUNIDAD LAS POSADAS



***Las Posadas, celebrated yearly from December 16-24, is a religious festival traditionally held in Mexico and parts of Latin America. Translating to "The Inns" in Spanish, Las Posadas is an important part of the Christmas festivities. Over the nine nights of celebrations, parties are held at different people's homes. Before each gathering, all the guests form a procession to mark Mary and Joseph's search for an inn on the night of Jesus' birth. The march is usually led by an angel as a symbolic act of Mary and Joseph finding shelter in a stable when they were unable to find lodging in Bethlehem. The parties are joyous occasions, including prayers, food, music, fireworks, and piñatas!**
