DID YOU KNOW

that the Season of Advent is very much a "Marian Season"? The 'Advent Advantage' for Catholics is entering into this holy season in company with Our Lady. Advent can very much be a virtual Pilgrimage as we journey with Mary through the Feast Days and 'visiting' the Marian shrines in our own Parish church! Ours is a very "Marian" Parish, with many visible signs of our great devotion to Our Lady.

The church bells sound forth the Angelus each day from the "Ave Maria Tower" (a gift of the Knights of Columbus), while the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe graces the south façade of the church, as well as the shrine located on the west end of Kino Hall, depicting St. Juan Diego knelling before the Apparition. Another image of Our Lady of Guadalupe is enshrined above the entrance of Madonna Hall. A beautiful statue of Our Lady of Grace stands in the Memorial Prayer Garden, and many make visits to the Shrine to the Holy Family in the south parking lot. In the Gathering Room of the church is the image of Our Lady Who Unties Knots. The special significance of this image of our Lady, made enormously popular by the devotion to her by Pope Francis, is that ours was only the second dedicated parish shrine to Her in the United States! Pick up a 'holy card' and pray the prayer written for our Parish's use!

When you enter the church itself, you see that a Rosary 'railing' in cast stone surrounds the whole Sanctuary, a detail repeated in the *Divine Mercy Chapel*. The principal image of Our Lady in the church is the Madonna and Child carved in Oberammergau for our original church, enshrined at the front of the Sanctuary. The full-sized image of Our Lady of Guadalupe on the first niche on the east side is paralleled by an image of Our Lady of Mount Carmel on the west side. In the *Divine Mercy Chapel* are located the images of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Our Lady of La Vang, and Our Lady of Czestochowa – each important to our Filipino, Vietnamese, and Polish communities!





The Answer to Last Week's Question: "What is a 'Holy Day of Obligation'?" These are days marking events and persons of the greatest importance and universal significance in salvation history – and so have the same 'weight' as a Sunday! There are 8 Holy Days of Obligation in the United States: 1) *Christmas,* 2) *Epiphany,* 3) *Ascension,* 4) *Corpus Christi,* 5) *Mary, Mother of God,* 6) *Immaculate Conception,* 7) *Assumption of our Lady,* and, 8) *All Saints.* In the United States, Epiphany, Corpus Christi, and Ascension are transferred to the nearest Sunday. Whenever January 1st, (the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God), or August 15th (the Solemnity of the Assumption), or November 1st (All Saints') falls on a Saturday or on a Monday, the Obligation to attend Mass is abrogated. The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is always observed, as she is the Patroness of the United States, hence this week's Observance as a Holy Day of Obligation!


