DID YOU KNOW....

that the Season of Advent is very much a “Marian Season”? The ‘Advent Advantage’ for Catholics is entering into this holy season in company with Our Lady. Advent can very much be a virtual Pilgrimage as we journey with Mary through the Feast Days and ‘visiting’ the Marian shrines in our own Parish church! Ours is a very “Marian” Parish, with many visible signs of our great devotion to Our Lady.

The church bells sound forth the Angelus each day from the “Ave Maria Tower” (a gift of the *Knights of Columbus*), while the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe graces the south façade of the church, as well as the shrine located on the west end of *Kino Hall*, depicting *St. Juan Diego* knelling before the Apparition. Another image of Our Lady of Guadalupe is enshrined above the entrance of *Madonna Hall*. A beautiful statue of Our Lady of Grace stands in the *Memorial Prayer Garden*, and many make visits to the Shrine to the Holy Family in the south parking lot. In the Gathering Room of the church is the image of Our Lady Who Unties Knots. The special significance of this image of our Lady, made enormously popular by the devotion to her by *Pope Francis*, is that ours was only the second dedicated parish shrine to Her in the United States! Pick up a ‘holy card’ and pray the prayer written for our Parish’s use!

When you enter the church itself, you see that a Rosary ‘railing’ in cast stone surrounds the whole Sanctuary, a detail repeated in the *Divine Mercy Chapel*. The principal image of Our Lady in the church is the Madonna and Child carved in Oberammergau for our original church, enshrined at the front of the Sanctuary. The full-sized image of Our Lady of Guadalupe on the first niche on the east side is paralleled by an image of Our Lady of Mount Carmel on the west side. In the *Divine Mercy Chapel* are located the images of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Our Lady of La Vang, and Our Lady of Czestochowa – each important to our Filipino, Vietnamese, and Polish communities!

We are a “Marian” Parish, and we will honor Our Lady’s Immaculate Conception with Masses on Thursday 7 December, at 6:30 PM at *Good Shepherd Mission*, and on Friday, 8 December, with Masses at 9:00 AM (livestreamed), 12:05 Noon, and 7:00 PM (bi-lingual) On Monday, 11 December, we will honor Our Lady of Guadalupe, with a Procession at 6:00 PM followed by the multi-lingual Rosary, with Mass at 7:00, Dinner and Matachin Dancers in *Kino Hall* at 8:00, with the Mañanitas following at 10:00 PM!

From the 15th through the 23rd, the Filipino Community invites us share their Advent Novena to our Lady – the “Simbang Gabi” – each evening!

On Saturday, 16 December, we will celebrate the 2nd Annual Community Posadas – accompanying the Blessed Mother and St. Joseph in their search for shelter before the Birth!

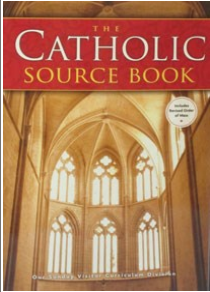


Catholic Community Services of Sierra Vista Infinity Tree

CATHOLIC QUIZ: This coming week's question: "What is Gregorian Chant"?



The Answer to Last Week's Question: "What is a 'Holy Day of Obligation'?" These are days marking events and persons of the greatest importance and universal significance in salvation history – and so have the same 'weight' as a Sunday! There are 8 Holy Days of Obligation in the United States: 1) *Christmas*, 2) *Epiphany*, 3) *Ascension*, 4) *Corpus Christi*, 5) *Mary, Mother of God*, 6) *Immaculate Conception*, 7) *Assumption of our Lady*, and, 8) *All Saints*. In the United States, Epiphany, Corpus Christi, and Ascension are transferred to the nearest Sunday. Whenever January 1st, (the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God), or August 15th (the Solemnity of the Assumption), or November 1st (All Saints') falls on a Saturday or on a Monday, the Obligation to attend Mass is abrogated. The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is always observed, as she is the Patroness of the United States, hence this week's Observance as a Holy Day of Obligation!

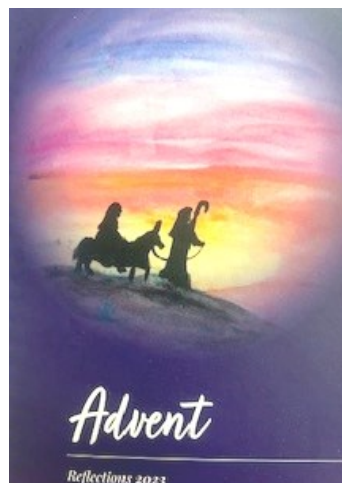

Each year during Advent, we prepare our hearts to celebrate the birth of Christ our Savior at Christmas. As we anticipate this joyful celebration, we recall the journey of the Holy Family from Nazareth to Bethlehem. Far from home, poor, and in great need, Mary and Joseph find refuge in a simple stable. But this humble setting among the livestock soon welcomes the heavenly host of angels and the infant Jesus himself.

Today, women in our own communities are pregnant, poor, perhaps without a home, and in great need. They may feel alone, scared, and overwhelmed, not knowing where to turn. In challenging circumstances, expectant mothers need a refuge of their own. Like the Holy Family, they may be reliant on the kindness of others. Today, may the story of the first Christmas inspire us to reach out to mothers in need. May we proactively seek to offer loving support and encouragement as they prepare to welcome their children. By answering this call, may we help mothers

- On December 8, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Offer Pope Francis' Prayer for the Immaculate Conception for the featured intention: usccb.org/prayers/pope-francis-prayer-immaculate-conception.
- Contact your local pregnancy resource center or diocesan/parish pregnancy support ministry. Ask about ways you can help, such as volunteering or donating baby items.
- Offer some other sacrifice or prayer that you feel called to do for the featured intention.

The Immaculate Conception celebrates the conception of Mary in the womb of St. Anne without the stain of original sin. This solemnity is sometimes confused with the Annunciation, in which the Church celebrates the conception of Jesus in the womb of the Blessed Mother.
