



The Answer to Last Week's Question: "What is 'Purgatory'?" 'Purgatory' is the purging or purifying by temporal punishment due to sin. It is explained in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (#1054) as a process — not a place — of purification after the death of those who are saved, so that they may enter fully into the happiness and holiness of heaven.

Pope Benedict XVI wrote: "I would go so far as to say that if there were no Purgatory, then we would have to invent it, for who would dare to say of himself that he was able to stand directly before God? And yet we don't want to be, to use an image from Scripture, 'a pot that turned out wrong,' which has to be thrown away; we want to be put right. Purgatory basically means that God can put the broken, misshapen pieces of our lives back together again. That He can cleanse us in such a way that we are able to be with Him and can participate in the fullness of Eternal Life!

Purgatory strips off from one person what is unbearable, and from another the inability to bear certain things, so that in each a pure heart is revealed, and we can see that we all belong together in one enormous symphony of being!"




BLESSING OF THE VINTAGE at Sonoita Vineyards this Saturday, November 11th!
