Some of these groups meet daily, some weekly, and some monthly - and no matter what the group, any one is welcome to join them for Adoration - no group in our Parish is "closed" to other Parishioners but welcomes you to join them in this most beautiful of prayers!


Whether alone or worshipping with a group of your fellow Parishioners, the effects are powerful and striking! It has been widely observed that in parishes where Eucharistic Adoration is regular and not just occasional, marriage is strengthened, people report greater peace in their personal and family lives, Vocations increase, and people come to Confession more regularly. This should not be a surprise to anyone, because our Lord has said:

"If I be lifted up, I will draw all men and women to *Myself!*" (John 12:32) Spending even a few minutes with the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament can and will transform vour dav!

The Answer to Last Week's CATHOLIC Question: "What is *'Mothering Sunday'?"* This is one of the 'aliases' of Laetare (Rejoice) Sunday – the 4^{tr} Sunday of Lent! There was an ancient custom of visiting one's 'mother church' -(where you had been baptized: 'born again') – on

Laetare Sunday! In the natural evolution of this pilgrimage to your 'mother parish', people would spend time with mother and families. Naturally, roses were the traditional flowers for the day, because rose was the color of the vestments at Mass on Laetare Sunday. After Mass, roses were taken to mothers, along with special cakes and gifts. Long before Anna Jarvis held her service to honor all mothers or Woodrow Wilson proclaimed the second Sunday of May to be 'Mothers' Day' in 1914, Catholic folks were honoring mothers, spiritual and natural, and this mid-Lent Sunday had become a day of family reunions and festivity!

Sharing the Gospel

When the Hebrews sinned in the desert, snakes came to bite them. Moses lifted up a metal snake in the desert. If God's people looked at the metal snake, their painful snake bites would be healed. Instead of dying from their snake bites, they would live. Our sins are a lot like those snake bites. Sins turn us away from God, hurt us, and hurt other people. When Jesus was lifted up on the cross, he washed our sins away. Jesus gave us healing and forgiveness. We don't need to die from our sins. We can believe in Jesus, follow God with our whole hearts, and live forever.



GriefShare is a nationwide biblical support group that is focused on helping people who are dealing with a loved one's death. Each DVD session features nationally respected grief experts and real-life stories, followed by small group discussion about the topics presented (with workbook support). The workbook also provides a brief daily Bible study.

At each GriefShare session you will find encouragement and help in grieving the death of your loved one. No matter the cause of your loved one's death, this is an opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling. You will learn how to recognize the symptoms of being stuck in grief and how to cope with the normal emotions that come when grieving a death. You will learn valuable information on facing life situations, and you'll gain renewed hope for the future. These sessions are open to anyone regardless of whether your experience is recent or not so recent. The group is led by individuals who have personally experienced grief due to a loved one's death.

Each leader is trained in facilitating a *GriefShare* support group. Our next *GriefShare* group meets [every Wednesday starting March 13th, 2024, time 5:00pm to 7:00pm, Madonna Hall room #3]. We hope you will consider joining us.

Please remember your loss is shared by others in this church and what you are experiencing is sometimes easier to bear knowing others are listening and do care.

May God's love continue to comfort and strengthen you.
