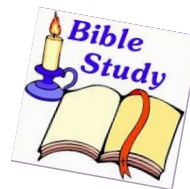

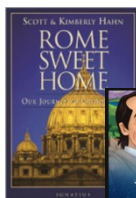

The “*Festival of the Father of Lights*” will be from 6:00-8:00PM - this Monday evening in Len Roberts Park! Please join us for the fun and help out our *Sisters*, *Knights*, *Vincentians*, and *Teens*, and brothers and sisters from the other Christian churches, as they help to provide this safe, fun expression of Christian merry-making for the kids of our Carmichael Neighborhood! 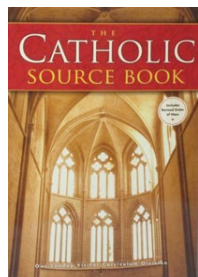

CATHOLIC QUIZ: *This Week's Question: "What is the 'Dies Irae' recited in Masses for the Dead?"*



The Answer to Last Week's Question: "What are 'Mases'?"

'Mases' are Masses! There is an ancient practice of adding the suffix "-mas" to feast days, meaning, "Mass of", and so: Christmas, Candlemas, Michaelmas, Martinmas, Childermas (an old English name for the Feast of the Holy Innocents, December 28).

This week we celebrate the Feast of All Saints, or, in Old English, "All-Hallows". The Vigil of All Hallows (31 October), is "All Hallows' Eve" or, as we know it in the contracted form, "Halloween", now, **sadly**, removed from the original meaning!

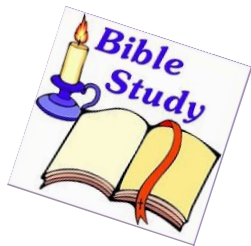

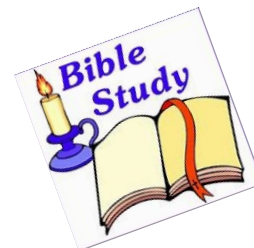

**St. Andrew the Apostle Parish Monthly Council Meeting
October 18th, 2022, 5:30 p.m.**

In Attendance: Fr. Rob Neske, Fr. Simon Muema, Linda Klein, Ann Dickson, Maryann Hockstad, Charlie Irwin, Dcn Lauro & Lupita Teran, Michelle Mitchell, Pauline Fredericks, Ed Graveline, Linda Denno and Kate Callender (recording)

Excused: Chuck Muscato, Larry Powers, Thad Larson, Fran Cassidy

Linda K. called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and Fr. Rob led the group in an opening prayer. Minutes from the September meeting were approved as written.

Finance (Kate): Income for September was \$74,200 of which \$1,169 were designated to Good Shepherd Mission. Expenses were \$104,854. The Parish general fund level is \$534,073. The Building Our Church fund balance is \$90,939. Kate summarized the comments from the recent Parish audit. There were no serious findings, a few minor corrections, and the auditor was visibly pleased with the procedures in place in the Parish.

St Vincent de Paul Society (Pauline): The Thrift Store has reopened. Sales have been wonderful and both staff and patrons are delighted with the new store. 161 friends have already applied for turkey boxes. The parking lot work in front of the conference will be completed next week. There has been an increase in requests for rental and utility assistance because of rising costs.

Building and Grounds (Maryann): The Committee met today. Maintenance staff has rented a bucket lift for use in the Church on November 8th and 9th to replace lighting. Madonna Hall will be closed for Bazaar preparation on the first week of November.

Hispanic Ministries (Lupita): Preparations are underway for the Our Lady of Guadalupe celebration on Sunday December 11th. Mass and dinner will be a bit later this year as the feast falls on a Sunday. The Matachines group held a fundraiser to purchase outfits for the dancers. The "Posadas" is scheduled for December 17th at 7 p.m. and the goal this year is to broaden participation within the local community. A Byzantine Liturgy will be held at the Chapel at Mount Lemmon and will be attended by Deacons and Clergy. The Men's Worldwide Rosary took place on October 8th in the Divine Mercy Chapel. Twelve men from the Parish participated. Next year plans are to further publicize the event and increase participation.

Knights of Columbus and St. Paul's Street Evangelization (Ed): 1,500 people attended the Rosary celebration at the Cathedral on Saturday, October 14th. Installation of officers will take place on October 29th. Members continue to help local community members with yard clean up. The Knights gather for Adoration in the Divine Mercy Chapel one Saturday each month. Ed continues evangelization efforts at various events in the community to include the "Hell Dorado" days in Tombstone this coming Sunday. The Knights will prepare corn dogs for the attendees at the upcoming Father of Lights Festival on October 31st.

Our Lady of the Sierras (Charlie): Bishop Weisenburger will be attending Mass at Our Lady of the Sierras on October 30th. The retreat center is very busy lately with many groups coming through. The annual Christmas Mass is scheduled for December 16th. The Bishop from Nogales, Sonora will be the main celebrant.

Music Ministry (Michelle): The new controller for the organ arrived today, three weeks later than expected. If the installation is not complete in time for Hymn Fest (November 6th), the project lead will make sure there is at least partial use of the instrument for the event. The free will offering this year will benefit the St. Vincent de Paul Society. The Committee is planning some special collections to raise funds for the repairs.

Initial Synod Results and Goals (Michelle): Michelle shared a presentation summarizing initial results from the Parish Synod listening sessions. She invited Council members to think about, and provide input for a discussion to finalize Parish goals.

Fr Rob reminded all that Fort Huachuca has been without a priest since May; Fr Rob has been offering a weekend Mass on the Post since that time. A new priest has been identified and will be arriving in December.

Sacred Heart Parish will have a float in the Hell Dorado days in Tombstone this coming Sunday, the 22nd.

Linda K. adjourned the meeting at 6:34 p.m. and Fr. Simon led the group in a closing prayer.
