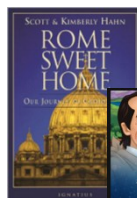

DID YOU KNOW.....

That for us, Catholics, Christmas is not just a day, but a whole Season?

The secular culture around us begins “celebrating Christmas” around the middle of October – on the aisles of most stores, you can find Halloween items and candy, adjacent to Christmas cards and gifts – and abruptly stops the Christmas music on the 26th!

It is really a “Great Shopping Season” - with “post-holiday sales” – which is observed by many people, especially those living in the First (Developed) World.

For Catholics – and most Catholics live in the undeveloped Third World – Christmas has a much deeper, richer meaning. And so, the Season of Christmas – which begins with the Vigil Mass of Christmas Eve and concludes with the Feasts of Epiphany/Baptism of the Lord, is second only in significance to the Easter Season. This is the “Twelve Days of Christmas” that we hear sung about, but which for the most part is not understood nor appreciated.

The Feast Days include: Christmas (December 25th), Holy Family (celebrated this year on Friday, 30 December), Mary, Mother of God (January 1st), Epiphany (Usually, the Sunday after January 1st and this year, celebrated on 8 January), and Baptism of our Lord (This year celebrated on Monday, 9 January). Keeping the Church’s Seasons is an exercise in learning “holy time” – called, in Greek, Kairos: a quality of being, an essence of meaning, significance, and opportunity. This Catholic understanding of the Season is more and more “counter cultural” in a society which has largely lost its sense of holy times and seasons, as well as the necessity of anticipation. Hence, our society’s interpretation of the ‘Season of Christmas’ as a period of frantic shopping and ersatz “holiday cheer” which begins in the middle of October and terminates on December 26th – with little or no marking of religious Feast Days!

The personal challenge for us, as Catholics, in this environment, is to be willing to be “counter cultural” and to live in the Kairos of God’s time – a ‘vertical’ experience of life!

Keep the Season of Christmas in your heart and in your home! Do not be a ‘convert’ to the secularism surrounding us! Celebrate the true meaning of Christmas by ‘savoring it’ and not simply surviving the “Holiday Season”!

Pope St. Paul VI (1897-1978) once said, “When it’s easy to be a Catholic, it’s hard to be a good Catholic. When it’s hard to be a Catholic, it’s easier to be a good Catholic!” The Pope certainly understood the pressures of modern living and the temptations of secularism!

Be a good Catholic – keep the Season of Christmas in your heart and in your home!

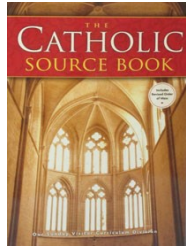

CATHOLIC QUIZ: *This Week's Question: "What is the "Christmas Season"?"*



The Answer to Last Week's Question: "What is the tradition of lighting candles in the home at Christmas?" During the 'Penal Days' of persecution of the Church in Ireland by the English, priests were 'outlawed' and could only visit the homes of the Faithful in secret, where Mass could be said at night. At Christmas time, the Catholic families would leave their doors unlocked and place candles in the window to guide priests to a 'safe haven'.

If any patrolling soldiers noticed the open doors and lit candles, they were told that it was simply to welcome Mary and Joseph on Christmas Eve. The soldiers took the story to be harmless superstition. At Christmas, every Irish Catholic home proudly displays a large, decorated candle – to remember the days when Mass was forbidden, and, to welcome the Holy Family!

Christmas is the 'pre-eminent Festival of Light' in the Church ("*and the Word was the Source of Life and this Life brought light to humankind*" (John 1:4)) and so Christmas is always observed with lights – to welcome the Light of the World!

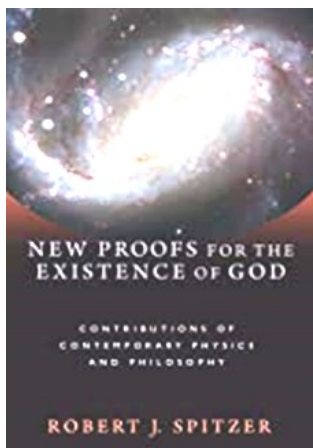

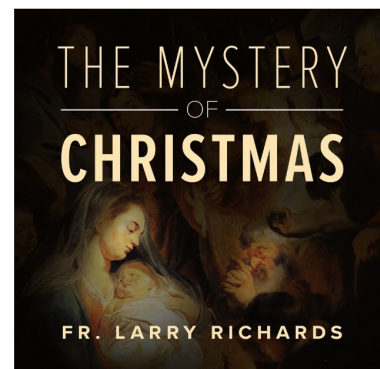
