DID YOU KNOW....

about "thin places"?

A "thin place", according to Irish tradition, is a place or time where heaven and earth touch and we have access to eternity in a different way. It is a 'threshold experience' or 'crossroad experience' - where time (the horizontal) and eternity (the vertical) embrace momentarily.

We are invited to enter and take note of these times and places where the "veil" between the seen and the unseen world is "thinner" than at other times. During this liminal time, we experience a greater sense of the sacredness or Presence of God in a deeper way, as the distance between heaven and earth, light and darkness, past and present becomes porous momentarily. This, briefly, is the Celtic understanding of a "thin place."

November is such a liminal time within the liturgical calendar. All Saints and All Souls and the special remembrance of our deceased loved ones during the Masses of November invite us beyond the present moment of loss to reach out in love as we remember those who have gone before us, whether sinner or saint.

The liturgy of these days tells us that *life is changed not ended*, and the Mass (itself) becomes a "thin place" as we remember that our loved ones are never far away from us, they have "only gone as far as God, and God is here." The Mass brings us into the heart of Calvary, which was the ultimate "thin place" for JESUS, when the veil was torn, and He opened the way for all of us.

"Thin places" are not primarily geographical but a way of being more aware and listening attentively which enables the veil to fall even for a moment, and we experience a touch of heaven.

And while not primarily geographical, "thin places" are more common than our unseeing world would have us believe. Anyone who steps into our Memorial Prayer Garden for a brief moment of prayer and remembering can experience a "thin place". Spending time in Adoration and lifting before God the names or just the faces of our departed loved ones, can bring one into a "thin place". Even the beautifully simple act of holding a loved one in close remembrance during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, and consciously uniting with them in this "the most perfect Prayer ever offered" can allow us to experience the lifting of the veil that occurred on Calvary. In this special liminal time of November, find your "thin place" or better, let your "thin place" find you, open and aware of the reality of "what no one has ever seen, not one has ever heard, not one has every imagined what God has prepared for those who love Him." (1 Corinthians 2:9)





St. Andrew the Apostle Parish Monthly Council Meeting October 24th, 2023, 5:30 p.m.

Maryann called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and Fr. Greg led the group in an opening prayer. Minutes from the September meeting were approved as written.

Finance (Kate): Income for September was \$71,868 of which \$1,064 were designated to Good Shepherd Mission. Expenses were \$98,039. The Parish general fund level is \$532,871. The Building Our Church fund balance is \$90,477.

Hispanic Ministries (Dcn Lauro & Lupita): Plans are being finalized for the Our Lady of Guadalupe celebration on December 11th. Procession at 6 p.m., Rosary at 6:30, followed by Mass and dinner. The Hispanic Community was happy to have Fr. Greg celebrate the Spanish Mass this past weekend. The Rosary Group and the Matachines Group are both raffling Nativity Scenes to raise funds for a charity and native dress for the dancers.

Music Ministry (Michelle): Hymn Fest will be held on Sunday, October 29th. A free will offering will be taken for the National Alliance for Mental Illness. The annual performance of Handel's Messiah is scheduled for December 17th at 7 p.m.

All Saints School (Mike): 104 students are enrolled this year.

Our Lady of the Sierras Foundation (Charlie): The annual Christmas Mass will be held on December 15th. Bishop Gonzales will preside.

St. Paul's Street Evangelization (Ed): Ed has turned over evangelization efforts to Jude Nicholson. She hosted a table at an event in Marana recently with good success.

Knights of Columbus (Doug): The Knights will be supporting the Father of Lights festival next week. Doug has asked for Parish assistance for funding the Annual Catholic Appeal dinner on January 27th, 2024, as expenses have gone way up.

Ladies of St. Andrew (Fran): The Ladies have hired a food truck to provide a meal on the day of the Ladies Bazaar, November 4th. Teams of bakers will be using the Madonna Hall kitchen to prepare baked goods.

St Vincent de Paul Society (Pauline): The Conference is very busy. Store sales average roughly \$1,600 per day. Demand for food boxes has increased. 1,058 boxes were distributed in September. Thunder Mountain Electric will be doing some re-wiring and upgrading to existing circuits. Rents have skyrocketed in town resulting in more and more people requesting rental and utility assistance.

Building and Grounds (Maryann): Frames for the Church skylights are on order. Once received, the skylights will be replaced. Plumbing repairs were completed in the kitchen in preparation for the bazaar. Two benches have been ordered to replace the deteriorating ones in the breezeway. A proposal has been presented to the Buildings and Grounds committee to identify and re-align the sound equipment in the Church. After discussion, it was m/s/c for the Parish to contract with Gonzalo Garcia, LLC to implement phase I of the proposal, that is, replacing the amplifiers at a cost NTE \$10,700. Gonzalo will meet with Building and Grounds Committee to provide more extensive detail on how the problems were identified, how best to correct the poor sound, and how his company suggests the next phases be structured.

Seminarian Report (Carlos): Carlos gave a report on his activities within the Parish and at All Saints School. His superior from the seminary will visit the Parish on November 10th.

Fr. Greg: A second collection will be taken for the Via Christi Society (Fr. Samuel's order) on November11.

Maryann adjourned the meeting at 6:40 p.m., and Fr. Greg led the group in a closing prayer.
