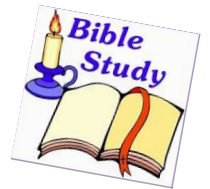

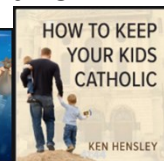

DID YOU KNOW.....

that we are engaged in a number of major renovation projects on our Parish campus?

Our original church, now *Kino Hall*, was built in 1958. Over the years there have been a lot of changes in that original structure and, like all 'aging' buildings, there are on-going maintenance issues.

The latest is the replacement of the A/C units in *Kino Hall*, which has involved some major 'demolition' of the original units and reconfiguring of the access point on the SW corner of the building. The relocation of the unit should also result in the abatement of noise – pretty loud in the area around the Guadalupe Shrine, when *Kino Hall* is in use! Our thanks to *Dan Pierce*, a member of our Buildings and Grounds Committee, for overseeing this very large and complicated A/C Project! We have also recently had to replace the refrigerator in the small kitchen in *Kino Hall*!

Without your generous support of the "Building Our Church" Fund, we would not be able to address such needs without special collections. Having those Funds available means that we are able to respond quickly to emergency repairs, and necessary up-dating of equipment!

We are also in the process of up-grading and making necessary repairs to our pipe organ, as you have seen in articles in the bulletin and website! This very large project was also made possible by an 'internal loan' from the "Building Our Church" Fund, which will hopefully be repaid through concerts and grants. We are very grateful to the "Organ Committee" – made up of parishioners and representatives of the "music community" in Sierra Vista. These community representatives are assisting in the fundraising activities because of the importance of our pipe organ – the largest in southeastern Arizona – in support of Community-wide events, such as the Community Hymn Festival and the "Messiah".

It is wonderful that others in our community recognize the importance of our organ!

Please consider a special gift to support this project, and plan on attending the concert series that is being planned. Completion of the project is scheduled for March, in time for Easter, and we have been told that the work already completed has improved the quality of the sound by 200%!

We are waiting for improved (warmer) weather, to re-seal the roof of the church. This is a very large project, but will be handled by our own excellent Maintenance Team, with assistance from our *Tom Felix* and his crew, so that the only expense will be the sealant!

A special thanks to our Maintenance Team – *Ben Horner*, *Michael Prostka*, and *Mark Williams* – for their diligence and commitment, AND to our Buildings and Grounds Committee -- *Maryann Hockstad*, *Gene Mundt*, *Dan Pierce*, *James Harper*, *Tom Felix*, and *Deacon Joe Kushner*! This Committee, which meets on the 3rd Tuesday of each month – and is open to any and all – is part of the Parish/Finance Council, and serves under that group of lay leaders!

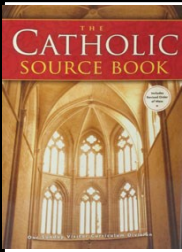

CATHOLIC QUIZ: This week's Question: "What does the abbreviation 'I H S' stand for?"

The Answer to Last Week's Question: "Was January 1st always the beginning of the calendar year?" It was in 1621 that the Church first adopted January 1st to begin the calendar year. Previously, the civil year began on the 25th of March – the Feast of the Annunciation! All leases and annual agreements were dated from "Lady Day" until the mid-18th Century. March was the first month in the ancient Roman calendar of 10 named months, which explains why our modern names for the 9th-12th months start with prefixes meaning 7-*septem*, 8 – *octo*, 9 – *novem*, 10 – *decem*! September 1st was the beginning of the calendar year in the Byzantine Empire, and remains so in the liturgical calendar of the Eastern Orthodox Churches! The First Sunday of Advent is the beginning of the new liturgical year in the Roman Catholic Church – and among the Protestant Churches that follow a liturgical calendar. For the secular world, January 1st has now become the agreed upon beginning of the calendar year!

[In a recent Openers column](#), assistant editor Ava Lalor reflected on the most common New Year's resolutions and gave them a spiritual twist. Here are some suggestions.

1. **Exercise** not because you want to hit a superficial number on the scale but because you are body and soul. Make changes that honor your body the way God desires you to.
2. **Lose the weight of your sins** by going to confession frequently. Aim for once a month or every six weeks.
3. **Organize your prayer life.** Look at your schedule for each day the night before and plan for when you are going to spend some time — even five minutes — with the Lord.
4. **Try different forms of prayer** such as reading Scripture, journaling, adoration, daily Mass, imaginative prayer, the Rosary, etc.
5. **Spend less money on yourself**, and focus more on living generously by giving to others this year.
6. **Quit a bad habit that is keeping you from holiness.** Whatever it is, ask God for the grace to move away from it and make a plan.
7. **Travel to see Christ** in Eucharistic adoration or daily Mass more frequently.
8. **Read more spiritual classics**
9. **Celebrate Sundays, holy days and saint feast days** with extra fervor this year. Each month, look at the calendar and choose one or more days to celebrate.
10. **Live life with heaven** in mind. See each day as an opportunity to get to know Christ more through your daily moments.

Bethlehem University called an “oasis of peace”

A light in darkness

One place where it is possible to look for some light, however, is Bethlehem University, the only Catholic university in the Holy Land, a school described by Bishop William Shomali, auxiliary bishop of the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem, as “an oasis of peace where Muslim and Christian students and teachers live, study and work in concord and harmony.”

Any visitor to Bethlehem eventually notices the impressive campus operated by the De La Salle Brothers. The influence of the school also becomes clear in conversation with local leaders, especially in the Latin Patriarchate of graduates hold a host of jobs across the West Bank, Gaza and East Jerusalem, and some return to serve as faculty. One of them, Vera Baboun, came back to work at the university for 21 years as a teacher of English literature and also as assistant dean of students. A Catholic, in 2012 she was elected the first female mayor of Bethlehem. She considers herself “a daughter” of the university's De La Salle teaching tradition and views the school as one of the great treasures of the city she now runs.

“Usually you graduate from a school,” she said, “but Bethlehem University has a tradition, and as a teacher and a student I have been raised on that tradition. That affects my life also today. How to be efficient, to work with honesty and decency and most importantly with faith, with (Jesus) in your heart.”

Difficult times

This tradition is especially crucial given the violence that has touched the faculty staff and students over the years. The school has been closed 12 times by the Israeli military, including a three-year period from October 1987 until October 1990 during the first Palestinian Intifada, the uprising against Israeli occupation of the Palestinian territories. The scars of the fighting can still be seen in the buildings.

In March 2002, when Bethlehem was the center of fierce firefights and the Church of the Nativity was the site of a siege between Israeli troops and Palestinians, four Israeli anti-tank missiles struck the university. Three hit the Millennium Hall complex that had been dedicated only the year before and one smashed into the Palestinian Cultural Heritage Center in the library. The hole in the wall of the library caused by the missile has been carefully preserved with a glass cover.

Today, because of the restrictions in place during the COVID pandemic, students are attending classes on line. In many instances, this is very difficult because of limited or sporadic access. Because of the collapse of tourism, again because of the COVID pandemic, many of the students, and the students' families, are facing unprecedented financial difficulties.

Interreligious ties

Visitors to the school are often shocked to learn that 74 percent of the students are Muslim, and even more surprised that 77 percent of the students are women. At a time when Christian-Muslim relations seem at a low point in Iraq, Syria and elsewhere across the Middle East, the university is a unique place – a Catholic institution of higher learning where Muslims and Christians can meet and build cultural and social bridges for the future.

Sami Yousef, head of the Pontifical Missions Society for the Holy Land and a former professor, stresses the importance of this process.

“For many of the Muslim students who come from places like Hebron or the outlying villages,” he told Our Sunday Visitor, “this is really their first exposure at the age of 18 to any Christian presence, symbols or individuals... and yet when they open up their eyes, Christianity for them is something very dear to their heart. All of a sudden you are talking about people who are of the same language and the same culture that are your neighbors, and you start to build up these relationships and respect for Christian institutions.”

This was the vision intended from the start by the Christian Brothers, and the Holy See has worked to help. The papal nuncio to Israel and apostolic delegate to Jerusalem and Palestine for example holds the post of university chancellor and acts as chief adviser to the vice chancellor in expressing the concerns of the Holy See. The Vatican also encourages the vital task of institutional development and fundraising. The Christian Brothers have done exemplary work, but they are keenly aware of the degree to which the university has relied over the decades on generous help from across the globe. Only 40 percent of the university's operating costs come from tuition, so the school benefits greatly from support from 29 countries. The United States provided the most assistance, followed by Australia, France and Germany. The members of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem have also provided crucial assistance over the years.

Supporters want to help preserve the Christian presence in the Holy Land. But there is the complementary goal of seeing a school where Christians and Muslims study together and not merely survive but flourish. As Bishop Shomali emphasizes, Bethlehem University is “a Catholic institution where ethical values of tolerance, dialogue, teamwork, respect of the other and the Christian values are the daily bread. Although Bethlehem University is a small one in terms of numbers, it remains an oasis of peace and dialogue in a torn and divided Middle East.”

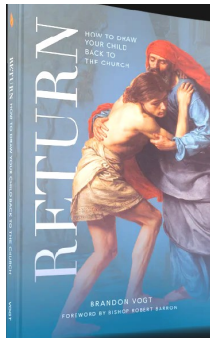

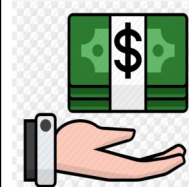

Bookkeeper update:
