

The Answer to Last Week's Question: "What is the tradition of lighting candles in the home at Christmas?" During the English persecution of the Church in Ireland – the time of the 'Penal Laws' – seeking the eradication of Catholicism, 'outlawed' Catholic priests were driven to visiting homes in secret, where Mass could be said at night, or only with the greatest precautions. At Christmas time, Catholic families would leave their door unlocked and put candles in the windows – to guide expected priests and the Faithful to these 'safe houses'. And patrolling English soldiers, noticing the open doors and lit candles, were simply told that it was to welcome Mary and Joseph on Christmas. The soldiers dismissed the story as 'harmless Catholic superstition, and the 'safe house' was safe for the priest to celebrate Mass! The trimming of the "Christmas Candle" is still an important tradition in many Irish homes!







Complete Cardiovascular Ultrasound

- <u>Heart Ultrasound Screening</u>: Scans the heart valves, measures systolic function, the motility of the left ventricle, the ejection fraction and the dimensions of the atrium and ventricles.
