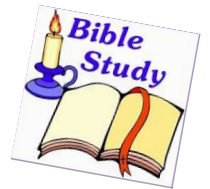

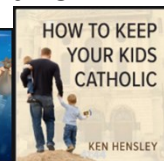

DID YOU KNOW.....

that Lent has three great 'disciplines' or spiritual growth and formation plans, which are each critically important and inter-related?

They are, of course, Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving!

These are not, of course, simply "seasonal activities," but are integral to the growth and the maturation of every disciple of the Lord. But we do bring a special emphasis to these actions during Lent!

It is our Lord Himself who commends this to us, when He says:

When you pray. . . When you fast. . . When you give alms. . .

(*Matthew 6:1-18*). Notice that there is no "IF" about it!

Our Lord simply tells us that when we do these things, we should "do them from the heart" and not simply trying to 'check boxes' or impress the neighbors!

There are so many extra prayer opportunities: weekday Masses, the *Stations of the Cross* on Fridays (or anytime that you want to come and pray the Way), the 40-Hours' Adoration every Thursday and Friday in the *Divine Mercy Chapel*, the Spanish Rosary on Monday evenings, the Men's Adoration on Thursday mornings, the *Knights of Columbus* sponsored "COR" meetings – check the bulletin and make one of these your special place for personal and spiritual growth this Lent.

Looking for something to enhance your 'faith-lift' at home?

We have a wonderful 'online' resource in *FORMED*!

"Shaping up" - disciplining our appetites – which is not simply 'dieting' or 'giving something up' – but looking at how much our cravings and our distractions control our lives, is a painful, but life-giving exercise. As *Saint Pope Paul VI* said, "*We must learn to live simply, so that others may simply live!*"

And, our fasting must always have a direct 'overflow' in almsgiving – sharing with others!

Prayer-Fasting-Almsgiving are a three-fold expression of Christian life and spiritual growth!

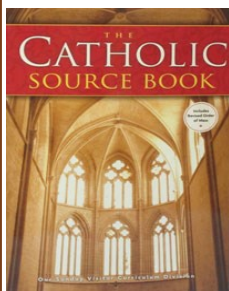

CATHOLIC QUIZ: *This week's Question: "What is the Penitential Observance of Lent?"*



The Answer to Last Week's Question: "What is 'Shrovetide'?" The three days before Ash Wednesday, got its name from "Shrove Tuesday," which got its name from the English term for Confession, Absolution, and Penance (*to shrive – shrove, shriven*). One is 'shriven' of guilt through repentance, making these days of glad tidings and merriment before the rigors of Lent. 'Hall Sunday,' 'Hall Monday,' and 'Hall Night' – were the old English names used for this time and for the same reason: 'hall' is a contraction of 'hallow,' which means 'holy' and 'festive'. Pancakes or 'Shrove Cakes' were the customary fare – using up all the eggs, milk, and lard before Lent, with its strict conditions for fasting. 'Mardi Gras' or 'Fat Tuesday' comes from this 'feast before the fast'!

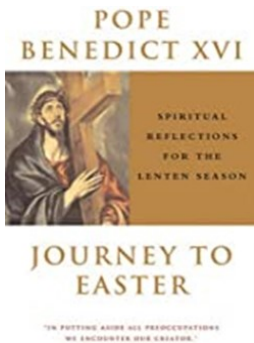

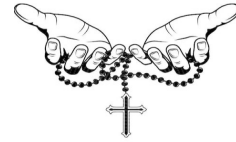
From Your Parish Library

Blessed Josefa Naval Girbes (11 Dec 1820-24 Feb 1893)

A Spanish Roman Catholic who was a member of the Third Order of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. She was well known throughout Spain for her commitment to church life and in the field of education. She opened a home for the spiritual development of all people and worked to educate them. In her later years she worked with Cholera patients which along with her heart condition contributed to her death.

Pope John Paul II beatified her on 25 Sept 1988, citing her reputation as an educator and catechist.

*This Wednesday is **ASH WEDNESDAY**
Day to be kept with **FAST & ABSTINENCE***

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are OBLIGATORY days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence – no meat. The norms on fasting are obligatory for Catholics from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon Catholics from age 14 onwards. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the “paschal fast”.
