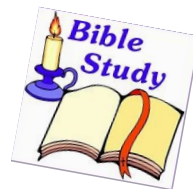

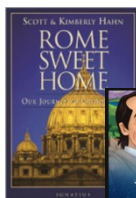

DID YOU KNOW...

that there are five 'portals' or entryways into our everyday consciousness of the world around us?

The five portals are the five senses: sight, hearing, taste, smell, and touch. Through these five senses we 'take in' all kinds of sensory information; through these five senses the 'outer world' finds access to our 'inner world' of consciousness.

These portals can be, to a large degree, controlled from within; we can 'choose' what and how much of most sensations we will accept.

Today, a greater problem may be an artificial narrowing or even closing of portals, where much of our interaction with the 'outer world' comes through the portal of sight alone

(I-pads, cell phones, computers), with a diminishing of the acuteness of the other senses/portals. Learning to open the five portals in a more conscious way, will increase our awareness and make us more responsive.

(The poster invitation to "*Stop and smell the roses!*" is another expression of this need to open our awareness to life around us, and to bring the 'outer world' into our 'inner world' in a more deliberate way.)

St. Ignatius Loyola (1491-1556) in his *Spiritual Exercises* invites us to 'enter into' the scenes of the Gospels, through these senses. Imagine that you are standing along the shoreline, while JESUS preaches to the crowds, while seated in the fishing boat (Luke 5:1-3).

Using the opening of the five portals exercise, as you look at JESUS, what are 3 other things in your peripheral vision? (the lake, the birds, the mountains in the background, etc.) What are 3 things that you can hear? (the lapping of the waves, the sound of children playing, seabirds calling, etc.) What are 3 things that you can smell? (Fish, wet ropes/nets, cooking, smoke, people, etc.) What are 3 things that you can taste? (Bread from breakfast, water, dust in the air, etc.) What are 3 things that you can feel? (The press of others around you, the small stones under your sandals, the slight breeze from the lake, the sunshine on your head and shoulders, etc.) You are not just reading the words of Scripture, you are entering into the scene, and allowing these sensations to come in – as you listen to what JESUS is saying.

In this way, creation itself is speaking to you, as you focus on JESUS!

For a follower of the Lord, that awareness is very much tied to holiness. The more aware we are of God's Presence in our lives, the 'holier' we are! The more aware we are of others in God and because of God, the 'holier' we are! The more aware we are of ourselves, living and moving and being in God, the 'holier' we are! This kind of 'holy awareness' and growing in awareness of God is also 'prayerfulness' – a deepening 'sense' of God in all situations and all encounters; a kind of prayerfulness that does not always require words!

This is the idea of opening the Five Portals, as portals of awareness, prayerfulness, presence!

Before the liturgical reforms of the early 1960's, when the Priest gave "*Extreme Unction*" (Latin – meaning "Final Anointing"), the dying person was anointed with holy oil on the five senses, (eyes, ears, nose, lips, and fingertips). In other words, the five portals of consciousness! Perhaps today people should be anointed on the five senses, and God should be asked to forgive our not being open, aware, responsive!

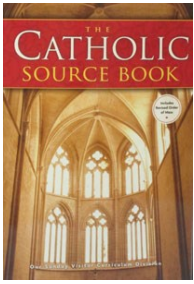

CATHOLIC QUIZ: This week's Question: "What is a 'mystery' in Catholic theology?"



The Answer to Last Week's Question: "What is the 'epiclesis' in the Mass?" During the Eucharistic Prayer at Mass, God is asked to send the Holy Spirit to sanctify the gifts of bread and wine. This prayer, with the extension of the Celebrant's hands over the gifts, is called the *epiclesis* (Greek: "to call down from above"). By this action of the Holy Spirit, the gifts are sanctified (meaning to 'make holy', that is, suitable for offering to God). The Consecration of the gifts (and their transformation) then follows this invocation (calling upon) of the Holy Spirit.

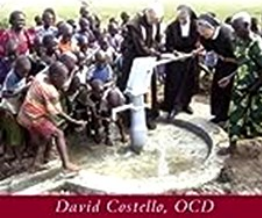

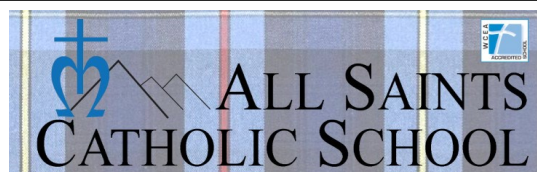


GriefShare is a nationwide biblical support group that is focused on helping people who are dealing with a loved one's death. Each DVD session features nationally respected grief experts and real-life stories, followed by small group discussion about the topics presented (with workbook support). At each GriefShare session you will find encouragement and help in grieving the death of your loved one. No matter the cause of your loved one's death, this is an opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling. You will learn how to recognize the symptoms of being stuck in grief and how to cope with the normal emotions that come when grieving a death. You will learn valuable information on facing life situations, and you'll gain renewed hope for the future. These sessions are open to anyone regardless of whether your experience is recent or not so recent. The group is led by individuals who have personally experienced grief due to a loved one's death. Each leader is trained in facilitating a GriefShare support group.

Our GriefShare group meets every Wednesday, 5 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. in Madonna Hall, room #3.

We hope you will consider joining us. Please remember your loss is shared by others in this church and what you are experiencing is sometimes easier to bear knowing others are listening and do care. May God's love continue to comfort and strengthen you.

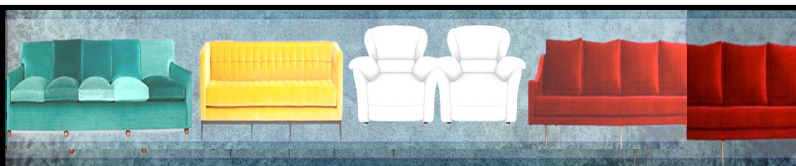

Linda K. called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and Fr. Greg led the group in an opening prayer.

Minutes from the June meeting were approved as written.

Finance (Kate): Income for June was \$67,721 of which \$1,094 were designated to Good Shepherd Mission. Expenses were \$88,976. The Parish general fund level is \$515,124. The Building Our Church fund balance is \$87,831.

Ladies of St A (Fran): Ladies continue to sort donations for the Bazaar.

St. Paul's Street Evangelization (Ed): Ed continues evangelization throughout the Community, both one-on-one and with group prayer organization.

Annual Catholic Appeal (Ann): Donations total \$171,048 which is 128% of our Parish goal. Donor total is 359 which is 78% our counted donors.

Hispanic Ministries (Deacon Lauro): Fr. Marco Basulto will celebrate a Charismatic Mass with confessions and a Holy Hour preceding, on Monday July 23rd.

St Vincent de Paul Society (Kate reporting for Pauline): Thrift Store sales are down somewhat this month. The store is very warm with only a swamp cooler so extra fans were purchased to circulate the air. The Cochise County-Wide Food Drive was not as abundant at the Postal food drive, but the Food Bank did receive about 1,000 pounds of food with a value of between three and five thousand dollars. Cruz Farms in Douglas donated 250 dozen eggs and 252 one-pound bags of beans.

Knights of Columbus (Ed for Larry): The Knights of Columbus is sponsoring the Ice-cream Social on Saturday, July 22nd to bid farewell to Fr Simon.

Pipe Organ News (Michelle): \$2,000 was raised at the Patriotic Pipe Concert. There will be a series of Pipe Organ next Lent, as there was this year, starting with the Director of the Diocesan Schola, Carlos Zapien, on March 10th, 2024.

Building and Grounds (Fr. Greg for Maryann): The Church roof work has been completed. Belts in the Church air conditioning units were replaced both to reduce noise and increase efficiency. A new door was installed above the Kino Hall air conditioning unit. Modesty rails at the front of the church will be re-installed and secured. Good Shepherd water valve was replaced, and the water is back on. Liberty Utilities has pledged to refund the \$1,800 payment that was deducted from the checking account, but the check has not yet been received. Fr. Greg expressed his gratitude for Maryann's hard work with the B&G Committee.

Synod News (Michelle): Michelle reviewed goals for the Parish going forward into the next year and also discussed a means to provide updates to Parishioners regarding the status of the ongoing Synod process.

Pastor Report: Fr. Samuel Jandeh has been re-appointed as the Provincial for the Via Christi fathers in the U.S. for another six years. At this point we do not know if he will be remaining at St. Andrew upon his return from Nigeria or moved to another Parish. Genevieve Rivera has hit the ground running and is doing a great job as the new Director of Religious Education. Ilse Garcia is now the Social Media coordinator. Fr Greg has had positive feedback from other local church leaders regarding St. Andrews' outreach and mission work. Fr Greg reminded the Council of the great Youth Ministry program within the Parish, headed by Deacon Bill. Deacon Bill will attend a future Council meeting to report on the Youth Ministry activities. Next month's meeting will be on held on the *fourth* Tuesday of the month, August 22nd.

Linda adjourned the meeting at 6:29 p.m. and Fr. Greg led the group in a closing prayer.
