CATHOLIC QUIZ : This Week's Question: *"What is 'Mardi Gras' and how does it relate to Lent?"*

The Answer to last week's Question: *"What were the 'Gesima Sundays'?"* The three Sundays before Lent amounted to a pre-Lenten 'season,' which prepared for Lent, which prepared for Easter, and so they were dropped in the New Calendar, because of their redundancy. Septuagesima, Sexagesima, and Quinquagesima could not literally be the 70th, 60th, and 50th Sundays before Easter, but took their titles to correspond to the older term 'Quadragesima' – ("40th"), the First Sunday in the 40 days of Lent. In the days when the liturgical calendar was the most important way to calculate time, these 'leading-up-to" Sundays were a great help to the Faithful, in making spiritual preparations for the important days and seasons.

February 15th, 2022**

In Attendance: Linda Klein, Fr. Greg Adolf, Ann Dickson, Chuck Muscato, Maryann Hockstad, Dcn Lauro & Lupita Teran, Larry Powers, Linda Denno, Fran Cassidy, and Kate Callender (recording)

Excused: Michelle Mitchell, Ed Graveline, Thad Larsen, Mike Wilson, Charlie Irwin, Bryant Sayers
Linda K. called the meeting to order at 5:37 p.m. and Fr. Greg led the group in an opening prayer.

Minutes from the January 2022 meeting were approved as written.

Finance (Kate): Income for January was \$96,133 of which \$1,208 were designated to Good Shepherd Mission. Expenses were \$75,781. The Parish general fund level is \$439,287. The Building Our Church fund balance is \$76,812.

Hispanic Ministry (Lupita): The healing Mass that was to have been held last week has been postponed and will be re-scheduled in the near future. Fr. Marco will schedule a retreat for Hispanic married couples.

Ladies of St. Andrew (Fran): This year's Bazaar is scheduled for November 5th. The St Nick Fair will be on December 4th. An "after action" review of last year's Bazaar was done at the last meeting. Donations to local charities will be distributed in the coming weeks.

Knights of Columbus (Larry): Council support throughout the State has allowed the installation of ten ultrasound machines at crisis pregnancy centers throughout Arizona. The fish fries will resume on Friday during Lent.

Local Education Opportunity (Linda D.): Grant money has been awarded to AZ@Work for science and technology programs at both Cochise College and University of Arizona (SV Campus) to pay tuition for qualified individuals allowing them to maintain proficiency in their field or expand their skill set.

St. Vincent de Paul Society (Pauline): 827 food boxes were distributed in January serving nearly 1,500 individuals. Thrift Store sales in January were \$44,083. An underground water leak in the Thrift Store parking lot was repaired and the parking lot repaved. Target and Fry's donated surplus meat left from holiday stocks to the Food Bank.

Building and Grounds (Maryann): The Committee is working with "Old West" for cleaning the fabric on the Church pews, the chairs in the Church and Divine Mercy Chapel.

Annual Catholic Appeal (Maryann): Audio issues have been resolved with the ACA video and it will be shown again this coming weekend.

Bethlehem University News (Ann): Ann received a thank you letter from the University for the first \$4,000 donation for the nursing student scholarship.

Website Expansion (Linda K): Linda provided suggestions to expand the Parish Council section of the website. Kate, Gonzalo and Lupita will explore options and ways to get the word out to Parishioners.

Pastor's Report (Fr Greg): Fr. Greg has asked for a committee to organize a celebration for Deacon Richard's ordination to the priesthood. His first Mass here will be Sunday, June 5th at the 10:00 a.m. Mass with the celebration to follow. Fr. announced that Dolores Bustamante has resigned as Office Assistant. Gloria Castaneda, currently assisting in the Bookkeeping department, is being hired to replace her. The Haiti mission construction project has been temporarily put on hold because of conditions within the country. Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish in Veracruz, Mexico (Fr. Marco's home Parish) has requested assistance to make urgently needed repairs in the Church. After discussion, it was m/s/c to provide \$12,500 out of the Worldwide Building Our Church fund. Fr. Marco will be the liaison with the Parish and provide an accounting for the funds.

Linda K adjourned the meeting at 6:39 p.m. and Fr. Greg led the group in a closing prayer.
