In Africa, for instance, (where the Faith is spreading at unprecedented levels), many Catholics travel one or two hours to get to Mass, and the idea of a 55-minute Mass (with a 10 minute homily) and little or no fellowship (community building/bonding) afterward, would seem a very strange expression of the Faith! 





CATHOLIC QUIZ: "Who are the 'Fathers of the Church'?" The answer to last week's Question: "Who is 'St. James the Greater' – why 'the Greater'?"



James, the brother of John, was one of the sons of Zebedee, and one of the first of the Apostles called by JESUS! The first of the Apostles to be martyred (in Jerusalem), after his death, his body was transported to Spain. According to another legend, his tomb was miraculously revealed in 840 to the local Bishop, as 'stars danced over the field' where the relics were located. In the Galician dialect, Saint James became 'Santiago'! A church was built in Campostella ("field of stars") which became one of the three great Pilgrimage sites of the Middle Ages — rivaling Jerusalem and Rome! The "Way of Saint James" (also known as the "Camino de Santiago") has again become a very popular Pilgrimage. During the Reconquest of Spain from the Islamic Moors, he was believed to have come to the aid of the Christians, riding a white steed, during their battles.

St. Titus Brandsma (1881-1942)



The Carmelites' newest saint, Titus Brandsma was canonized on May 15th, along with several others. He was an outspoken Dutch journalist who fearlessly condemned the anti-Semitic policies of the Nazis. He drafted the Dutch Catholic

bishops' widely circulated pastoral letter condemning anti-Semitism, which was read in Catholic parishes throughout Holland during 1942. The Nazis responded by deporting from Holland more than 3,000 Jewish converts to Catholicism, including Edith Stein (future Carmelite St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross) and her sister, Rosa, and a dozen or so other consecrated men and women. St. Titus was arrested in January 1942 after trying to persuade Dutch Catholic newspapers not to print Nazi propaganda, which was required by the Nazi occupiers. He was transferred to Dachau, where he was executed by lethal injection on July26th.

While in prison he wrote: "I feel at home. I pray, I write. The days are really too short. I am very calm. I feel happy and satisfied." Carmelites observe his memorial on July 27th.




