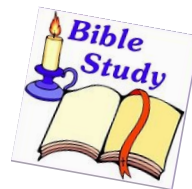

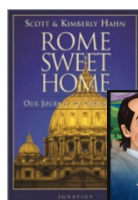

DID YOU KNOW....

that we have now entered into the long liturgical Season, called "Ordinary Time"?

Stretching out from now until the third week of November, we enter a Season marked by the liturgical color of *green*! This Season is an invitation to grow more deeply in our faith, to nurture our souls, and to be much more aware of the Presence of God in the "ordinary times" of our lives! It is an ideal time to "open the portals"!

There are five 'portals' or entry-ways into our everyday consciousness of the world around us. The five portals are the five senses: sight, hearing, taste, smell, and touch. Through these five senses we 'take in' all kinds of sensory information; through these five senses the 'outer world' finds access to our 'inner world' of consciousness.

These portals can be, to a large degree, controlled from within; we can 'choose' what and how much of most sensations we will accept. Today, a greater problem may be an artificial narrowing or even closing of portals, where much of our interaction with the 'outer world' comes through the portal of sight (I-pads, cell phones, computers), with a diminishing of the acuteness of the other senses/ portals.

Learning to open the five portals in a more conscious way, will increase our awareness and make us more responsive.

(The poster invitation to "*Stop and smell the roses!*" is another expression of this need to open our awareness to life around us, and to bring the 'outer world' into our 'inner world' in a more conscious way.)

The effect of this is to 'slow down' our reactions to the 'outer world' and to process what is presenting itself to us at any given moment. For a believer, that awareness is very much tied to holiness. The more aware we are of God's Presence in our lives, the 'holier' we are! The more aware we are of others in God and because of God, the 'holier' we are! The more aware we are of ourselves, living and moving and being in God, the 'holier' we are!

This kind of 'holy awareness' and growing in awareness of God is also 'prayerfulness' – a deepening 'sense' of God in all situations and all encounters; a kind of prayerfulness that does not always require words!

It is interesting to note that before the liturgical reforms of the early 1960's, when the Priest gave "*Extreme Unction*" - sometimes called "Last Rites", the dying person was anointed with holy oil on the five senses, (eyes, ears, nose, lips, and fingertips) and the Priest said, "May God forgive all sins committed through seeing, through hearing, through smelling, through tasting, through touch. . ." In other words, the five portals of consciousness! (Perhaps today people should be anointed on the five senses, and God asked to forgive our not being open, aware, responsive!) Think about it during this long, *green*, growing Season of the spirit!

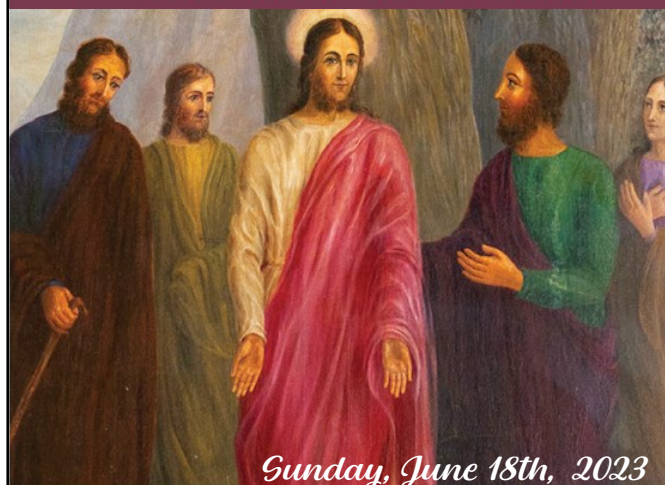

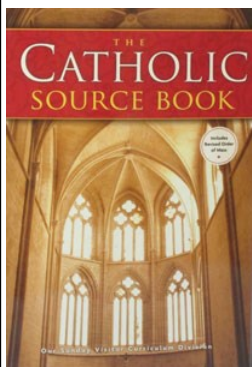

CATHOLIC QUIZ: This week's Question: "What is the difference between 'repentance' and 'contrition'?"



The Answer to Last Week's Question: "What is a 'friar'?" From the Latin *frater*, (brother), a friar is a member of a mendicant (from the Latin word for 'begging') Order, who live in poverty but travel about as 'home missionaries', as distinguished from member of cloistered monastic Orders, who reside in monasteries. Franciscans, Dominicans, Augustinians, and Carmelites are all 'friars' – whether ordained or lay-brothers. Many English place-names recall the presence of 'friaries' – residences of friars: such as "Blackfriars" (Dominicans), so called from the black scapular worn by Dominicans, or, "Greyfriars" (Franciscans), who in the Middle Ages wore habits of unbleached wool!

God often works in us quietly, so, if you are being called to be a catechist, please contact the office as soon as possible. The requirement is that you love God and desire to share your love and faith with children.

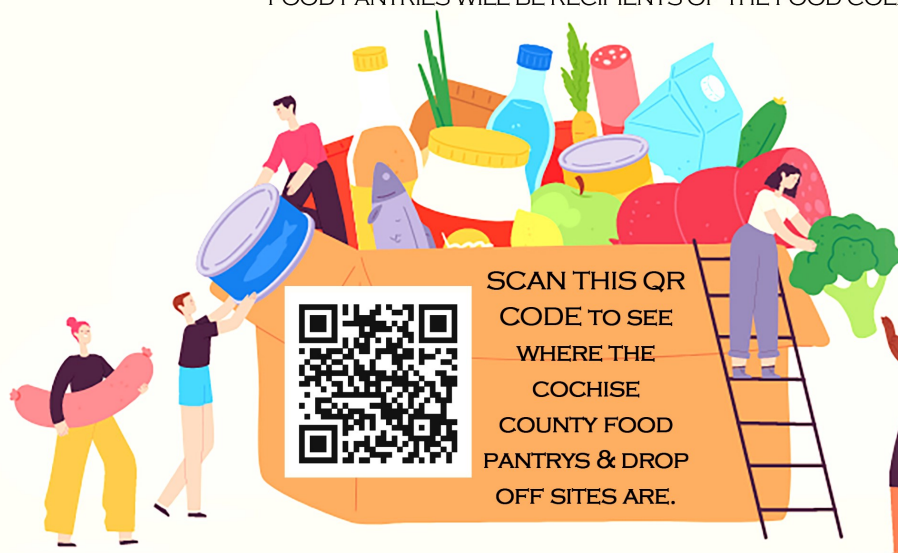

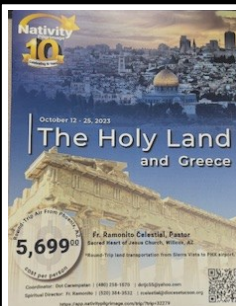

And many more!

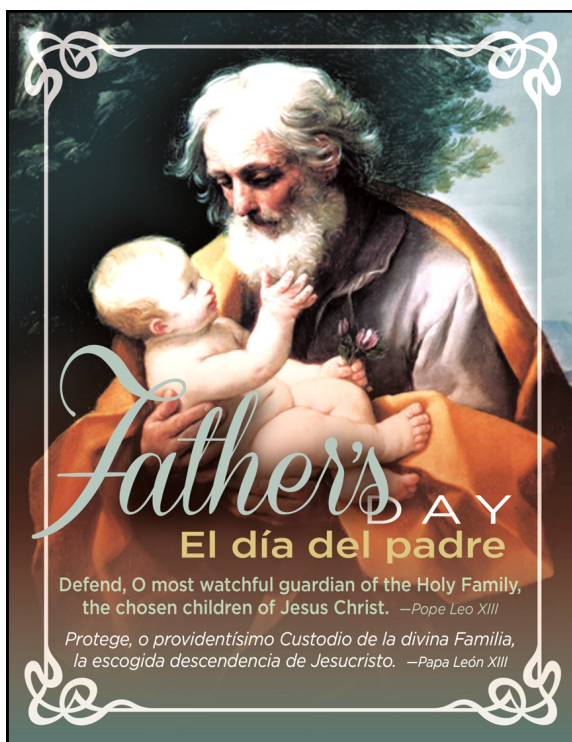

GriefShare is a nationwide biblical support group that is focused on helping people who are dealing with a loved one's death. Each DVD session features nationally respected grief experts and real-life stories, followed by small group discussion about the topics presented (with workbook support). At each GriefShare session you will find encouragement and help in grieving the death of your loved one. No matter the cause of your loved one's death, this is an opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling. You will learn how to recognize the symptoms of being stuck in grief and how to cope with the normal emotions that come when grieving a death. You will learn valuable information on facing life situations, and you'll gain renewed hope for the future. These sessions are open to anyone regardless of whether your experience is recent or not so recent. The group is led by individuals who have personally experienced grief due to a loved one's death. Each leader is trained in facilitating a GriefShare support group.

Our GriefShare group meets every Wednesday, 5 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. in Madonna Hall, room #3.

We hope you will consider joining us. Please remember your loss is shared by others in this church and what you are experiencing is sometimes easier to bear knowing others are listening and do care. May God's love continue to comfort and strengthen you.
