





The "Day of Wrath" is a medieval hymn about Judgment Day; it was used as the sequence hymn at funerals and for All Souls' Day; based upon Joel 2:31. This ancient hymn was included in funeral Mass and Masses offered for the Souls in Purgatory, to plead the sinner's cause before the Judgment Seat of God. Remembering that the "Four Last Things" are: death, judgment, Heaven or Hell! The month of November is a special time to remember the "Holy Souls" and the 'Dies Irae" is an appropriate reflection/prayer for our consideration!






