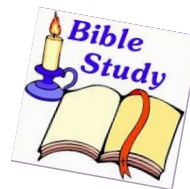

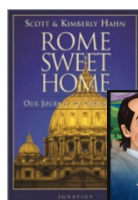

DID YOU KNOW.....

that our Parish is very involved in the *Carmichael Neighborhood Association*?

It was in 2014 that neighbors in the “Fry Town area” held an informal ‘protest meeting’ in *Len Roberts Park* to get City and County attention focused on the Fry Town area – which is ‘split’ between County and City jurisdictions.

Out of that initial meeting, the neighborhood pastors and other leaders began to meet with government representatives to address concerns about crime, abandoned houses, overgrown areas, and the need for adequate street lighting, curbs, gutters and sidewalks, especially in areas used by the school children going to and coming from *Carmichael School*. In 2015 the decision was made to form the *Carmichael Neighborhood Association*, using *Carmichael School* as the “hub” of the neighborhood - bounded by Highway 90 (N), 7th Street (E), Fry Boulevard (S), and Buffalo Soldier Trail (W). This is the oldest neighborhood in Sierra Vista. The land for *Carmichael School* was donated by *Mrs. Margaret Carmichael*, the generous parishioner who donated the 10 acres of land for *St. Andrew’s Church* in 1957!

The *Carmichael Neighborhood Association* has collaborated with a number of churches, organizations, and City and County agencies in a very successful effort to ‘reclaim’ the *Neighborhood* and make it a much more safe and attractive area for our children and our families!.

The *Bishop Salpointe Council #4584* of the *Knights of Columbus* have been enthusiastic supporters of this enormous effort from the beginning. *Knights* and friends formed a “Neighborhood Response Team” to assist with clean-up efforts and to assist elderly and disabled neighbors!

Our own Maintenance Team, *Michael Prostka*, and *Ben Horner* have donated many hours in cleaning and maintaining North Avenue, Theater Avenue, and the surrounding area!

ALL parishioners of *St. Andrew’s* should take an active interest in the *Carmichael Neighborhood Association* – as it is not only the immediate neighborhood of our parish church, rectory, and convent, it is the place where God ‘planted’ us 65 years ago – to make a difference in the lives of all of our fellow citizens! As one of the Grand Knights reminded the *Knights of Columbus*, a few years ago: “You may not live in this neighborhood, but you worship here – it really is ‘our neighborhood’!”

The *Carmichael Neighborhood Association* meets the first Thursday of each month at the *Carmichael School* at 5:30 p.m. – the next meeting is Thursday, 1 September, please join us!

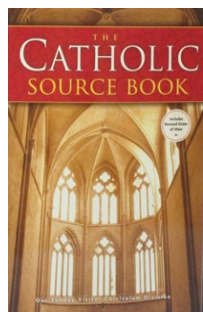

CATHOLIC QUIZ: *This Week's Question: "What is the "Gossamer Legend"?"*

The Answer to Last Week's Question: "What are the 'Autumn Summers'? After the equinox, the calendar calls it "Fall," but some days we still call "summer" – as in "Indian Summer".



But our forebearers and the *Old Farmer's Almanac* didn't! They called it "St. Augustine's Summer" – when September was clear and balmy. Similarly, beautiful October days, usually after the first killing frost, were called "St. Luke's Summer". And the fair, warm days of early November were called "St. Martin's Summer". The *Old Farmer's Almanac* said: "If All Saints' (November 1st) brings on Winter, St. Martin's brings on Indian Summer."

The Feast of St. Augustine is 28 August, that of St. Luke, 18 October, and St. Martin, 11 November! There are many "summers" in the Catholic calendar!

Monthly Council Meeting
August 16th, 2022**

Linda K. called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and Fr. Greg led the group in an opening prayer. Minutes from the July 2022 meeting were approved as written.

Finance (Kate): Income for July was \$84,731 of which \$2,327 were designated to Good Shepherd Mission. Expenses were \$74,455. The Parish general fund level is \$580,959. The Building Our Church fund balance is \$104,408.

Music Department News (Michelle): Work on the Pipe Organ will begin next week. The organ committee is working to finalize a schedule for organ recitals in Spring of 2023.

Knights of Columbus and St. Paul Street Evangelization (Larry and Ed): The Knights are working on a Eucharist Revival Program to be played out over the next three years, culminating in a Nationwide Procession.

A new program is coming into place to put 20% of each donation dollar toward pregnancy centers. A pro-life booth will be at the County Fair from September 22 through 26. Fr. Greg invited anyone who is able to help to staff the booth during those dates. This year's Men's Conference is scheduled for November 5th. The Council is partnering with a local group to build and install accessibility ramps for those in need of one.

St. Vincent de Paul Society (Pauline): Work is progressing on repairs at the Thrift Store and all hope to see it reopened before the end of the month. The Diocesan Conference donated \$1,500 in Safeway Gift Cards to the Sierra Vista Conference. A tribute evening was held for Kate Polakowski in thanksgiving for her work at the Conference. All wished her well as she departs for university.

Building and Grounds (Maryann): A drain line in the field on the Northwest side of the Church was cleared and repaired to avoid flooding in the parking lot and in front of the Atrium. Minor roof leaks at Good Shepherd Mission were repaired. The refrigerator in Kino Hall has been repaired. The grease traps in the kitchen will be scheduled for maintenance in the next few weeks.

Education Opportunities (Linda Denno): Linda outlined a program that will provide education funding for under or unemployed individuals in certain career fields.

Ladies of St. Andrew (Fran): Work continues in preparation for the annual bazaar on November 5th.

Pastor's Report (Fr Greg): The Parish Picnic and Ministry Fair is scheduled for Sunday, September 11th. We received a thank you from the Bishop of the Diocese in Ecuador, which we have supported for the past ten years. The Cochise Music Teachers Association held a fundraiser last week in Kino Hall. The event was well-attended, and the Association is most grateful to be allowed to use Kino for Community Events. Fr. Greg thanked Maryann for her work in scheduling and coordinating and to Parish Music Director Rebecca Williams for nurturing relationships within the local music community. Fr. Simon Noema is a newly-ordained Nigerian priest that will be assigned to us for three months. Fr Samuel Jandeh expressed his gratitude and delight with our Parish and all the wonderful programs and volunteers in our Faith Community. Soon, Fr. Samuel and Fr. Jude Dioka will be hosting an information morning about the persecution of Christians in Nigeria.

Linda adjourned the meeting at 6:11 p.m. and Fr. Greg led the group in a closing prayer.
