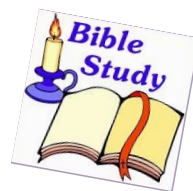

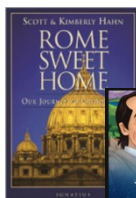

DID YOU KNOW....

that we are continuing our conversation about reverence in church, especially before Mass?

With the increasing numbers of those attending Mass, there has been a gradual 'erosion' in the attention to silence, or, at least 'respectful quiet', before the weekend Masses.

Of course, the parish church is not a "private oratory" for a 'few' – it belongs to all of the Faithful of the parish, and that means that there must be an accommodation to different styles of prayer and devotion, and 'connecting' with other worshippers!

The Divine Mercy Chapel, which was designed as a place of greater quiet and "private" prayer, welcomes, at different times: public Novenas, Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Hispanic Rosary, Legion of Mary, Secular Carmelites, Charismatic Prayer, Men's Prayer Group, a bi-monthly Mass for our Korean Community, and, occasionally, even a wedding!

The Trappistine Sisters have a little sign posted which reads: "*Speak only if it improves upon the silence!*" And while that honors God's 'first language' – Silence – it has to be adapted to the context of the parish church – a unique place where community is strengthened and celebrated as the Body of Christ, in all of its diversity!

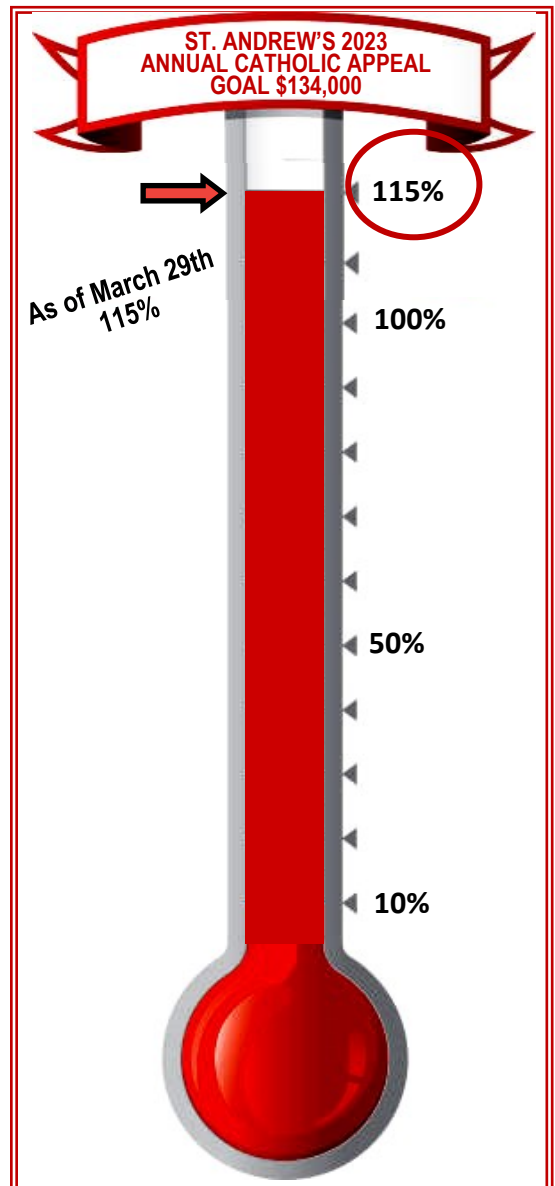
That's the nature of a parish church, (as distinct from, say a monastery chapel or a private oratory) – it must be open to all, and welcoming of different spiritual needs, prayer styles, and devotions, with primary emphasis, of course, on the Sacred Liturgy.

Because it is a community (not just a random collection of 'individuals') which gathers here, it is understood and even expected that there will be a certain amount of conversation and conviviality, as we greet and 'connect' with our sisters and brothers in Christ.

The community itself, the 'two or three' gathered' is, according to Catholic teaching, a place of the "Presence of the Lord". And so, we need to acknowledge the presence of one another, and express our appreciation for the reality of this particular community: Christ among us!

The 'announcement time', before Mass starts, is understood to be a moment when we can acknowledge one another – in the Lord's Presence – and affirm the bonds of community, hence the announcements about those things which touch upon the spiritual health and well-being of the Community, now gathered. (In some parishes, this is done at the end of Mass, before the final Prayer or before the Dismissal – there is no 'hard-and-fast' rule on when announcements are to be made.) Again, it is really about finding an appropriate balance between the genuine need of the Community to make person-to-person connection as an expression of the 'Body of Christ' AND the individual worshiper's need to prayerfully prepare to enter the Presence of God – in Word and Sacrament! Some have tried to put this into a catch phrase: "*Connect with God as you enter; connect with your neighbors as you leave!*"

It's really about finding the balance: of reverence for God AND of respect for others!

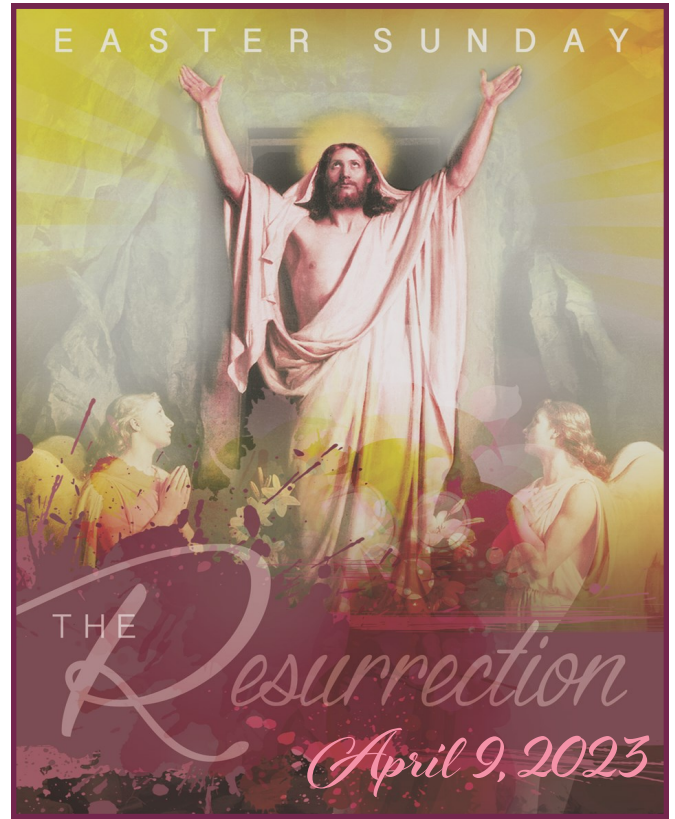

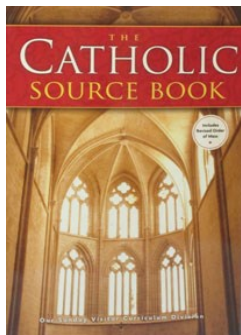

CATHOLIC QUIZ:

This Week's Question: *"What is 'Low Sunday'?"*



The Answer to last week's Question: *"Where and what is 'Adam's Grave'?"* The Holy Land has many sacred places, but none so venerable as the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem. This important place of pilgrimage has many chapels, but one of the most impressive is the 'Chapel of Adam's Grave', located directly below the place of the Lord's crucifixion. Called '*Golgotha*' in Greek, '*Calvary*' in Latin – translations of the Hebrew word for "skull" – it was so called in tradition because *St. Jerome* and others related the ancient legend that Christ was crucified above the place where Adam was buried, so that the Blood of JESUS poured down its redeeming stream upon humankind's first guilty head! The skull and crossed-bones that appear sometimes at the bottom of a crucifix are a reminder of that legend. Whatever the historical facts, '*Golgotha*' is a fitting name for this sacred place - the yellow, pocked, limestone possibly resembling a skull - where the Precious Blood 'covered' all of human history!

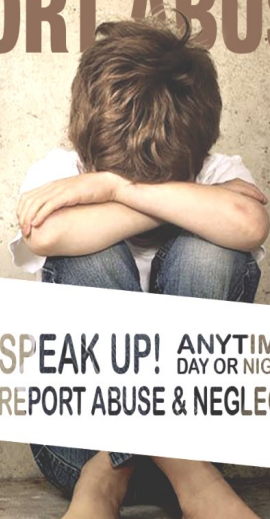

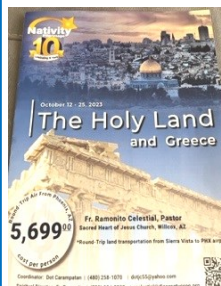

REFLECT

Each year, on the Second Sunday of Easter, the Church celebrates the Sunday of Divine Mercy. In the 1930s, Jesus appeared to a humble Polish nun, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska. As Jesus continued to appear to St. Faustina, she recorded His messages in her *Diary*. On one such occasion, Jesus said to St. Faustina, "My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners" (*Diary*, no. 699).

When recalling our sins, we may feel discouraged or fearful of approaching God; however, we can cling to the truth that Christ's Passion on the Cross did not end in death, but in the joy of the Resurrection. The miracle of Easter gives us the courage to face our sins, confess our mistakes, and then humbly receive God's forgiveness and accept the joy that comes with new life in Christ. In His infinite love for us, God desires nothing more than to wash away our sins and offer us His mercy. He has a prepared place in His merciful heart for each of us, and no sin is bigger than His power to forgive.

No matter how we have fallen, the Resurrection of Christ is an assurance of *hope*. Christ's mercy is constantly available to us, if only we reach out to Him in faith and confidence through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The words Christ revealed to St. Faustina, He also speaks to us: "*Lay your head on my shoulder, rest and regain your strength. I am always with you*" (*Diary*, no. 498).

ACT (choose one)

- Pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy at 3:00 pm (the Hour of Mercy), with the intention of healing for all suffering from involvement in abortion. How to pray: uscbb.org/divine-mercy-chaplet.
- Jesus spoke to St. Faustina, "*Reveal all the wounds of your heart. I will heal them*" (*Diary*, no. 1487). Seek Christ in the Sacrament of Reconciliation and allow His healing mercy to reach every hurt and hidden pain.
- Offer some other sacrifice or prayer that you feel called to do for this month's intention.
