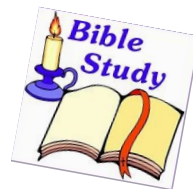

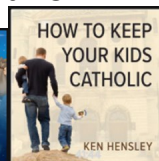

DID YOU KNOW.....

that we will be welcoming our new Associate Pastor, *Father Samuel Jandeh*, this week? *Bishop Weisenburger* has appointed *Fr. Samuel* as our New Associate, beginning 1 July! Here's a little bio of *Fr. Samuel*: He was born 6 November 1978 to a big family of nine siblings in Nigeria. He is the second of the nine children (six brothers and three sisters). After high school, he worked for few years before he embraced the call to the Catholic Priesthood. Before his Ordination, he obtained bachelor's degrees in philosophy and Sacred Theology at the *Urbanian Pontifical University*, Rome, in 2003 and 2009. He was ordained a Priest on 11 July 2009, in Nigeria, where he served as parochial vicar and chaplain of many organizations in a parish for three years. *Fr. Samuel* is a member of a Missionary Religious Order – the “Via Christi Fathers” based in Nigeria. (Hence, the initials V.C. behind his name!)

Fr. Samuel came to the United States in 2012 and worked as a Parochial Vicar and Youth Coordinator at *St. Patrick's*, Bisbee, for three years before he was named Pastor of *St. Francis of Assisi* Parish in Superior, Arizona in July of 2015!

Fr. Samuel loves travelling, reading, meeting new people and sharing his faith. His favorite food is carne asada! He has expressed great joy in returning to our part of the Diocese, and renewing his many friendships here!

And we are delighted to be welcoming this very gifted Missionary-Priest to our Parish and the Community!

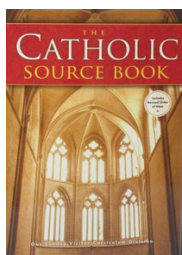

The answer to last week's Question: "What is the 'legend of the Pelican' in connection with the Eucharist?" The pelican became a favorite symbol of the Eucharist and redemption, because of an ancient belief that the female pelican would peck open her breast to feed her young with her own life blood, to avert their starvation in famine. What the ancients were actually seeing was blood from the fish the pelican was feeding her young, staining her snowy breast feathers! This very popular symbol of the Eucharist, "the Pelican in her Piety" pecking open her breast to feed her young, often in a nest fashioned like the Crown of Thorns, is carved on the front of the altar in our *Divine Mercy Chapel*!

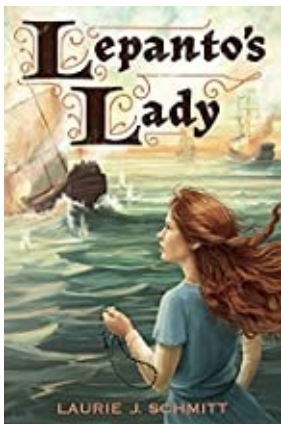

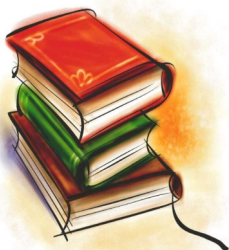
From Your Parish Library

Monthly Council Meeting
June 21st, 2022

In Attendance: Linda Klein, Fr. Greg Adolf, Ann Dickson, Maryann Hockstad, Chuck Muscato, Dcn Lauro & Lupita Teran, Pauline Fredericks, Michelle Mitchell, Ed Graveline, Fran Cassidy, and Kate Callender (recording)

Linda K. called the meeting to order at 5:35 p.m. and Fr. Greg led the group in an opening prayer.

Minutes from the May 2022 meeting were approved as written.

Finance (Kate): It was m/s/c to approve the Fiscal Year 2023 budget as presented at last month's meeting with minor changes because of real-world cost increases. Income for May was \$143,125 of which \$2,196 were designated to Good Shepherd Mission. Expenses were \$76,928. The Parish general fund level is \$575,807. The Building Our Church fund balance is \$133,492.

The meeting paused at this point for the Board of Directors meeting, via Zoom, with Diocesan proxy Deacon Greg Henderson for Fr. John Arnold.

Ladies of St. Andrew (Fran): The Ladies will be seeking donations for the Bazaar in the coming weeks as well as volunteer assistance. Because of the shortage of volunteers, the Bazaar will be re-structured somewhat this year. For example, no large furniture donations will be accepted this year.

Knights of Columbus and St. Paul Street Evangelization (Ed): The Knights continue to work to help folks in need. Ed expressed particular thanks to Chuck Muscato for building a specialized piece of furniture for a disabled man. The Knights will sponsor an ice-cream social to say "farewell" to Fr Ramonito this coming Sunday, June 26th. A group is scheduled to help move pews at Our Lady of Lourdes in Benson, in preparation for re-flooring that sanctuary. Ed will host a St. Paul Street Evangelization booth at the 4th of July celebration at Veteran's Memorial park this year.

Building and Grounds (Maryann): The contracts for the HVAC for Kino Hall are in hand. With the Board Approval now secured, the down payment will be sent out and work scheduled as soon as possible. Maintenance staff are using their newly-purchased floor unit for summer deep clean. A recent deep clean of the music room is much appreciated by choir and music staff. The Committee decided NOT to trade the existing lift for a scissor lift as the scissor lift is available as a reasonably priced rental when needed.

Annual Catholic Appeal (Maryann): At the last update, the Parish had reached 124% of the financial goal, from 347 donors, comprising 76% of our participation goal.

Organ Refurbishment Update (Michelle): The Organ Recital Committee met to finalize the HymnFest date, November 6th. Messiah is set for December 18th. A series of organ recitals will be scheduled starting in February and continue throughout Lent. The group applied for two grants to boost the organ restoration fund. This month's Building Fund collection was designated for the Organ Refurbishment Project.

St. Vincent de Paul Society (Pauline): The Thrift Store is still closed pending repair of the ceiling, which collapsed during a recent windstorm in early June. "Don8It" is working with the Society to help get furniture and other items to friends in need during the time the Store is closed. The Food Bank distributed 939 food boxes this month serving 3,125 people. Income was significantly lower, because of the closure of the Thrift Store. Donations of 29,000 pounds of food from Postal Food Drive boosted on-hand stock in the Food Bank.

Pastor's Report (Fr Greg): Fr Samuel Jandeh will be assigned to St. Andrew starting July 1st. Fr Jude Dioka, a relative of Parishioners, will be here for three months and will assist in Parish activities. A newly ordained priest, Fr Simon Neuma will reside at Our Lady of the Mountains and will also be available for three months starting in late summer. Bishop Weisenburger has extended permission for Fr Rob to continue ministry indefinitely past his recent 75th birthday. Fr. Rob has also taken on a Saturday Mass schedule at Main Post Chapel on Fort Huachuca for the next several months due to the departure of the Catholic Chaplain.

Linda adjourned the meeting at 6:34 p.m. and Fr. Greg led the group in a closing prayer.
