

DID YOU KNOW....

that Lent has three great 'disciplines' or 'touchstones' for discipleship?

They are, of course, Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving! These three marks of authentic discipleship are very important in the formation of a disciplined spiritual life! These are not, of course, simply "seasonal activities," but are integral to the growth and the maturation of every disciple of the Lord. But we do bring a special emphasis to these actions during Lent!

It is our Lord Himself who commends this to us, when He says: When you pray. . . When you fast. . . When you give alms. . . (Matthew 6). There is no "IF" about it! Our Lord simply tells us that WHEN we do these things, we should "do them from the heart" and not simply to 'check boxes' or to impress the neighbors!

The word "hypocrite" actually comes from Greek drama, and basically means to 'assume a mask' or 'play act'. We are cautioned, again and again in the Gospels, to resist the temptation to 'play act' at life or hide behind masks. How we live our one, brief, precious life is either an acknowledgement or a denialof the reality of God. To live authentically and from the heart, glorifies the God Who has created and redeemed us! There are so many extra prayer opportunities – the Stations of the Cross on Fridays – or anytime that you want to come and pray the Way of the Cross, the daily Masses, Adoration, and simply making time each day to pray with a daily devotional, or some other 'launching pad' for prayer from the heart!

Disciplining our appetites – not simply 'dieting' or 'giving something up' – but looking at how much our cravings and our distractions control our lives, is a painful, but life-giving exercise. As Saint Pope Paul VI said, "Learning to live simply, so that others may simply live!" Our fasting must always have a direct 'overflow' in almsgiving – sharing with others.





The English word "Lent" is derived from the Anglo-Saxon lencten (Spring); lenctentid (Springtide) which was the Old English name for the month of March, because it is the month in which the days begin to "lengthen" into Spring. (The word lengthen is also derived from this Anglo-Saxon word.) The great Penitential Season of Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving — leading up to the high Feast of Easter — took its name (in English) from this Anglo-Saxon word!



The temptation of Jesus

Deuteronomy 26:4-10; Psalm 91:1-2, 10-11,12-13,14-15; Romans 10:8 -13; Luke 4:1-13

Testing God

'You shall not put the Lord, your God to the test." -Luke 4:12

If Stan would dare to test Jesus, imagine how he tries to trick us each day. One of Satan's favorite ploys is to get us to doubt or to test God. Our world has gotten very good at challenging God. We demand to know why he lets COVID continue to rage or why innocent

children must die.

We don't worry so much about how we have failed God but rather complain how God has failed us. We need to remember that God always wants the very best for us. However, sometimes the road to that good and holy spot is along a path that is as scary and lonely as a desert. But Jesus is always there with us in that desert.

How can we fast this week?

When Jesus is tempted to trurn the stones into bread, he says, "One does not live on breead alone" (Lk 4:4). Maybe, we could fast by trying t ogive up bread not as a diet trick but rather as a reminder of how we, too, have testedor failed to trust God.

How can we pray this week?

The Divine Mercy Litany is a prayer of trusting rather than testing God. Let us try to say it every day. You can find it at:

How can we give this week?

Our Lord's 40 days in the desert was a time for him to be alone with his Father. Maybe we can't give 40 days, but maybe we could find ways to carve out some extra time to be with our family-maybe extra time to visit older relatives or more time at dinner to talk with our children.



LECTIO: THE CASE FOR JESUS

In nine sessions, Dr. Brant Pitre answers the key question of faith: Who is Jesus? Dr. Pitre presents evidence from early Christian and non-Christian writings that attest to the authenticity of the Gospels. Timed to lead up to the Triduum, Dr. Pitre looks in-depth at the accounts of Jesus's Crucifixion and Resurrection and his proclamation of divinity.
