DID YOU KNOW.....

that today we mark the sad 21st anniversary of the terrorist attack on our Country?

For those of us who were watching the horror of the attacks unfolding on our television screens that day, it was a lifechanging experience, as we realized that our relatively safe, somewhat isolated, world had irrevocably changed. We, in the United States, were experiencing here "in the homeland", the terror of sectarian violence, which, sadly, has engulfed the world. This day has become a Day of Remembrance for those who died in all of the attacks of 9/11, and especially our First Responders. Consider the "everyday heroism" of our First Responders, upon which we depend for a sense of security in our homes and communities.

If an 'ordinary citizen' should rush into a burning home fire to rescue those trapped inside, we would certainly honor that person as a hero or heroine. But consider that such an action, heroic as it might be, is really taken in ignorance. The 'ordinary citizen' has no idea about how quickly smoke can overcome, how toxic are the fumes emanating from burning plastics, how dangerously explosive even an ordinary home fire can be. . . to a large degree, that heroism is ignorance. The trained First Responder — in any area of public safety — is fully aware of the danger and the risks involved in responding to a crisis. Theirs is a heroism of a much higher kind. Their "everyday heroism" is infinitely more heroic in many ways. Because this is not the reactive heroism based in ignorance, but the responsive heroism of informed and fully aware sacrifice.

This is a definition of the New Testament word "agape" translated: "love": 'To put the good of the other person(s) before my own good.' And why would anyone choose to 'put the good of the other person(s) before my own good'? Because we believe that this is exactly what God did for us in JESUS Christ; knowing full well the cost: 'for us and for our salvation, He came down from heaven. . .' God came to our rescue, which is exactly what the Name 'JESUS' means: "God rescues, God saves!" Many of those First Responders who died in the Twin Towers were Catholics. In a city where Catholics are heavily represented in public safety fields, we saw the many Funeral Masses which followed the attacks on 9/11. Those men (and women) who gave their lives for those trapped in the burning towers, did not know who the victims were, there was no personal connection or loyalty, they simply made the choice to go to the rescue, knowing full well the danger of doing so.

It was not simply their professional training that prepared them to make that decision – it was their life-long participation in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, and knowing at a deeper level that service and sacrifice can never be separated. They acted in the love which mirrors the Lord's own sacrificial love – not stopping to calculate the possible cost but acting for the good of the other person(s). "No greater love. . ." How much have you allowed the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass to shape your daily living, for preparing you for "everyday heroism"?

Let us remember with great gratitude those who died on September 11th, and let us pray for all of our First Responders!





CATHOLIC QUIZ: This Week's Question: "What wood was used to make the Cross?"



The Answer to Last Week's Question: "What is the origin of church bells?" The first mention of bells used in worship is in Exodus 28:33, where the hem of the robe of the High Priest has golden bells, so that the sound of the bells will be heard when he enters the Holy Place! The earliest church bells were hand-held, and struck with a mallet, used by Irish monks to summon people to prayer. "St. Patrick's Bell," which is of this sort, is enshrined in Dublin. St. Gregory of Tours, first attests to cast metal bells mounted in church buildings, around 585, but tradition attributes their first use to St. Paulinus of Nola in Campania, around 400. From the area Campania we get the word 'campanile,' which refers to a detached bell tower common in Italy from the 6th Century on, of which the 'Leaning Tower of Pisa' is once. The word 'campanology' – the 'science of bell-ringing' – is also derived from Campania, the region in Italy where church bells were first used. The first bells in England

came from Italy in 680 and their popularity was based, in part, on the belief that the music of church bells would drive away demons and disperse thunderstorms!

I just read the "Did You Know" (How to live in a Third World Country) in this week's Sunday bulletin. I wanted to say that it is a fairly good description of life in Haiti. I would only add:

- 1. The "no police force" item is more important than it seems. With no police and with the gangs having more guns than the few police that are still around, there is no security for anyone. People are afraid to travel or even to go to the market.
- 2. Haiti had rampant inflation, and now the US dollar has again been devalued. So \$1 US now gets much less local money in the exchange. The price of food and water has not gone down.
- 3. It is hard to know who actually devalued the US dollar, because there is no functioning government (Some people might see that as a plus). There is no president since President Jouvenel was assassinated); the prime minister is somewhat self appointed; there have been no elections for 4 years (so no Parliament or Senate).

But we try not to look at the big picture. We do what we can for those parishes or problems that are put right in front of us (or right behind us as the article mentions).

Thanks to you and St. Andrew parish for all you do for Fr. William and the people of St Nicolas in Northwest Haiti.




