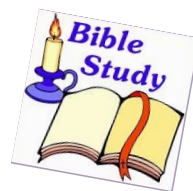

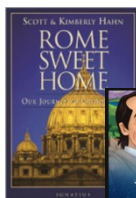

DID YOU KNOW.....

that beginning in October, communicants who so desire will be able to receive the Precious Blood?

The restrictions imposed during the pandemic are being lifted, and among the most important – apart from the lack of access to the Mass during the ‘lockdown’ – is the lifting of the prohibition of the reception of the Blood of Christ from the ‘shared chalice’!

There are several things to be kept in mind:

The doctrine of concomitance teaches that the whole Christ is present under each Eucharistic species. Christ is indivisible, so that His body cannot be separated from His blood, His human soul, His divine nature, and His divine personality.

Consequently, Christ is wholly present in the Sacred Host and the Precious Blood. If you receive ‘only’ the Sacred Host, you receive the ‘whole Christ’: Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. If you receive ‘only’ the Precious Blood, you receive the ‘whole Christ’: Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity!

Reception by intinction, the ‘dipping’ of the Sacred Host into the Precious Blood, is reserved to the clergy, because it takes place on the altar, with the linens in place, to protect against accidental dripping. It is inappropriate for a communicant to receive the Sacred Host and carry it to a chalice and ‘self-communicate’ by intinction - dipping it into the Precious Blood.

(Where intinction is practiced – such as the Eastern Rites of the Church – only the Priest administers the Sacred Host, which has been ‘intincted’, with the safeguards in place.)

In receiving the Precious Blood, it is appropriate to carefully take the chalice from the hands of the Deacon or Eucharistic Minister, and consume a sip of the Precious Blood, OR, tip the chalice to receive, with your hands on those of the Deacon or Eucharistic Minister holding the chalice.

When coming before the Precious Blood, whether to consume, or passing before on your way back to your pew, it is important to stop and bow, acknowledging the Precious Blood in a reverent manner. Genuflecting, when simply passing by the Precious Blood, is discouraged, because of the risk of tripping the person(s) behind you. A reverent bow is sufficient!

The Center for Disease Control has acknowledged that no instance of contagion being spread by the reception of Holy Communion from a ‘common cup’ has been recorded.

The danger of contracting an illness from the shared chalice is extremely unlikely – the antibacterial properties of alcohol and precious metals are factors. It is always a matter of thoughtful regard for the well-being of other communicants to refrain from receiving the Precious Blood if one is feeling unwell – the same reason that one would remain home from Mass if not feeling well!

Eucharistic Ministers, please contact *Deacon Bill Polakowski*, who is coordinating the restoration of the reception of the Precious Blood at our weekday and weekend Masses!

Linda K. called the meeting to order at 5:36 p.m. and Fr. Greg led the group in an opening prayer.

Minutes from the August 2022 meeting were approved as written.

Finance (Kate): Income for August was \$75,932 of which \$7,010 were designated to Good Shepherd Mission. Expenses were \$92,634. The Parish general fund level is \$564,406.

The Building Our Church fund balance is \$97,949.

Board of Directors Meeting: The meeting paused at 5:45 p.m. for the Board of Directors meeting, with Diocesan Controller Deacon Greg Henderson in attendance by telephone.

All Saints School (Mike): 100 students are enrolled this year. Each student has a Chrome Book, thanks to the generosity of local donors. Security cameras are being installed and perimeter fencing upgraded. Arizona students can apply for an Arizona voucher to apply toward tuition.

Knights of Columbus and St. Paul Street Evangelization (Ed): A pro-life booth will be at the Douglas County Fair this weekend. Fr. Greg invited Council members to attend and help staff the booth if possible. The October calendar is full with both private home and community clean-up

activities. The Knights are participating in the Arizona Rosary Celebration. St. Paul Street Evangelization team had a booth and distributed materials at the Oktoberfest at Veteran's Park last weekend.

Our Lady of the Sierras Foundation (Charlie): Fr. Jude Dioka is assisting at the Shrine both with scheduled Masses and retreats. La Purisima Retreat Center has several groups coming in this Autumn.

Building and Grounds (Maryann): Work continues on the outside lights throughout the campus. Madonna Hall floors are being stripped and re-waxed. New paper towel holders are on order for the restrooms.

Annual Catholic Appeal (Maryann): Parishioners have participated in the Appeal with \$167,000 in gifts and pledges which comprises 125% of this year's goal.

Pipe Organ Restoration (Michelle): Arizona Pipe Organ Artisans is making steady progress on the pipes and controller renovation project. Two organists have committed to Organ Recital concerts. Hymn Fest will be on November 6th.

Hispanic Ministries (Deacon Lauro and Lupita): The community is happy to have a new altar server at the Spanish Mass. Plans are underway for the Posadas on December 17th.

Fr. Samuel and newly-arrived priest Fr. Simon have both celebrated the Spanish Mass.

Ladies of St. Andrew (Fran): The Bazaar raffle tickets and volunteer slips will be mailed out tomorrow. Volunteers are always needed to help sort donations. Several new volunteers signed up at the Ministry Fair.

St. Vincent de Paul Society (Kate for Pauline): Work is nearly complete on repairs at the Thrift Store. The reopening is scheduled for October 3rd. The annual Walk for the Poor will take place on October 1st. An agreement has been reached with the city to pave the parking lot on the northeast of the Conference Office. 1,119 food boxes were distributed in August, serving 3,905 people.

Catholic Foundation News (Ann): The annual Gala was a big success this year with over 700 people in attendance.

Pastor's Report (Fr Greg): Fr. Greg gifted all Council members with relic prayer cards in support of the canonization of Padre Eusebio Kino. Fr Silas Bogati will be visiting from Nepal in late October or early November. We continue to support our sister Parish in Haiti. Fr Samuel and Fr Jude will be giving a presentation about the conditions and persecution of Christians in Nigeria after the 8 a.m. Mass on September 25th.

Linda adjourned the meeting at 6:43 p.m. and Fr. Greg led the group in a closing prayer.
