that our Parish has a very active "Buildings and Grounds Committee"?



Maintenance is a huge issue for such a large facility, and we are very grateful to Ben Horner, Michael Protska, and Mark Williams for their outstanding service! Each month, immediate, as well as long-term projects are discussed and prioritized.



CATHOLIC QUIZ: This Week's Question: "This Week's Question: "What does the "I.N.R.I" inscription on the crucifix stand for?"

The Answer to last week's Question: "What are the 'aliases' for the Fourth Sunday in Lent?" The Fourth Sunday of Lent (27 March) has had many 'aliases': "Laetare Sunday", after the first words of the Introit: "Laetare Jerusalem" ('Rejoice with Jerusalem!') – the half-way point of Lent, and a respite in the penitential season, marked by rose-colored vestments, instead of violet. There is a joyful note at this point in Lent, because of the ancient practice of "handing over" the Apostles' Creed to Catechumens, the last and decisive step for those preparing for Baptism! It is also called "Mothering Sunday" from the ancient custom of visiting one's 'mother' church or cathedral, where one had been baptized. In the

natural evolution of this pilgrimage, children would also return home to spend the day with mother, taking roses for her, because of the color of the vestments. One tradition presents "Mothering Sunday" as an honor to Saint Anne, the Blessed Mother's mother, when children would "go a'mothering" – the origin of our Mother's Day! – a day of family reunion and festivity. It is also called "Rose Sunday" – from the papal blessing of the golden rose, a symbol of spiritual joy. The golden rose was blessed by the Pope on the Fourth Sunday of Lent, and sent to some notable person or institution to acknowledge and honor special service. It was also called "Refection (Latin: refreshment) Sunday, and in some places special cakes were given as gifts, commemorating Joseph feeding his brothers (First Reading) and JESUS feeding the multitudes (Gospel). Each of these is a very nice custom and way of celebrating the "half-way point" of Lent – next Sunday!







The Samaritan woman Exodus 17:3-7; Psalm 95:2-2,6-7,8-9; Romans 5:1-2, 5-8; John 4:5-42 Drinking from God's spring "The water I shall give will become in him a corring of water welling up to

A spring is a beautiful thing. Fresh, cool water endlessly bubbles up from the

water endessly bubbles up from the earth. People stop to drink from it, swim in it, be refreshed by it. Jesus promised the Samaritan woman that he would make such a spring well up in each of us. Do we appreciate this gift? Do we sit quietly and let this sacred spring refresh us, wash over us, inspire us? Do we drink from these waters of eternal life? Or are we just too busy to even think about it?

How can we fast this week?

Sadly, fresh spring water is becoming scarce and polluted in our world today. Try to fast from wasting water. Let's use only the water we need and appreciate the great gift of it. Become more aware of the ways we waste water or let it run for no reason. Maybe take shorter but more prayerful showers.

How can we pray this week? The psalms are the living springs of our faith — the oldest and most beautiful prayers we have, yet still fresh, bubbling and inspiring. The Sunday psalms for Lent are Psalms 91, 27, 95, 34, 126 and 22. Pray them and be refreshed by them. Then start working your way through all 150 psalms. Each is beautiful in its own way.




