DID YOU KNOW.....

that our parishioners have been active in promoting the Cause for Sainthood, for the "Apostle of Arizona and Sonora," *Padre Eusebio Francisco Kino, S.J.?*

On 11 July 2020, *Pope Francis* advanced the cause of *Kino's* sainthood by recognizing his life of heroic virtue, and declaring him 'Venerable'.

Padre Kino has 'popularly canonized' by the people of Arizona, Sonora, and the O'odahm Reservations, since his death in 1711. He is honored for the exploration and mapping of this vast desert region, the introduction of European livestock and horticulture, but above all, for being a tremendous 'bridge-builder' between peoples and cultures, and a tireless worker for peace, among Native Americans, and the Spanish settlers. His name appears in many places across this border region, including Kino Chapel at Fort Huachuca, and our own "Kino Hall"!

A statue of this incredible missionary-explorer graces the south façade of our church, on *Kino Boulevard* in *Tucson*, as well as in the Hall of Statuary in our Nation's Capitol!

A mural at our *Knights of Columbus' "Columbian Hall"* depicts *Padre Kino* and his great friend, Sobaípuris *Chief Coro* meeting at the *San Pedro River* in 1692.

This past year, several of our parishioners participated in a very special event – the opening of *Padre Kino's* mausoleum in *Magdalena, Sonora*, for the purpose of placing a roll of ribbon on his remains. That ribbon became a 'third class relic' (sometimes called a 'touch relic') of *Venerable Padre Kino*!

We are now in the process of cutting the ribbon into small squares and attaching them to prayer cards for distribution, inviting those who use these cards to invoke the intercession of *Venerable Padre Kino*, and promote his Cause for Canonization! IF you are interested in participating in this unique experience, we are seeking the help of a few folks, who would be willing to meet for an hour a week, to 'assemble' the holy cards.

It is a relatively simple process, and our *Sister Doris Jurgenson* will be available to instruct you. The assembly will be done here at St. Andrew's, as the 'relic-ribbon' cannot be taken home to assemble.

If you are interested in assisting us with this very beautiful project, please give the Parish Office a call (458-2925) and we will designate a time and place to meet and work, in October!





CATHOLIC QUIZ: This Week's Question: "When do blackberries turn tasteless?"



The Answer to Last Week's Question: "What wood was used to make the Cross?" The Cross has been very fruitful soil for the growth of legends. One says that the Saviour's Cross was constructed from four different woods: palm, cedar, cypress, and olive, representing the four corners of the world. Another legend says that the aspen provided the wood for the Cross, and that its leaves 'quake' and sigh in shame with every breeze. Yet another legend says that the dogwood, which once matched the oak in stature and strength, provided the wood of the Cross. The noble dogwood was distressed at the horrific purpose it was put to, and our Lord, sensing this, transformed the dogwood into a slender, twisted shrub. Further, He designed its blossoms to be in the form of a cross, with two long petals and two short, each bearing nail prints, brown with rust and stained with blood. At the flower's center is a miniature of the Crown of Thorns. The Feast of the Holy Cross is September 14th!

WELCOME Fr. Simon Mbindyo Muema, SDS (Society of the Divine Savior (Salvatorians)!

Fr. Simon was born in June 14, 1976 in Kabaa Village, Machakos County in Kenya.

I am the last born in the family of 7(Three are deceased). All my siblings live in Kenya. My father is deceased. My loving mother is alive, well and just had a 90th birthday!

I grew up in a very humble background in our Kenyan village. We did farming, kept cows, sheep, goats and chicken. I come from a strong Catholic family background. I love to a lementary school, taught by Irish Missionary Sisters from Ireland. This is where my Vocation to the Priesthood took root.

After High school, I travelled to Spain, where I have two relatives who are Carmelite Sisters. My Aunt (My Mum's side) and my cousin on my Dad's side. We do have deep Carmelite roots in our family. A few Priests and a good number of Carmelites Sisters come from our village. I entered the Carmelite Order in Spain. After almost 2 years, I realized that I needed more time to discern about the vocation to the Priesthood and to the religious life. I travelled to United States to study. I went to the Nursing School in Riverside College Campus in California. Later I worked in Hospice care. After 3 years of caring for the dying, I started questioning the meaning of life and my purpose in this world. I started to rediscover and discern anew my path to the Priesthood. I considered Diocesan Priesthood, seriously, but I was however attracted to the religious communities. Living, praying

and working together in a community was very much treasured in my vocation. I reached out to few congregations but the history, charism and spirituality of the Salvatorians was very much appealing to me. I joined the Society of the Divine Savior ("the Salvatorians") in the summer of 2014.

I studied Philosophy and Theology at the Sacred Heart School of Theology in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. I took my first vows of Obedience, Poverty and Chastity on August 14, 2016. On September 8, 2019 I took my final vows as a Religious of the Society of the Divine Savior. On June 5, 2021 I was ordained as a Transitional Deacon, and on May 28, 2022 I was Ordained to the Priesthood in Milwaukee, WI.

This is my second week at St. Andrew the Apostle Parish community and the warm welcome from the parishioners has been very kind and tremendous. I am very grateful and look forward to being of help in your Parish community and especially to learn from you. We are all called to share the Gospel and learn from each other in our faith journey. That is why JESUS came here on earth not only to teach us how to go to heaven, but He teaches us every day how to be simple, kind, loving human being here on earth.!




