



CATHOLIC QUIZ: This week's Question: "Why are the Sundays of (not after) Easter"?

The answer to last week's Question: "Where does the word 'Easter' come from? Is it in Scripture?" The word 'Easter' has its roots in the Norse word "oestur" – meaning the 'season of early sunrise', or, the time of re-birth of the earth in Spring. Both of these meanings lent themselves to the Christian symbolism for the new life in the Risen Christ, the Eternal Light, and the source of our re-birth in Baptism. The word 'Easter' does not occur in the New Testament, and is used only in the English-speaking world. Non-English speaking Christians use words derived from "Pascha" (the Greek word meaning, "Passover") which does have a Scriptural basis. The Greek word "Anastasia" – meaning "resurrection" – is also used to describe the Day and the Season we call "Easter". Many evangelical Christians reject the use of the word "Easter" because of its pagan origins.





CALLED AND CHOSEN: FATHER VINCENT CAPODANNO "Step into the heroic life of Fr. Vincent R. Capodanno Servant of God as this EWTN Original Docudrama returns to his brave ministry as a US Marine Chaplain during the Vietnam War. Born to a large family of Italian immigrants, he would decide to serve as a Maryknoll Missionary in Taiwan and Hong Kong before going on to attend to the spiritual needs of American soldiers on the battlefield. Discover a heart "Called and Chosen" to be a priest, missionary, chaplain, and martyr. Chaplain Fr. Vincent Capodanno was attached to the 1st Marine Division in Vietnam in 1966-67. In his second tour with the Marines he went out on a combat patrol with his men during Operation Swift. During the operation Chaplain Capodanno was killed aiding and comforting multiple wounded marines. He was killed on September 4, 1967, and was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor for actions that day.

"I wonder, along with so many anguished people, if peace is truly being sought ..."

Pope Francis made an invitation today after leading the midday Regina Caeli on May 1, 2022. He asked the faithful to pray the Rosary for peace every day in May. But he followed the invitation with a searching question: If peace is truly being sought; whether there is the will to avoid a continued military and verbal escalation; whether everything possible is being done to silence the weapons.

Here's what he said:

Today is the beginning of the month dedicated to the Mother of God. I would like to invite all the faithful and communities to pray the Rosary for peace every day in May. My thought goes to the Ukrainian city of Mariupol, "Mary's city," barbarically bombed and destroyed.

Once again, from here, I renew my request that safe humanitarian corridors be arranged for the people trapped in the steelworks in that city. I suffer and weep, thinking of the sufferings of the Ukrainian people, and in particular, the weakest, the elderly and children. There are even terrible reports of children being expelled and deported. And while we are witnessing a macabre regression of humanity, I wonder, along with so many anguished people, if peace is truly being sought; whether there is the will to avoid a continued military and verbal escalation; whether everything possible is being done to silence the weapons.

I beg you, let us not surrender to the logic of violence, to the perverse spiral of weapons. May the path of dialogue and peace be taken! Let us pray.



Ayman Khair is representing about 180 Christian families from Bethlehem. These families have been dependent upon sales of their hand carved religious articles to tourists of the Holy Land. Due to the conflict in the Middle East and the Pandemic, tourism has been stopped completely from March 2, 2020, till February 2022. It is very important to support them at this critical time since they have no income and there is no government to take care of them and help them. In order to survive, they have turned to Christian communities in the United State to purchase their articles.

These hand carved religious articles are beyond description. Carved from wood of the sacred Olive tree, this workmanship has been traditional for these families for hundreds of years. It is hoped that through the efforts of Mr. Khair, these families who have little income and are able to stay living and survive in the Holy Land.

Sadly enough, the Christian population dropped from 22 % to less than 2% in the last 20 years. Thank you in advance for your support.
