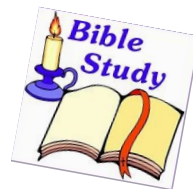

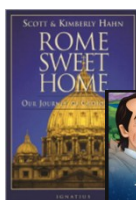

DID YOU KNOW.....

that we are “*saved to serve*”?

In his powerful homily on Sunday the 15th (available on YouTube), *Deacon John Klein*, challenged us to live our Baptism in service to others. He reminded us, that ‘baptized into Christ, ‘who came not to be served but to serve’, our lives, too, must be lives of serving, if we are living our baptismal calling’!

In his homily *Deacon John* gave a brief listing of all of the areas of service/ministry which are available in our Parish! (You can check out a list of ministries/apostolates/areas of service in the bulletin for a larger list!)

While it is perhaps easier (more convenient) to simply give money, the Lord’s invitation (calling) is to give oneself! Taking to heart our calling to live the meaning of our Baptism, it is important to commit ourselves – our personal time, our personal abilities, and our personal resources – to some very specific area (s) of service within the Parish and the wider community, and take our part in proclaiming the Good News! *The world doesn’t care how much the Church knows, until the world knows how much the Church cares!*

In our society, it is far too easy to fall into the ‘consumer mindset’ – that we pay for services or goods, or cancel payment if we no longer need those goods or services. It is a *contractual* relationship, which can be amended or canceled at will.

This ‘consumer mindset’ is totally alien and inadequate in understanding and living our life in Christ. Baptism in not a ‘contract’ but a covenant – a reality which is based in a relationship between *persons* and shapes our whole life. Baptized into Christ, into that dynamic and growing relationship with God, our whole life is *immersed* (which is the meaning of ‘baptism’) in Christ and is shaped by that relationship! This is why we need to be constantly reminded, to paraphrase *St. Paul*, the Church is not an organization (consumer-based), but an *organism* – a living Body in which all the parts are interdependent!

It was a Protestant minister, the martyr *Dietrich Bonhoeffer* (1906-1945) who saw this so clearly:

“There is a word that, when a Catholic hears it, kindles all his feeling of love and bliss; that stirs the depths of his religious sensibility -- from dread and awe of the Last Judgment to the sweetness of God’s Presence; and that certainly awakens in him the feeling of home; the feeling that only a child has in relation to its mother, made up of gratitude, reverence, and devoted love; the feeling that overcomes one when, after a long absence, one returns to one’s home, the home of one’s childhood.

And there is a word that to Protestants has the sound of something infinitely commonplace, more or less indifferent and superfluous, that does not make their heart beat faster; something with which a sense of boredom is so often associated, or which, at any rate, does not lend wings to our religious feelings—And yet, our fate is sealed if we are unable to attach a new, or perhaps a very old, meaning to that word.

Woe to us if that word does not become important to us [Protestants] again, and soon. The word to which I refer is ‘Church’.”

As *Deacon John* reminded us, this is the ‘total immersion’ into Christ’s life of service to which each of us has been called and which can only be lived out fully in the reality of the Church!

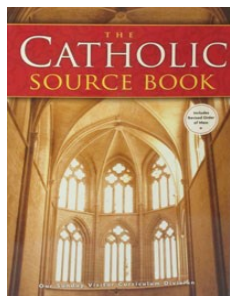

The Answer to Last Week's Question: "What is the 'Sistine Chapel'?"

The Sistine Chapel is a chapel in the Apostolic Palace, the official residence of the pope in Vatican City. Originally known as the Cappella Magna, the chapel takes its name from Pope Sixtus IV, who had it built between 1473 and 1481. Papal Conclaves – the election of a new Pope – are held within it, as well as other special ceremonies. The ceiling and apse were frescoed by the artist *Michelangelo* from 1475 to 1483, and is regarded as one of the greatest art sites in the world.

The local chapter of this organization has recently re-aligned with the team in Tucson and are actively recruiting nurses locally to participate in these services. The organization has annual dues and the nurse will need to get a white uniform if he/she doesn't already have one. 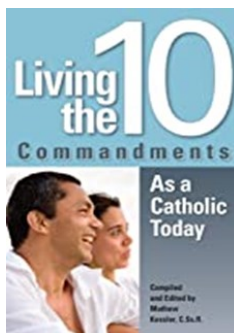

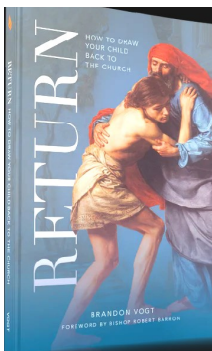

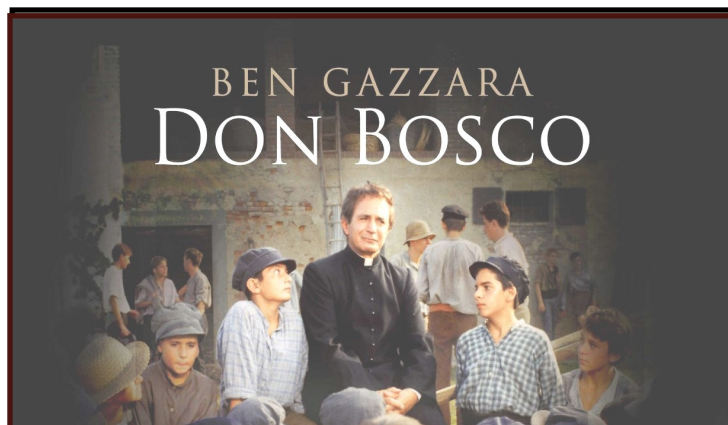

Linda K. called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and Fr. Greg led the group in an opening prayer.

Minutes from the November meeting were approved as written.

Finance (Kate): Income for December was \$109,067 of which \$3,358 were designated to Good Shepherd Mission. Expenses were \$82,527. The Parish general fund level is \$563,990. The Building Our Church fund balance is \$98,398.

All Saints School (Mike): Enrollment is at 98 students. Mike will speak about CTSO on the weekend of 28 and 29 January. Three teachers are not certified, but they are working to become so. The school received 50 Chrome Books for use by the students. Fencing and security concerns continue to be high priority at the school. Mike mentioned that there are several generous anonymous donors to the school.

Good Shepherd Mission (Chuck): Chuck extended an invitation for altar servers or Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist to attend Mass at the Mission.

Knights of Columbus and St. Paul's Street Evangelization (Ed): The group had a public rosary last weekend. Ed will attend the annual March for Life in Tucson equipped with literature about St. Paul Street Evangelization. Ed has stepped down as Grand Knight and Doug Jacques has been appointed in his place.

St Vincent de Paul Society (Pauline): The Conference and Food Bank received FEMA grants totaling \$16,000. 1,000 blankets were also sent in from FEMA. Shelly Granger resigned her position as Thrift Store manager because of a serious illness and Leah Waller has been promoted to the Manager position. There was a break-in to the donations area. The Conference is gathering bids and information to install a security system in the Store. Arizona has had a 23% increase in homelessness this year. The result has been a vast increase in the number of friends seeking assistance.

Ladies of St A (Fran): The Ladies have resumed their monthly meetings. Checks have been distributed to several charities in the city funded by proceeds from the Bazaar and St. Nick fair.

Music Ministry (Michelle): The organ recital tentatively scheduled for February 7th has been canceled. Maryann Hockstad has written the justification documents for two grants for the organ refurbishment. Two recitals are being planned for March and April. Rebecca played the organ at different Masses earlier this month to allow a greater number of parishioners to hear the improvements to the organ.

Hispanic Ministries (Lupita): December events were the Our Lady of Guadalupe celebration and the Posa-das. Attendance was good at both events. New dresses that were made in Mexico for the young dancers are stored in the tower for further parishioner use.

Our Lady of the Sierras Foundation (Charlie): The retreat center will be the locale for the joint Confirmation retreat for students from Our Lady of the Mountains and St. Andrew. The December Christmas Mass was well attended, and a beautiful evening well organized by volunteers. The Bishop of Nogales, Sonora was the main celebrant for the Mass.

Wings of Angels Foundation (Kate presenting report from Marge Conroy): Kate read a letter from Marge addressed to the Council. In it she expressed gratitude for the monthly gift of \$250 all of which is used to assist families and provide medical equipment to those in need.

Building and Grounds (Fr. Greg): There were some problems with installation of the new heating system in Kino Hall as the construction of the original building was plaster over steel screen, not drywall. As a result, there was a collapse of part of the ceiling in the old sacristy. Our maintenance staff continues to save money by shopping for best value of Parish funds and doing an enormous amount of work themselves rather than calling in contractors. The B & G committee is full of volunteers with expertise in many areas and they meet monthly to advise and guide the maintenance team.

Annual Catholic Appeal (Linda K): This year's video will be shown on the weekend of 4 and 5 February. Bishop Weisenburger will preside at the 5 p.m. Saturday Mass on Saturday February 11th immediately preceding the annual kick-off dinner at the Columbian Hall at 6:30 p.m. that evening.

Fr. Samuel: Fr. Samuel reports that he has been called by many families recently to have their homes blessed. He expressed the thanks of the Parish in Nigeria for the funding St. Andrew provided for renovation of the Church. There will be a special collection on the weekend of 21 and 22 Jan to support the Via Christi community. Father asked for prayers for the Church in Nigeria which continues to suffer severe persecution. As recently as last week a priest was killed, and several community members kidnapped.

Fr. Simon: Newly ordained priests will be gathering at the retreat center in Picture Rocks next month. Fr. Simon will be a homilist at the retreat which is designed to equip new priests with the skills needed to be administrators in parishes.

Pastor Report: Fr Samuel and Fr Jude gave a report to the hospital staff about the dire persecution of Christians in Nigeria. Fr Jude serves the hospital patients on a regular basis. Retired Deacon George Gaun is in poor health and Fr. asked for prayers. Deacon Lauro and his brothers and sister will be providing the entertainment at the ACA dinner this year – a reunion for the family group that grew up as entertainers.

Linda K adjourned the meeting at 6:35 p.m. Fr. Greg and Fr. Simon led the group in closing prayer and blessing.
