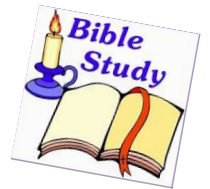

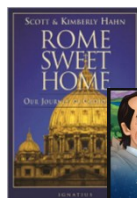

## DID YOU KNOW....

that our Knights of Columbus, Bishop Salpointe Council #4584 received great recognition at the 116<sup>th</sup> State Convention of the Knights of Columbus?

On 19-20 May, at the State Convention held in Scottsdale, our own Ed, Cyndy and Matthew Graveline were honored as the "Family of the Year" for the State of Arizona, in recognition of their dynamic leadership in evangelization, Seminarian support, public Rosary events, and parish ministries! We are very proud of the Gravelines and this well-deserved recognition!

At the Convention, our Bishop Salpointe Council of the Knights and St. Andrew's Parish received a special award and recognition for their community "Father of Lights Festival" for a safe alternative to Halloween and a family celebration for those living in the Carmichael School and Fry Town neighborhoods, in Len Roberts Park. This October event has the support of a number of churches in our area, but it is the Knights of Columbus who provide the leadership, food, and the security for this growing event! Again, this was a very well-deserved award, and we should note that our Deacon Bill Polakowski (a Knight of Columbus and our Youth Minister) has headed up this event for the Neighborhood each year! AND, at the Convention, our Larry Powers was elected State Treasurer for the Knights! It was also announced that St. Andrew the Apostle and our Bishop Salpointe Council are part of the pilot program for the COR Dialog for Catholic men, which will be promoted across the United States, Canada, and Mexico by the Knights in the next two years! We have had two of the COR Dialogs on Saturday mornings, and the next ones are scheduled for 17 June and 15 July! These hour-long events begin with a short period of Eucharistic Adoration, followed by a light breakfast, short presentation, and round-table discussions focused on building up the spirituality of men, as husbands, fathers, leaders. 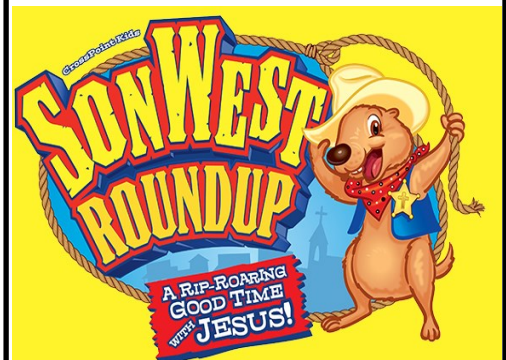

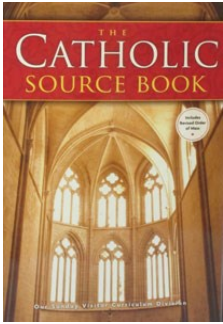

### CATHOLIC QUIZ:



This week's Question: "What are the 'Five Promises of the Holy Spirit'?"

The Answer to Last Week's Question: "How is the Jewish Feast of Pentecost ("Shavuot") related to the Christian Feast of Pentecost?" The Jewish Feast of *Shavuot* (or Festival of Weeks) was celebrated a "week of weeks" – 50 days after *Passover*. In Greek it was called *Pentecost* – from the Greek *pente* = 50. It was also called the "Festival of First Fruits (of the grain harvest) and is commanded in *Exodus 23:16* and *Leviticus 23:15-21*. Originally a Spring festival of thanks for the grain harvest, it became

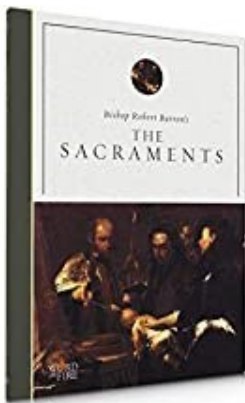
a festival of Covenant renewal, a Jewish "thanksgiving feast" which combined these themes of thanksgiving and renewal. The Law designated it as one of the three major Jewish Festivals (with *Passover* and *Tabernacles*) and attendance in the Temple was obligatory on all Jewish males. Jewish pilgrims would come from all over the Roman Empire – and beyond – to participate in *Passover* in Jerusalem and then remain the 50 days to celebrate *Shavuot* before returning home – hence the great crowds present from all over the Mediterranean world, reported in the *Acts of the Apostles 2:5-11* "Staying in Jerusalem at that time were devout Jews of every nation under heaven." (If you would like to be as smart as the "Quiz Master" – pick up a copy of the Catholic Source Book – available in the Parish Office, for only \$20.00!)

### SOUL FOOD:

*"So often we have the experience and miss the meaning. Afterwards we know the hollowness and disappointment at what was merely said or done in external signs, that did not connect us with their underlying realities. This is the sad result of being unprepared, of being lost in the superficial. But once we have found true relationship with God at depth, everything that happens to us is drawn into a meaningful pattern. 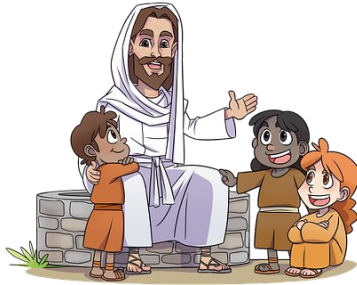
#### *The Sacraments*, Bishop Robert Barron

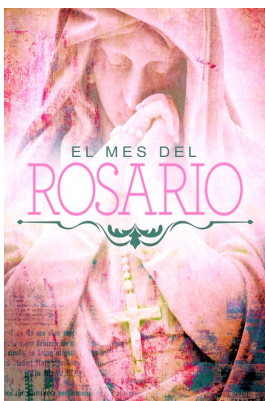
GriefShare is a nationwide biblical support group that is focused on helping people who are dealing with a loved one's death. Each DVD session features nationally respected grief experts and real-life stories, followed by small group discussion about the topics presented (with workbook support).

At each GriefShare session you will find encouragement and help in grieving the death of your loved one. No matter the cause of your loved one's death, this is an opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling. You will learn how to recognize the symptoms of being stuck in grief and how to cope with the normal emotions that come when grieving a death. You will learn valuable information on facing life situations, and you'll gain renewed hope for the future. These sessions are open to anyone regardless of whether your experience is recent or not so recent. The group is led by individuals who have personally experienced grief due to a loved one's death. Each leader is trained in facilitating a GriefShare support group.

Our GriefShare group meets every Wednesday, 5 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.  
in Madonna Hall, room #3. You may join at any time.

We hope you will consider joining us. Please remember your loss is shared by others in this church and what you are experiencing is sometimes easier to bear knowing others are listening and do care. May God's love continue to comfort and strengthen you.

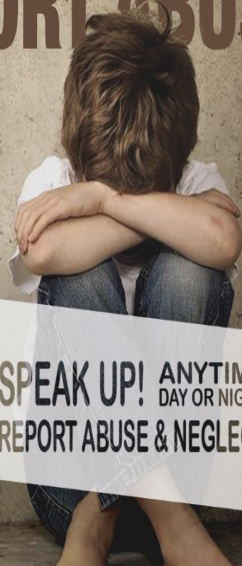

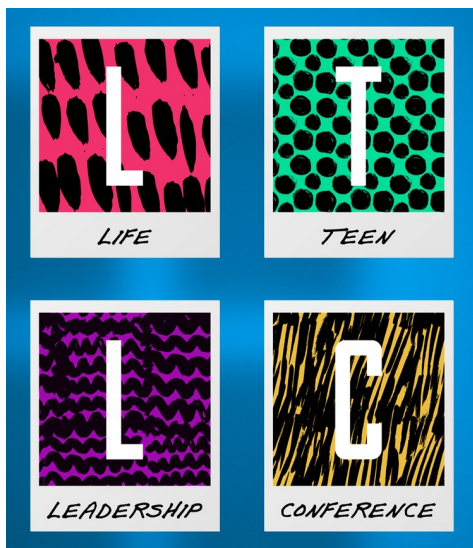

**Finance** (Kate): Income for April was \$105,096 of which \$1,688 were designated to Good Shepherd Mission. Expenses were \$78,732. The Parish general fund level is \$552,040. The Building Our Church fund balance is \$89,403.

**Hispanic Ministries** (Lauro): A Spanish-speaking priest from St Pius X has agreed to visit the Parish and help from time to time at the Spanish Mass. The Hijos de Maria Group donated \$200 to the St. Vincent de Paul Society.

**ACA:** (Ann): Parishioners have pledged a total of \$167,488, which is 125% of the goal, from 346 donors.

**St Vincent de Paul Society** (Pauline): The Store averages \$1,800 to \$2,400 per day in sales. The Food Bank continues to have steady requests for assistance. 12,900 pounds of goods were collected at the annual Postal Driver food drive. All were very grateful for the 40 volunteers that assisted in sorting the donations that day. The Legacy Foundation is coordinating a county-wide food drive during the third week of June.

**Knights of Columbus** (Larry): The 116<sup>th</sup> Annual State Convention this weekend. Fr. Greg will be in attendance as the State Chaplain. Larry Powers has been nominated for the Office of State Treasurer.

**Building and Grounds** (Maryann): Maintenance staff has finished putting a new coat on the roof of the Church. The curtains in Kino have been cleaned and will be re-hung this week. Bill Cassidy readjusted the front doors at Good Shepherd Mission. Cactus Wren renewed their rental contract for another two-year period. The Community Chorus donated to the Parish in thanks for the use of Kino Hall as a rehearsal venue.

**Catholic Community Services News** (Maryann): Donations are being accepted to assist migrants and distributed through a center in Tucson.

**Ladies of St A** (Fran): The Ladies collected baby items to be distributed through Care Net Pregnancy Center. Bazaar donations have started to come in. The Craft Group continues to meet on Thursdays in Madonna Hall and others continue to work on projects at home.

**St. Paul's Street Evangelization** (Ed): Ed continues evangelization throughout the Community, both one-on-one and with group prayer organization.

**Our Lady of the Sierras Foundation** (Charlie): Fr Amal Sebastiar is hosting a two-day evangelization retreat in mid-July at the Center. Rooms are available and reservations can be made through the Foundation office.

**St. Andrew Scholarship** (Thad): Scholarships were awarded to two of the seven applicants. Thad reported that the essays were excellent, and the choice was very difficult to make this year.

**All Saints School** (Mike): 90 students are enrolled for the upcoming school year.

**Pastor Report:** Fr. Greg proposed that the Parish donate to the Jewish Community Center that will be opened in Sierra Vista in a renovated existing building on Fry Boulevard. The Council voted to become a "partner" donor and donate \$4,500. Carlos Nagore, a seminarian from the Diocese, will be assigned to the Parish from August of this year until June of next year. Fr. Greg led the Council in congratulating Fr. Samuel on passing the U.S. Citizenship exam. Fr. Samuel is very pleased to have passed the exam but asked that all continue to pray for Nigerians as persecution continues and increases in severity.

Volunteers will once again be allowed into the Cochise County Jail for ministry in the upcoming weeks.

**Budget:** The Council reviewed the proposed budget for FY 2024. Vote will be at next month's meeting. Linda adjourned the meeting at 6:56 p.m., Fr. Greg led the group in a closing prayer and Fr. Samuel imparted his blessing.
