DID YOU KNOW.....

that the word "vacation" comes from the Latin 'vacare', meaning: 'to empty'? The English words, "vacate" and "vacuum" come from that root word, as well! What then does it mean to take a 'vacation'? In the very best sense, it means to open up a place for God in the center of my life! It means to empty myself, for a period of time, of all of the fussy concerns and daily routines which can so fill my life, that there is no room for God – or others! Vacations are times and opportunities to vacate the routine and experience life in a different way; and when done right, we are refreshed and renewed and reenergized.

In the Gospel of Mark (6:31-32) we read "JESUS said [to the apostles], 'Come apart with Me to a deserted place and rest awhile'. For many were coming and going, and they had no leisure even to eat."

Does this 'coming and going, with hardly any time to eat' sound familiar? Too often our lives can be overwhelmed with busy-ness, with little real leisure, and a kind of famine for meaning! To US, our Lord says: "Come apart with Me" (or you will just come apart!) and rest awhile!" A true 'vacation' will never be a 'vacation' from God, or a 'vacation' from Mass, but an opening to God, to fill the emptiness of my life, and to be renewed in body, mind, and spirit!

If you are planning on traveling this summer, make sure that it is a real 'vacation' – a deeper connecting with God – and others! But mostly that you take the time and give yourself the space 'to empty' – in order to be filled with God! It is the real meaning of 'recreation' – to let yourself be 're-created' in the image and love of God! Take along good reading, books that will encourage reflection and renewal! Make prayer your basic response to what you are seeing, what you are experiencing, who you are with! Look for opportunities to worship – at Mass in new, different communities, and in your own quiet time, as you come apart with Him!

If you are not traveling this summer, or have planned a 'stay-cation' (with time off from work but remaining at home), this too can be a 'time apart with the Lord', as you participate in daily Masses, spend some time in Adoration in the *Divine Mercy Chapel*, pray the Rosary as you hike, spend some time outdoors (away from the television) looking at the 'great book of Creation', write some postcards (from home) and send some loving thoughts/words to others!

But however you will 'vacation' this summer – please make it a real 'vacation' – an openness to God that He may fill you, and that you may find real rest and refreshment in our Lord!

(Please bring your bulletins from the places you worship this summer to the Office! We love to see how they do things in others places – and get ideas how we might do better!)



The answer to last week's Question: "Who is the Patron Saint of the Incarcerated?" Traditionally, the Patron Saint of Prisoners is Saint Dismas, the name tradition has given to the 'penitent' thief, who suffered crucifixion with JESUS and acknowledged Him as Lord: "Remember me, Lord, when You come into Your Kingdom." (Luke 23:42). Our Lord, Himself, and all of His Apostles were 'incarcerated' and we are especially commended to 'visit those in prison' (Matthew 25:36). Most recently, St. Maximilian Kolbe, the Franciscan Friar, who volunteered to take the place of condemned inmate in the 'starvation bunker' in Auschwitz on the 14th of August, 1941, is invoked as a Patron Saint for Prisoners. Our Diocesan Ministry to Detainees and the Incarcerated is called "The Kolbe Society", and, the "Dismas Society" is the national Catholic ministry providing

Bibles and catechetical/devotional materials to the Incarcerated!
