DID YOU KNOW....

that we are seeing more and more families with children at Mass and that our Parish *enthusiastically* welcomes them to fully celebrate with us?

The presence of children – of all ages and all volumes – is a gift to our Parish. Like all of us, they are members of the Body of Christ and a reminder of the growth and future of our Parish!

In his homily at Confirmation *Bishop Weisenburger* told the young people being confirmed: *"You are sometimes told that you are the future of the Church. That's not true. You are the NOW of the Church!"* Beautifully said!

Some suggestions for those with little ones at Mass:

First, RELAX! God put the wiggle in children; don't feel that you have to suppress it in God's House! We expect children to act like children, not miniature adults!

SIT in places where it is easier for the little ones to see and hear what is happening!

Quietly EXPLAIN the parts of the Mass and actions of the Priest, the servers, and other ministers. There are also wonderful little Mass books for children so that they can more easily follow the Mass and hold a book, like big people do! (Available in the Parish Office!)

SING the hymns, pray the prayers, and say the responses.

Children learn 'liturgical behavior' by doing as you do!

When you are relaxed and focused in worship – 'at home with God' – so IGNORE the occasional hostile look from some older folks who have forgotten what it is like to be a child – and that they were probably a 'hand full' for their parents when they were that age!

If you decide to leave the Sanctuary with your child, feel free to use the Family Room (aka 'the cry room') and the changing room/bathroom and please RETURN as soon as you can!

Psalm 8 says 'that out of the mouths of little children, even nursing children, comes perfect praise!' We take that very much to heart! The little one who goes on 'singing' after the rest of us have stopped is a precious reminder of what praise is really all about!

To all of our Parishioners, please WELCOME our children and their parents with a big smile of encouragement and thank them for the gift of being able to share the Mass with them!

Remember, it is our Lord Himself Who commands, *"Let the children come to Me!"* And speaking of children, *Fr. Simon Muema* sent us some wonderful photos of the children of his home village in Kenya, unfurling a large sign thanking you – the Parishioners of *St. Andrew's*, *Deacon Michael* and *Helen Denton*, and the Parishioners of *Our Lady of the Mountain* for providing the funds to expand the dormitory of their school. 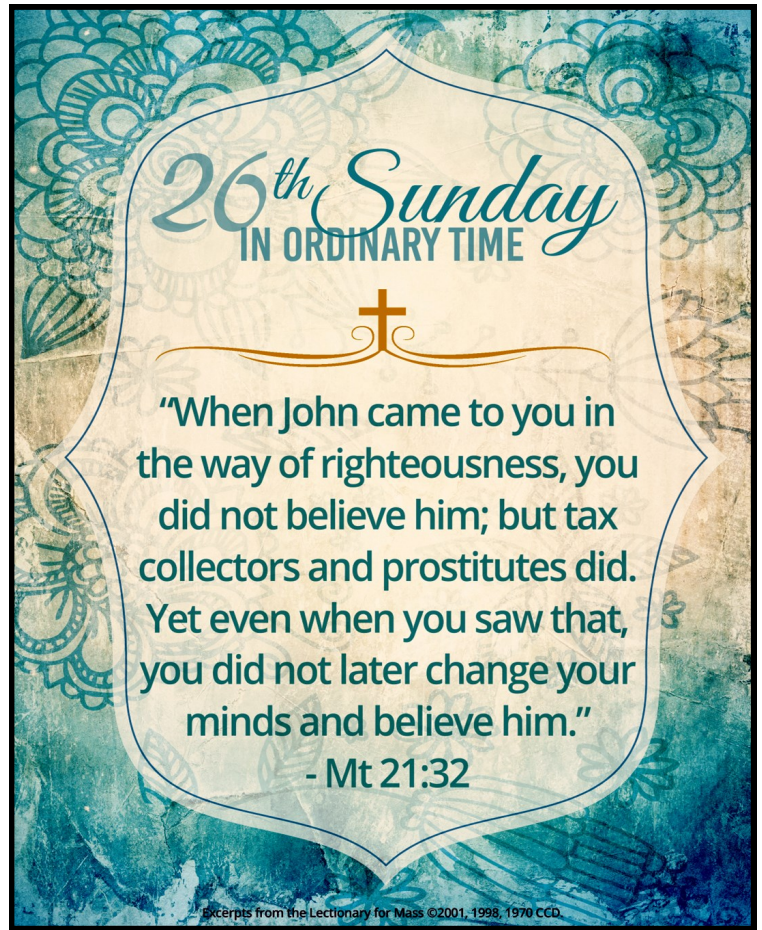

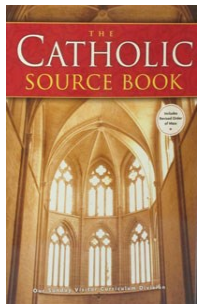

CATHOLIC QUIZ: *This week's Question: "What is the 'Stigmata'?"*



The Answer to Last Week's Question: "Is there a 'Patron Saint of Alcoholics'?"

Matt Talbot (1856-1925) is a good example of why a person becomes a Patron. (He has not been declared a saint, but "Venerable", which is one of the stages in the Canonization process!) He was born of a poor family in Dublin and from age twelve had problems with alcohol. By the time **Matt Talbot** was twenty-eight, he was begging for drinks from strangers. Deep in shame and finding no one to turn to for help, he took a pledge to the Sacred Heart of JESUS to stop drinking. Realizing that sobriety depends on more than not drinking, **Matt** grew in holiness, as he became a daily-communicant, and a 'man of prayer'. The basic successful principles of Alcoholics Anonymous are founded on a reliance on God: these principles have been adapted by numerous other twelve-step programs. (The newest such program, "*Celebrate Recovery*" - has returned to the more Christ-centered approach of **Matt Talbot**.)

ADULT CHRISTIAN INITIATION

The Adult Christian Initiation process is primarily intended for those who are unbaptized and preparing to receive the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. However, much of the Adult Christian Initiation process is applicable and valuable for those who are preparing for reception into full communion with the Catholic Church. A shared catechesis and spiritual formation is offered to candidates who are preparing for a profession of faith in the Catholic Church or for those baptized Catholics who need to complete their sacraments.

Because the process of becoming a Christian is about conversion and the transformation of the whole person, it is difficult to determine how long this process will take. Every person is treated as an individual with a unique history and background. Through a process of spiritual discernment, catechumens (unbaptized) and candidates (baptized) are led one step at a time to the sacraments of initiation.

The following Adult Christian Initiation steps or periods correspond to the spiritual growth of the individual.

Period of Evangelization and Precatechumenate. During this period, teaching is given to those who are interested in learning more about the Catholic faith. The sessions cover basic information about the faith and fundamentally communicate the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Period of the Catechumenate. The Catechumenate is an extended period during which the catechumens and candidates are given suitable pastoral formation and guidance aimed at training them in the Christian life.

Period of Purification and Enlightenment. This period tends to correspond with Lent and is intended to be a period of increased introspection and coming closer to God. The aim of this period is to eliminate what is weak and sinful and affirm what is holy.

During the Adult Christian Initiation process, rites are celebrated as signs of transition from one period to the next. The celebration of the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist) takes place at the Easter Vigil. The Elect (formerly called catechumens) celebrate all of these sacraments while the candidates (having already been baptized) celebrate Confirmation and Eucharist.

Period of Mystagogy. As a newly initiated Catholic, formation and education continues in the period of the post baptismal catechesis, which is also called Mystagogy. This period continues at least until Pentecost. During this period, the fully initiated Catholics reflect on their experiences at the Easter Vigil and continue to learn more about the Scriptures, the Sacraments, and the teachings of the Catholic Church. In addition, they reflect on how they will serve Christ and help in the Church's mission and outreach activities.

Dates and Times of Adult Christian Initiation. The next Adult Christian Initiation for the 2023-24 catechumenate year will begin on September 7, 2023. The session will take place in Madonna Hall every Thursday evening from 6:30 to 8:00 PM. It is highly recommended that all participants attend all Thursday sessions. The Catechumens/Elect must also attend Breaking Open the Word each Sunday as scheduled (The Mass assigned to Breaking Open the Word will vary between the Saturday 5 PM Vigil, the Sunday Masses: 8 AM, 10AM, 12 Noon, and 5 PM).

REFLECT

Over twenty-five years ago, Pope St. John Paul II wrote that the Gospel of life is at the heart of Jesus' saving message to the world (*Evangelium vitae* 1). In taking on human flesh, dwelling among us, and sacrificing his very life for our redemption, Christ reveals the profound dignity of every human person. Jesus calls each of us to "care for the other as a person for whom God has made us responsible" (EV 87). The Gospel of life is intrinsic to the whole Christian life and foundational to the decisions we make on a daily basis. For, "the Gospel of God's love for man, the Gospel of the dignity of the person and the Gospel of life are a single and indivisible Gospel" (EV 2).

Let us reflect on how we personally live out the Gospel: *Do I help pregnant and parenting mothers in need? If a friend became pregnant in challenging circumstances, would she know she could come to me for loving support for her and her baby? Do I know of the places in my community where she could receive material help if she needed it?*

Through the intercession of Our Lady of the Rosary, may Our Lord grant us the grace to truly and courageously live his Gospel of life.
