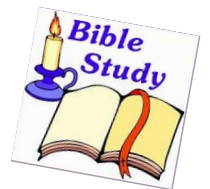

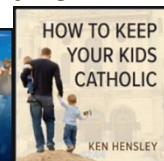

## DID YOU KNOW.....

that there is some wonderful discussion going on around the topic of “hospitality” and how it gets expressed in our Parish?

As has been said before, hospitality really needs to be seen as the ‘matrix’ in which the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass takes place. The Eucharist is the expression of gratitude (thanksgiving) for ‘God’s hospitality’, as we are welcomed to the Table of the Lord!

God’s hospitality extended to the whole world, becomes ‘incarnate’ in the God/Man JESUS – the loving care and concern of God made present, perfect and permanent in Him, Who welcomes us in the Eucharist!

The Holy Sacrifice of the Altar and the Meal/Sacrament of the Table, are two expressions of this one reality. Around the Holy Sacrifice there is a beautiful and sacred ‘stillness’ – the profound quiet of awe-filled adoration. (One of the ways in which we can extend that sacred ‘stillness’ is in Eucharistic Adoration. With our *Divine Mercy Chapel* accessible 24/7 – (lighted and secure) – many will find in that beautiful and intimate stillness a place and moment of deeply personal encounter. More on Eucharistic Adoration later!)

The Meal/Sacrament (Holy Communion: sharing) of the Table is, by very definition, a place of ‘connecting’ and ‘communing’ – with the Lord and with our sisters and brothers in the Lord. This, too, is deeply personal, but not private – it is the Community experiencing together the Presence of the Lord in the Holy Eucharist, AND, in one another: “the Body of Christ”!

As with so much in our Catholic Faith, it is not a case of “either/or” but rather, “both/and”. “Privatizing” the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, by withdrawing into our own ‘spiritual cocoon’ and consciously disconnecting from the rest of the Community, is an on-going temptation in a society which exaggerates both ‘privacy’ and ‘individualism’. We have seen (especially in the past three years) appropriate ‘social distancing’ becoming inappropriate isolation and ‘social disconnect’.

The proper and healthy understanding of this ‘double reality’ experienced in the Mass is a wonderful antidote to two opposite temptations: casual irreverence and, at the other extreme, privatization. In responding to the hospitality of God, we extend that hospitality to one another!

One of our older parishioners recently said (with innocent and unintended irony): “Of course this is a very friendly parish. I always speak to my friends!”

The ‘incarnational reality’ is the extension of Christ’s Real Presence in the Eucharist which we receive, now in and through our lives for others. The friendship of God must be extended through us to others, indeed, to the whole world. How far does your ‘friendliness’ (hospitality) extend? Just to your friends??

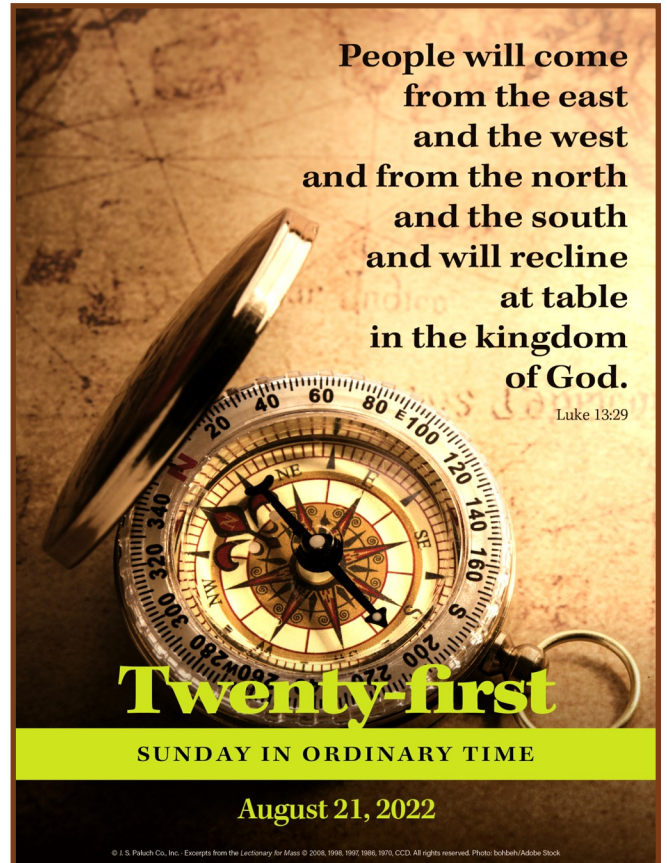

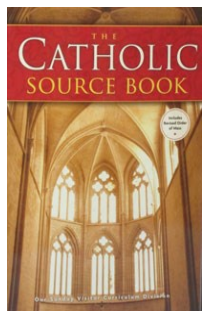

**CATHOLIC QUIZ:** *This Week's Question: "What are the 'Autumn Summers'?"*



*The Answer to Last Week's Question: "Who was the Saint Louis, for whom the city in Missouri was named?" Louis IX was born in Poissy, France in 1214. He succeeded to the throne at the age of twelve under the regency of his mother. On his twenty-first birthday he assumed full kingship. He was a very early member of the then newly-established Third Order of St. Francis of Assisi, and lived with Franciscan simplicity and promoted peace. Louis generally remained neutral in international disputes, but in 1242, he was forced to go to war with England. After the war, he made restitution to the innocent people whose property had been destroyed. He established the University at the Sorbonne (1252) and many Franciscan friaries and convents.*

*King Louis led two crusades. He was captured and imprisoned during the Sixth (1244-1249). At the onset of the Seventh Crusade in 1270, Louis died, mourned by the people of France, but especially, the poor, to whom he had shown such special care during his reign. He was canonized in 1297. The ideal of a godly ruler, Louis is one of the principal Patron Saints of France, and many French settlements in the New World were named in his honor, as well as Franciscan Missions, such as 'San Luis Rey' in California!*

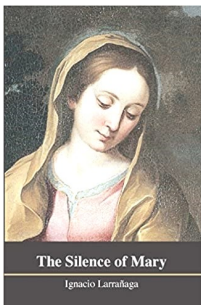

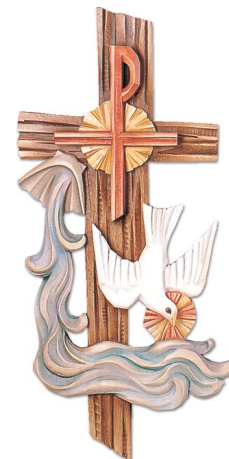

### ***Are there 'statutes of limitations' regarding confession?***

*Question:* Are there "statutes of limitations" regarding confession? For instance, if I stole a candy bar as a child, never confessed it but still remember it as an adult, should I confess it? What about more serious sins that I've never confessed?

*Answer:* When one confesses their sins, they are forgiven from all the sins they have committed since their last confession. Since it is not possible to remember or state every single venial sin (or small sin), it is sufficient to mention non-mortal sins in a general way, such as, "I am guilty of anger, gossip, or inattentiveness at prayer," and so forth. However, one is only required to state serious sins in kind and number, such as, "I committed the sin of looking at pornography on two occasions."

Given our often poor memory, things will be forgotten. For this reason many penitents conclude their confession by saying: "For these and any other sins I cannot recall, I ask pardon and absolution."

As for those times one forgets to mention a mortal sin, as long as one does not intentionally fail to mention the sin, the confession is valid. When one recalls that they forgot to mention it, they should mention it in the next confession. This is also true of more serious sins from the distant past that we remember and have not brought to confession. Since it may have been true that you did not know you had to confess such matters, or simply forgot to confess them in the sacrament, your confessions since then have been valid. However, it is proper to bring these to confession now, or as you remember. In cases, however, where a person commits mortal sin(s) and intentionally fails or refuses to mention it to the priest in confession, the confession is invalid and absolution is not granted.

This would also affect all subsequent confessions until the problem is resolved by the penitent confessing what they did in kind and number. Stealing the candy bar as a young child was not likely mortal due to age and was included in your intention to seek absolution in a general way for all of your sins. But since you still remember it, it may help to bring it to the Lord in confession.

To be clear, then, it is only when one refuses to confess a serious sin they know they have committed that a confession is invalid. Honest forgetfulness happens, and in cases of recovered memory, it is proper to bring the matter, if more serious, to confession in the future.
