DID YOU KNOW.....

that the Church understands the Communion Procession. in fact every procession in liturgy, as a sign of the pilgrim Church, the body of those who believe in Christ, on their way to the Heavenly Jerusalem? (Hence, the "pilgrim shells" marking 'social distance' in the aisles!) When we move in procession, particularly the procession to receive the Body and Blood of Christ in Communion, we are a sign, a symbol of that pilgrim Church "on the way." For some, however, the experience of the Communion Procession has become prosaic, analogous perhaps to standing in line at the supermarket. This is a dreadfully inaccurate and impoverished understanding of what is a significant religious action. The Communion Procession is an action of the Body of Christ. We join the countless ranks of all the baptized who have gone before us, our loved ones, the canonized and uncanonized saints down through the ages, who at their time in history formed a part of this mighty stream of believers. This action by Christ's body, our procession, should move with dignity; our bearing should be that of those who know they have been redeemed by Christ and are coming to receive their God!

In the United States, the Council of Catholic Bishops has determined that "the norm is that Holy Communion is to be received standing, unless an individual member of the faithful wishes to receive Communion while kneeling..." Because a number of communicants desire to receive Holy Communion kneeling, and in pastoral regard for their need, beginning next week, kneelers will be placed at the front, in the main aisle, and those wishing to receive Holy Communion while kneeling, may simple move to one of the two kneelers. The Eucharistic Minister will then move in front of the kneeler to distribute Holy Communion. At the present time, because of the health protocols, the Precious Blood is not being distributed. Remember that in receiving Christ under either 'species' - the sacred host or the chalice -- one always receives "the whole Christ". As the old adage reminds us: "In essentials there must be Unity; in non-essentials there must be Liberty; but in all things, there must be Charity." Whether one chooses to receive Holy Communion standing (the 'norm') or kneeling, is not a matter for criticism of a fellow believer!


