

DID YOU KNOW.....


that in the midst of genuine concern about inflation, rising food prices, etc. that we sometimes forget that we are very privileged citizens of the industrialized 'First World'?

Too often we forget how undeservedly blessed we are to be living in real affluence, and we tend to focus instead on what we are lacking or how we are being inconvenienced! Consider these "9 Simple Steps to Third World Living": First, take out the furniture from your house. You can leave a few old blankets, a kitchen table, maybe a wooden stool. You've never had a bed. Second, get rid of all your clothing, however, each person may keep the oldest suit or dress, a shirt or blouse. The head of the family has the only pair of shoes. Third, all appliances of any kind have to be removed. Keep a box of matches, a small bag of flour, some sugar, salt, a small bag of dried beans. Rescue the moldy potatoes from the garbage can: those are tonight's meal. Fourth, dismantle the bathroom, shut off the running water, take out the wiring and the lights, and everything run by electricity. Fifth, take away the multi-roomed house and move the family into the storage shed. Sixth, no more postal, fire, or police services. And certainly no internet! The two-classroom school is three miles away, but only one or two of your kids can attend anyway, and they will have no books or writing materials. Seventh, get rid of your bank accounts, stock certificates, pension plans, insurance policies. You now have a cash hoard of \$5, and remember that each person in the family is expected to live on no more than \$1.25 per day – when they can earn that much! Eighth, get out and start cultivating your three acres. Try hard to raise at least \$300 in cash crops, because your landlord will want one-third, and your money lender (for the seed and fertilizer) will take 12% interest on your loan - monthly. Ninth, find some way for your children to bring in a little extra money, so that you can have something to eat most days. It will not be enough to keep your bodies healthy, and there is no access to health care, so lop off 25-30 years from your life expectancy. The Church teaches what is called the "preferential option for the poor." What this means, using a visual image, is to imagine everyone in the world lined up, from richest to poorest. Where would you be in that line? Most of us would say that we are somewhere in the middle of the line. But the fact of the matter is that because we live in the "Industrialized First World", because of the infrastructure, opportunity, and social 'safety nets' (like Welfare), we're in the top 8% of that line, with 92% of the world's population standing behind us in line! The Church's "preferential option for the poor" does not mean that you have to leave your place in the line (although many, many saints, like Mother Teresa of Calcutta and St. Francis of Assisi, have done just that!), but you do have to "turn around in the line" and become aware of all of those behind you! If you are always facing those ahead of you in the line, you will always feel 'cheated', deprived, like a 'loser'. But if you simply turn around in the line and look at all of those behind you, the values of gratitude, generosity, and blessed-to-be-a-blessing will become clear to you. Something to remember, when tempted to ingratitude and grumbling about what we don't have! For Catholics, "thanksgiving" is not the 4th Thursday in November. It is a life-style based on awareness!


