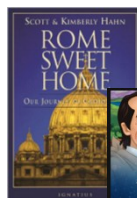

## DID YOU KNOW....

that next weekend, 40 of our young people will make their First Holy Communion?

For the past several years, we have had the families of our First Communicants choose at which of the six weekend Masses they would make their First Communion. Even our very large church would not be able to accommodate all of the First Communicants' families and friends at one Mass! There are some 'spiritual benefits' to doing it this way: many of our parishioners expressed their appreciation at being able to participate in a First Communion Mass – some for the first time in years! The celebration of First Communion is not just one special day in the life of a family who have a First Communicant; it is a special day in the life of a parish and for the whole Family of God! Second, because of the smaller groups of children at each Mass, more attention could be given to the individual children; photos will be taken at every Mass and the child is not just one small face in a sea of faces taken from much further back in the church; and the Priests are able to personalize the Homily for that particular group of children! Third, the First Communion Masses are the 'ordinary' Mass of the Sunday, not just one 'special day of the year' - and so, hopefully, the children are beautifully introduced into regular weekly attendance and reception of Holy Communion!

A special word of thanks to those who worked so hard (and so well) to prepare our young people for this most wonderful experience, our Catechists: *Regina Kelley, Brandi Granke, Suzanna Ignacio, Juana Taite*, and the Catechists' Assistant: *Aiden Kelley*! (And, of course, our wonderful Director of Religious Education, *Sister Joellen*!)

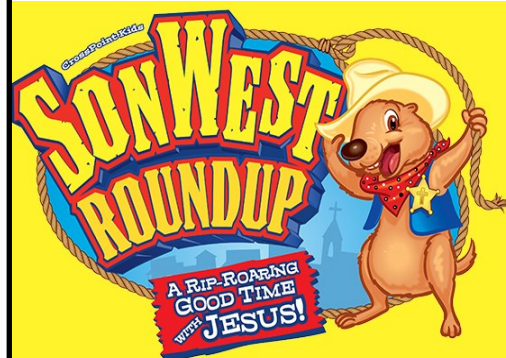
Please take time to congratulate and welcome our First Communicants into the Eucharistic community! And take a few moments in thankful prayer to recall your own First Communion!

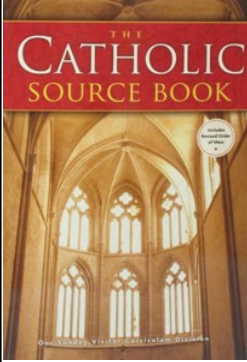

**CATHOLIC QUIZ:** *This week's Question: "What is the 'Power of the Keys'?"*

*The Answer to Last Week's Question: "Who was 'Pere Marquette'?"*



A city in Michigan, lakes in Wisconsin, steamships, and even a railroad line serving the upper mid-west, were named for this intrepid Jesuit missionary/explorer! Born in France in 1637, he served in French Canada, founding the first European settlement in Michigan – Sault Ste. Marie. In 1673, *Pere* ('Father' in French) *Jacques Marquette* and layman *Louis Joliet*, and five other Frenchmen, began their expedition to explore the Mississippi River. Their two year missionary journey proved that the Mississippi flows south to empty in the Gulf of Mexico, rather than west to the Pacific, as was popularly thought! (Like his fellow Jesuit, *Padre Eusebio Francisco Kino*, he was first and foremost a missionary, seeking the salvation of souls – but the explorations that they made, in search of new Native Peoples to evangelize, changed the maps of the world!) *Pere Marquette* died on the return journey to Canada, but his travel diaries were carried back and carefully read!

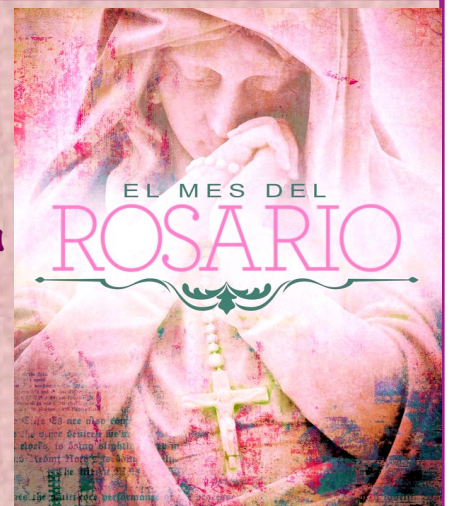

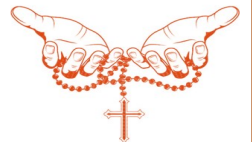

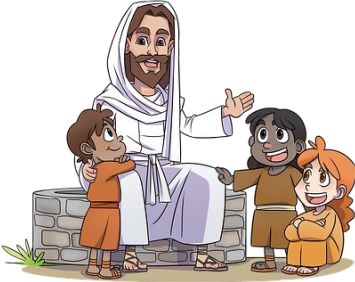

### HAND CARVED in BETHLEHEM

**PLEASE STOP BY THE TABLES OF RELIGIOUS WARES (Nativity set, rosaries, statues, crucifixes, charms, etc.) AFTER ALL THE MASSES THE WEEKEND OF (May 13 & 14).**

Ayman Khair is representing about 180 Christian families from Bethlehem. These families have been dependent upon sales of their hand carved religious articles to tourists of the Holy Land. Due to the conflict in the Middle East and the Pandemic, tourism has been stopped completely from March 2, 2020 till February 2022 and it is very slow now.

It is very important to support them at this critical time since they have no income and there is no government to take care of them and help them. In order to survive, they have turned to Christian communities in the United State to purchase their articles.

These **hand carved religious articles are beyond description.** Carved from **wood of the sacred Olive tree**, this workmanship has been traditional for these families for hundreds of years. It is hoped that through the efforts of Mr. Khair, these families who have little income are able to stay and survive in the Holy Land.

Sadly enough, the Christian population dropped from 22 % to less than 2% in the last 20 years. Thank you in advance for your support.



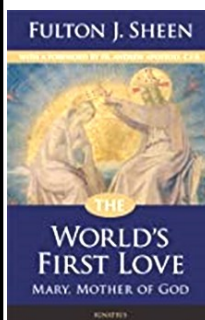

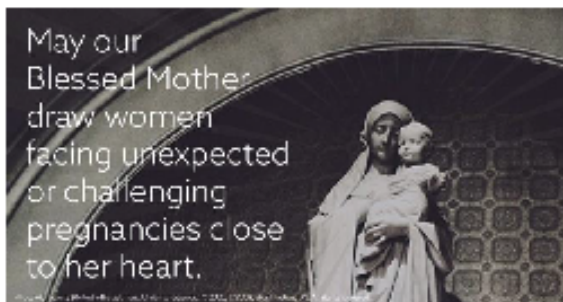

## REFLECT

In the Blessed Virgin Mary, we are given the model of motherhood. When the angel Gabriel appeared to her, Mary accepted the invitation to be the mother of Jesus, who is “the way and the truth and the life” (Jn 14:6). Her unexpected pregnancy presented many challenges. Yet while the path laid before her was not easy, Mary chose to give of herself in sacrificial love.

In bravely living out their vocation, mothers reflect the sacrificial love of Christ on a daily basis. With the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of Life as our guide, may we work to support all mothers, especially those who are most in need.
