

that next weekend, 40 of our young people will make their First Holy Communion?

For the past several years, we have had the families of our First Communicants choose at which of the six weekend Masses they would make their First Communion. Even our very large church would not be able to accommodate all of the First Communicants' families and friends at one Mass! There are some 'spiritual benefits' to doing it this way: many of our parishioners expressed their appreciation at being able to participate in a First Communion Mass – some for the first time in years! The celebration of First Communion is not just one special day in the life of a family who have a First Communicant; it is a special day in the life of a parish and for the whole Family of God! 

The Answer to Last Week's Question: "Who was 'Pere Marquette"? A city in Michigan, lakes in Wisconsin, steamships, and even a railroad line serving the upper mid-west, were named for this intrepid Jesuit missionary/explorer! Born in France in 1637, he served in French Canada, founding the first European settlement in Michigan – Sault Ste. Marie. In 1673, Pere ('Father' in French) Jacques Marquette and layman Louis Joliet, and five other Frenchmen, began their expedition to explore the Mississippi River. Their two year missionary journey proved that the Mississippi flows south to empty in the Gulf of Mexico, rather than west to the Pacific, as was popularly thought! (Like his fellow Jesuit, Padre Eusebio Francisco Kino, he was first and foremost a missionary, seeking the salvation of souls – but the explorations that they made, in search of new Native Peoples to evangelize, changed the maps of the world!) Pere Marquette died on the return journey to Canada, but his travel diaries were carried back and carefully read!

Ayman Khair is representing about 180 Christian families from Bethlehem. These families have been dependent upon sales of their hand carved religious articles to tourists of the Holy Land. Due to the conflict in the Middle East and the Pandemic, tourism has been stopped completely from March 2, 2020 till February 2022 and it is very slow now.

It is very important to support them at this critical time since they have no income and there is no government to take care of them and help them. In order to survive, they have turned to Christian communities in the United State to purchase their articles.



Our GriefShare group will meet every Wednesday, starting May 24th, 2023, 5 p.m.to 7:00 p.m. in Madonna Hall, room #3.



In the Blessed Virgin Mary, we are given the model of motherhood. With the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of Life as our guide, may we work to support all mothers, especially those who are most in need.
