St. Andrew the Apostle Catholic Church Pipe Organ History

The idea of a pipe organ for St. Andrew's was first discussed at Building Committee meetings during



the planning phases of church construction. In the event that the parish decided to have a pipe organ, a place would be needed to put the pipes! Two rooms, called "pipe chambers", were included in the building design. You can't see them from inside the church because they are behind panels above each side of the altar retablo.

An Organ Search Committee was formed. Members of that committee visited churches in Arizona and across the U.S. to see and play all types of organs, small and large; pipe organs, electronic organs, and electronic organs with "real" pipes. The committee researched new, custom-built organs, but found that they were far more expensive than the church could afford. The committee prayed and looked and waited!

Soon, they learned that a 1947 Möller pipe organ in a church in Racine, Wisconsin, was for sale. This organ had

been lovingly tuned and maintained by three generations of the same organ-building family and was being offered for sale because its church building was being sold. It was small enough that the pipes could fit into the St. Andrew's pipe chambers and large enough to support the singing of an assembly of 1,000 people.

To top it off, the price was lower than comparable electronic instruments, even with the additional costs of moving, rebuilding, and installation. Suddenly, the church could buy a "real" pipe organ for less than the cost of an electronic one. Considering that there were pipe organs that have been serving their communities for 400 years and that electronic organs only last about 25 years, the Building Committee agreed that this organ was too good to pass up!

Michael O'Sullivan, Tucson organ builder, went to Wisconsin, played and inspected the organ, and reported that it was all the church hoped for.

Thanks to the generosity of many, many St. Andrew's parishioners, all costs to purchase, renovate and install the organ were covered by donations from the faithful of the parish.

The organ was installed and dedicated in 2008, and has served the parish and Sierra Vista community well for the last 14 years.

Recently we have learned that this is a very valuable and historic instrument and is listed in the U.S. Historical Registry of Pipe Organs. Every organist who has visited St. Andrew the Apostle Church to perform in a recital, Hymn Festival or Messiah Performance, is thrilled to have a chance to play on it. We are blessed with a great treasure.

BUT NOW THE ORGAN NEEDS <u>YOUR HELP</u>.... PLEASE TURN OVER AND KEEP READING

In early 2021 the current instrument began to fail to the point of needing immediate repairs and an assessment of the instrument, which has been in service since the 2008 installation. At that time we found that the original installer is no longer available to even tune the organ, much less repair it. We contracted with Grahame Davis, an organ builder and owner of Pipe Organ Artisans of Arizona. He built and maintains a similar Moller Organ at Dove Lutheran Church in Tucson and the Mighty Wurlitzer Organ (3000 pipe chambers) at the Tucson Fox Theater. Mr. Davis recently tuned our organ and provided an in-depth assessment of our organ. He was accompanied by past Dean of the Southern Arizona American Guild of Organists, Dr. Douglas Leightenheimer. In summary:

The estimate to repair and make improvements to the organ is for a total of \$95,320 which covers a new Controller (\$65,320) and three new electronic voices at \$10,000 each for a total of



\$30,000. At this time, the Parish Board of Directors has approved the controller ONLY for the following reasons:

- The control system interfaces with the player and puts the console in touch with the pipes and playing systems. The present system is home-made and there is no documentation or schematics for it. No one can repair this controller except the installer, who is retired
- The controller we now have uses technology which is now out of date. Finding similar components to replace present components should they fail or stop functioning is very problematic.
- Many modern playing aids are included in the new control system and the features of this system can be seen on the Peterson Company web site.
- The referenced playing aids will enable pianists to play the organ without the use of the
 pedals; an important innovation that will result in even more Parish use of the instrument
 and widen the pool of persons able to play it well.
