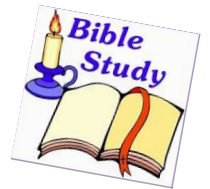

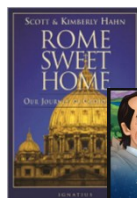

DID YOU KNOW....

that we will celebrate our Lenten Penance Service this Monday evening, from 5:00–8:00 PM?

At least 6 Priest/Confessors will be present to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation with us as we prepare spiritually for Holy Week/Easter! While going to Confession during the Lenten/Easter Season is a requirement of all adult Catholics, since the 1200's, frequent Confession is an indispensable 'aid' to spiritual growth and personal maturation. Frequent Confession offers a mature Catholic the opportunity to hold oneself more accountable for your own spiritual growth. This healthy self-awareness, which is promoted by an examination of conscience and sacramental Confession, has a tremendous and very positive effect in keeping one's life focused and purposeful. A "purpose-full" life, lived amidst the multiple distractions and what *Pope Francis* called the 'dictatorship of schedules' is very difficult for most of us. Confession can provide a powerful focus on "first things"! (*"Put first the Kingdom of God and a right relationship with God, and everything else will be added."* Matthew 6:33)

There is also the on-going issue of self-deception for most of us, which leads to "good enough" thinking: "I'm not living up to my full potential, but it's good enough!" "I'm not as good a Catholic as were my parents, but I'm a good enough (read 'occasional') Catholic."

Confession places before us the question, "Is your 'good enough' good enough for God?"

The old joke, "*A clear conscience is usually the sign of a bad memory,*" really speaks to this "good enough" mentality, which is failing to take my one, brief, precious life seriously.

Sometimes we think that going to Confession is limited to dealing with serious sin, and while that is certainly very important, we can also go to Confession to receive the grace of the Sacrament in overcoming venial (small, habitual) sins, which weaken the soul. *St. John of the Cross* said, "*If you are being tied down with thin strings or with a thick rope – you're still bound!*"

Confession also allows us to address 'sins of omission'. Carefully and sincerely examining where we need to *grow* in our spiritual life, looking at areas of spiritual immaturity (and we all have them!) – and receiving the grace of the Sacrament to begin seriously addressing those areas, brings real progress in the spiritual life.

Perhaps one of the greatest graces which comes from Confession is the liberation from our past. Too many people live in their past - with regrets for actions taken and actions omitted.

Living in the past makes as much sense as paying rent on an apartment you used to live in! Living in the past is a waste of time, emotional and spiritual energy! Through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we can be reconciled with our personal past in a healing, liberating way.

The 'absolute' of Absolution is accepting that God has definitively dealt with our sins – past and present – and calls us to walk confidently toward that future which is in His keeping.

The great French Dominican preacher, *Jean-Baptiste Lacordaire*, said: "*Every Christian is a citizen of the future!*" Through Confession we can be liberated for our own future!

In our Parish, there are usually two Priest/Confessors available before Masses most days, and so there are plenty of opportunities to avail yourself of this enormous stream of grace!

Source of Light

For once you were darkness, but now in the Lord you are light. Live as Children of light– for the fruit of the light is found in all that is good and right and true. (Ephesians 5:8-9)

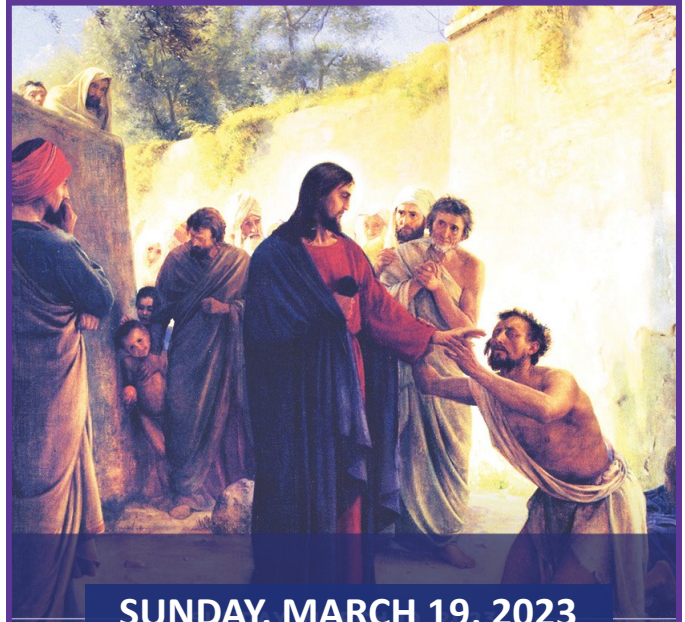

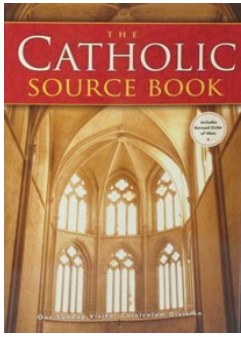

CATHOLIC QUIZ: *This week's Question: "Why are the statues and crucifix veiled during the last two weeks of Lent?"*



The Answer to Last Week's Question: "What is 'Mothering Sunday'?" This is one of the 'aliases' of *Laetare (Rejoice) Sunday* – the 4th Sunday of Lent! There was an ancient custom of visiting one's 'mother church' – (where you had been baptized: 'born again') – on *Laetare Sunday*! In the natural evolution of this pilgrimage to your 'mother parish', people would spend time with mother and families. Naturally, roses were the traditional flowers for the day, because rose was the color of the vestments at Mass on *Laetare Sunday*. After Mass, roses were taken to mothers, along with special cakes and gifts. Long before Anna Jarvis held her service to honor all mothers or Woodrow Wilson proclaimed the second Sunday of May to be 'Mothers' Day' in 1914, Catholic folks were honoring mothers, spiritual and natural, and this mid-Lent Sunday had become a day of family reunions and festivity!

Catechism of the Catholic Church #2560

Brief Examination of Conscience – based on the Seven Deadly Sins and the Seven Virtues

PRIDE - Have I placed myself at the center of my thinking and acting and speaking. Am I self absorbed in my priorities and planning? Do I seek to 'control' others?

AVARICE - Am I materialistic; thinking that I need more things to be happy? Am I dissatisfied with what I do have? Am I looking for security in what I own rather than my relationship with God?

LUST - Do I look at or treat others as objects for my pleasure or desires? Do I adulterate my sexuality through the poison of pornography or view images that objectivize others. Do I think or act as though sexuality is "dirty" and not part of my human dignity?

ANGER - Do I allow anger or resentment to control my emotions or actions at times. Do I nurse grudges or give way to the temptation to seek revenge? Am I concerned about 'evening the score' with others? Do I fixate on past hurts and perceived slights?

GLUTTONY - Do I let my appetites control my actions? Do I overindulge - eating or drinking more than I should simply because I can? Do I live with the fear that there might not be enough for me? Am I selfish?

ENVY - Do I find myself resentful of what others have or how others live? Do I struggle with ingratitude – not recognizing and acknowledging the good in my life? Have I accustomed myself to dissatisfaction?

SLOTH - Am I lazy, tending to self-satisfaction? Do I fail to follow through on commitments and make excuses for myself? Do I have a "it's good enough" attitude and seek the easiest way to fulfill my responsibilities and commitments?

HUMILITY – Am I honest about myself and my limitations? Am I willing to learn from situations, instead of blaming or accusing? Do I genuinely seek to give others precedence?

GENEROSITY – Do I respond to the needs of others graciously and generously? Am I willing to share my time, my help, my attention with others? Do I find joy in giving as well as receiving?

Am I genuinely happy with the good that others receive? Am I grateful?

CHASTITY - Do I approach my own and the sexuality of others with respect? Is my language respectful in matters of sexuality. Am I careful about the things that I view or read? Do I promote chastity in lifestyle, dress, language, behavior?

JUSTICE - Do I have a commitment to seek justice – right relationships - for myself and for others? Do I strive not to become complacent about injustices done to others? Is my concern for justice evident in my spending, my voting, my priorities? Do I understand that God's justice is about working for restoration, rather than punishment/revenge?

TEMPERANCE - Do I seek moderation in all things? Do I seek to balance my actual needs as opposed to my wants? Do I resist acting on impulse? Do I have a growing sense of gratitude?

Do I understand that the very best things in life are not things?

PATIENCE - Do I respond rather than react to people or situations? Do I seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit in making decisions and setting priorities? Do I seek God's will in all areas of my life?

DILIGENCE – Do I accomplish my responsibilities with energy, joy, and a willingness to help others. Am I willing to "go the extra mile" in my serving? Am I dependable? Do I follow through on commitments and responsibilities in a timely manner?

We are so grateful for generous parishioners of St Andrew the Apostle Catholic Church, Good Shepherd Mission and the people of Sierra Vista, Huachuca City and Whetstone.

Did you know that 100% of the generated revenue from the sales of the donated items at your SVDP THRIFT STORE at 220 Myer, stays in our local area? It’s a blessing.

Like our founders, Blessed Frederic Ozanam and Blessed Rosalie Rendu, we strive to see the face of Christ in each person we encounter and embrace them by providing a network of charity.

We have 36 active Vincentians augmented by 29 associate volunteers. The office and food-bank at 614 Bartow is open 5 days a week from 12-4PM. We individually greet about 40-50 families a day to discuss their needs and discern how we can help. Sometimes it’s a box of food, sometimes it’s an ID card so they can get a job, sometimes it’s help paying for pre-scriptions, sometimes it’s paying a utility bill so that our friends have light in the dark, heat in the winter and cooling in the summer, sometimes it’s helping our friends pay their rent so they can stay in their homes. No matter what our friends need we always treat each person with dignity and respect and LISTEN to them.

While the numbers below are important statistics, they don’t show the many ways that the Vincentians are blessed, the joy on the faces of our friends when we are able to help them with their needs, the hugs, the friendships we have with each other and the understanding that we are serving Christ one friend at a time. Again, you are a link in the chain to be the safety net for those in despair.

Linda K. called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and Fr. Greg led the group in an opening prayer.

Minutes from the January meeting were approved as written.

Finance (Kate): Income for January was \$89,404 of which \$3,649 were designated to Good Shepherd Mission. Expenses were \$80,439. The Parish general fund level is \$571,515. The Building Our Church fund balance is \$100,983.

St Vincent de Paul Society (Kate reporting for Pauline): Store sales continue to be strong. Leah Waller has settled well into the role of Store Manager. Because of mandated wage increases and an increased number of friends utilizing the store voucher system, the discount program for staff and volunteers has been discontinued. The Store will soon implement the Better Bucks program. The Food Bank continues to distribute over 1,000 food boxes per month. Motion sensor lights are in the process of being installed in areas on the Store Grounds.

Annual Catholic Appeal (Ann): The annual dinner was well-attended, with a very strong start to reaching the Parish financial goal. We are now at 72% of our goal.

Music Ministry (Michelle): The first organ recital is scheduled for March 24th. The guest musician is the music director from Our Mother of Sorrows Parish in Tucson. Target date for completion of organ repairs is March 10th.

Knights of Columbus and **St. Paul's Street Evangelization** (Chuck): A public rosary will be held at Chili's on Saturday, March 25th. The Lenten Fish Fry evenings will resume this Friday at the Columbian Association Hall and continue throughout Lent.

Building and Grounds (Maryann): Installation of the Kino Hall HVAC system indoors has now been completed, with only some finishing work outside remaining. The Divine Mercy Chapel doors are scheduled for repainting. The screens covering the pipe organ area in the Church will be replaced as soon as the logistics can be coordinated. There were some findings at a recent fire inspection of the campus, and these will be corrected as soon as possible.

Ladies of St A (Fran): The "after action" discussion of the Bazaar and St. Nicholas fair will be the topic for the March meeting as well as nominations for leadership positions for the upcoming year.

University of Arizona News (Linda): The local campus will move onto Garden Avenue, once renovations are completed on an existing building, and be a more visible presence in the West End.

Our Lady of the Sierras Foundation (Charlie): The retreat center has a two-part series Lenten retreat scheduled for Saturday March 11th and Saturday April 1st. Pre-registration through the Our Lady of the Sierras Office. La Purisima hosted the Confirmation retreat last weekend for the combined youth of St. Andrew and Our Lady of the Mountains Parishes.

Synod Results (Michelle): Michelle reviewed the results from the Parish Synod listening sessions held last year and used this to find parallels between the findings of the session and our Parish goals in general. Michelle invited Council members to share ideas on ways to go forward with parishioner catechesis, participation in ministries and bringing Mass attendance back up to pre-pandemic levels.

Fr. Samuel: Father expressed gratitude to the Parish for the generous donation of \$29,125 to the Via Christi Society for completion of a refectory in Nigeria.

Pastor Report: This year's Lenten Mission will be conducted by Fr. Richard Rivera on March 12, 13 and 14th in the evening of those dates. Penance Service is scheduled for Monday, March 20th. Deacon Carlson from Our Lady of the Mountains will present special bible studies on Wednesdays in March. The Knights of Columbus will host a spiritual morning for the men of the Parish on 6 March. Linda adjourned the meeting at 6:25 p.m. Fr. Greg led a closing prayer and Fr. Samuel imparted his blessing.
