about the "Advent Advantage"?

For most of us, Thanksgiving kicks off a frenzied and stressful race to Christmas and a resulting struggle to keep Christ in Christmas!

Here we Catholics have a real advantage, we have Advent! We have between three and four weeks (this year, just three weeks, as the 4th Sunday of Advent is also Christman Eve!) to experience some quality time with our Lord and with our souls!


Advent has a lot in common with Lent and, in fact, used to be much more 'penitential' in character: more prayer, fasting, and charity, in spiritual preparation for the Coming of the Lord! The violet vestments, the omission of the "Gloria" from the Mass, the Advent Wreaths and Advent Calendars (available in the Office!) and the Readings from the Prophets all focus on the theme of "preparedness" helping us to make ready the path of the Lord! Our materialistic culture ("which knows the price of everything and the value of nothing") threatens to invade and dominate the Holy Season, and blur our vision of reality! Fasting and Almsgiving (charity in all its forms) keep us aware of the proper use of worldly goods and of the need to offset other people's poverty by our own prosperity.

Advent helps us to contain our excitement until Christ comes and to use that energy in getting ready. Even penance has a joyful aspect as we pause in our celebrations to acknowledge the "reason for the season" – the coming of the One Who redeems us from our sins and to clean house spiritually!

Please pick up your copy of your Advent Reflections booklet, with beautiful spiritual reflections each day, written by our Carmelite Sisters of the Most Sacred Heart! Our "Advent Advantage" is part of a 'discipline of joy' that is so important for us as Catholics – living each moment with a holy awareness! Listen to the words of the Mass after the Lord's Prayer, when the Priest says: "Deliver us, Lord, we pray from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days, that, by the help of Your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Savior JESUS Christ." That says it all - a perfect prayer for this Holy Season! AND Did You Know that we "tithe" the money given to the "Building Our Church Fund"?

We put 10% in an emergency fund for our overseas Mission Partners.

Just as the "Building Our Church Fund" provides funding for Parish emergency/unbudgeted needs – such as the upgrading of our sound system – so this 10% allows us to respond to emergency Mission needs. Most recently, we were able to provide \$3300 for the building of a cistern in Haiti -to provide a safe water supply for the village being served by Fr. Leonville! (Check our webpage for photos!) Because of your extraordinary generosity – in providing not only for the needs of our own Parish but also for our Mission partners in Haiti, Nigeria, Ecuador, Kenya, Mexico and Nepal – the Church is truly being built throughout the world!





CATHOLIC QUIZ: This week's Question: "What is a 'Holy Day of Obligation'?"



The Answer to Last Week's Question: "What is the Season of Advent?" Advent is the Season of 'expectation' of Christ and is somewhat 'penitential' in tone (no 'Gloria' in the Mass, violet vestments, fasting, extra opportunities to go to Confession). It is four weeks long, or slightly less, this year we have a lesser Advent – only three full weeks! The first two weeks focusing on JESUS' final coming as Lord and Judge. The final eight days anticipate His coming in history – in His birth in Bethlehem. Since the 10th century, the First Sunday of Advent has marked the beginning of the Liturgical Year in the Western Church.




