

### DID YOU KNOW.....

that one of the most sacred moments in the Mass is the 'Sign of Peace'? Too often, this profound liturgical expression of a great theological truth, is minimized or mistaken for a gesture of welcome or simply friendship. Second only in holiness to the Consecration of the Mass (and reception of Holy Communion), the Sign of Peace is also initiated with the words of JESUS Himself: "Peace I leave you, My peace I give you." (John 14:27) and were spoken at the Last Supper.

The 'sign', given with an embrace, a handshake, a wave, and most lately, a 'fist-bump', is a deeply significant gesture of extending the peace of Christ to those around us, with whom we are sharing the Holy Sacrifice. It is the preparation for our reception of Holy Communion, as we are expressing in this way our willingness to be at peace with others. (Some can share of their experience that the Sign of Peace became a moment of reconciliation with another person – "so when you offer your gift to God at the altar, and you remember that your brother or sister has something against you, leave your gift there at the altar, and first go and be reconciled. . ."(Matthew 5:23-24). The Sign of Peace can become the actual moment of restoration of peace in our lives. If the person is not physically present, it might become the moment to promise the Lord that you will work for peace and commit to making the first step in reconciliation!

Think of it this way: when we come to Mass, we, each of us and all of us, are coming to ask graces and blessings from God. We are seeking: health, peace of mind, security, reassurance that we are loved and cared for, consolation, healing for someone we love, forgiveness and a fresh beginning in grace, gratitude for God's goodness, strength to get through the day. . each of us asking for various gifts from God. At the Sign of Peace we turn to others and with this gesture say, "Everything that I have asked for today of God's goodness, I would like to share with you now!" The Sign of Peace becomes a kind of "gift/grace exchange" seen in this way! An 'empty gesture'? Not at all! It is a profound action of love overflowing with graces!

In his Angelus Message on 7 May 2023, Pope Francis said: ". . .Since we are heirs of His peace, He wants us to be meek, open, available to listen, capable of defusing tensions and weaving harmony. This is witnessing to JESUS and is worth more than a thousand words and many sermons. As disciples of JESUS, let us ask ourselves if we behave like this where we live? Do we ease tensions? Do we defuse conflicts? Do we know how to respond with peaceful actions and words? Everyone should ask themselves this!" It begins in the Sign of Peace!

The root of the word 'liturgy' means 'work or action taken on behalf of others' and the Sacred Liturgy is the work of God, with God, for God, and for the good of others – our sisters and brothers in Christ. The liturgical Sign of Peace is based in the very words of JESUS and in the Beatitude: "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God." (Matthew 5:9)

The second-most 'holy' moment of the Mass, the Sign of Peace prepares us to receive our Lord in the Holy Eucharist and to live the grace of our Communion as we go forth into the world.



CATHOLIC QUIZ: This week's Question: "What is the 'epiclesis' in the Mass?"



The Answer to Last Week's Question: "What is a 'presbyter'?" A presbyter (from the Greek: elder = a man of 50+ years) had not only lived longer than most people, but presumably had acquired a certain amount of wisdom and discretion. Consequently, in Jewish culture, such men became advisors to rulers, taught younger persons, and often acted as judges in their communities. The role of the Elder was well-established in Judaism by the 1st Century, and the term was used in the early Church, to designate those who worked with the Apostles and the Deacons. Very early (by the end of the 1<sup>st</sup> Century) the term was used to designate *priests*, as the third Order of Ministry, (with the Apostles (bishops) and Deacons. In the Protestant churches, the term "Elder" is used to describe those elected by their congregations to assist the Minister in the administration/


service of the church. (The *Presbyterian Church* takes its title from its governance by these elected (lay) "Elders".)
