

DID YOU KNOW.....

that the 'scallop seashell' is the symbol both of Baptism and Pilgrimage?

While immersion was the normal practice in the early Church, early representations (in the catacombs) show JESUS and John standing in knee deep water with John pouring water over JESUS' head from a scallop shell. The seashell entered Christian iconography as the symbol of Baptism, and appears in the tile work around the church, especially around the Baptismal Font and above doorways and windows. A gilded 'scallop seashell' is used by the Priest or Deacon to pour the waters of Baptism, and Baptismal gowns and candles are often marked with a 'scallop seashell'!

The seashell is also a symbol of Pilgrimage – especially associated with the pilgrimage to the Shrine of Santiago Compostella in Spain. The "Camino" or "Way of St. James" is marked with carved or painted seashells, directing the pilgrims on the right path. Those who made the Pilgrimage to Santiago were entitled to wear the emblem of the scallop seashell on their cloaks and hats. This scallop seashell became so associated in European culture with this international pilgrimage, that in the 1890's, a Dutch oil company adopted it as their company title and logo: "Shell Oil"!

It was *Pope St. John Paul II*, who in his apostolic letter "Tertio Millennio Adventiente"

("On the Coming Third Millennium"), spoke of the Christian life as "a pilgrimage to

the Heart of God", and invited us to see our lives in terms of a spiritual journey – a pilgrimage – which has as its goal union with God. Pope St. John Paul said that when we begin to live as pilgrims, as members of a 'Pilgrim Church', then the world will come to appreciate and respond to the 'call to pilgrimage' – the deep 'homing instinct' implanted in every human soul. This truth is beautifully expressed in St. Augustine's famous quote: "Our hearts are formed by Thee, O God, and our hearts are restless until they find their rest in Thee!")

To celebrate this truth, of ourselves as a 'Pilgrim Church', walking together in our Baptismal dignity and unity, our very talented *Michael Prostka* is painting beautiful scallop seashells in the aisles of the church, leading up to the altar. That these 'pilgrim shells' also help us to remember to maintain social distancing in the lines going to receive Holy Communion is also a practical application – they replace the crosses, which were painted in the aisles during the pandemic for that purpose!

Please use this beautiful and popular symbol to remember your Baptism and your calling –

to be a pilgrim!

We received a beautiful 'thank you' and up-date from *Katie Logan*, the young woman whom we helped with her student loans, so that she could begin her discernment process with the

Franciscan Sisters of Christian Charity (Sister Joellen and Sister Doris' Community). Check it out on our website and flocknotes!

CATHOLIC QUIZ: This Week's Question: "Where in Egypt did the Holy Family go when they fled from Bethlehem?"

The Answer to last week's Question: "Who, exactly, are the 'Three Kings'?" Of the mysterious 'Magi', there is little more than mention in the Gospel. Matthew (2:1) calls them 'Magi' and tells of the three gifts they brought. This gave rise to the tradition that there were three. Thought to be ancient astrologists, or perhaps, Zoroastrian 'wise men', but since the early Middle Ages, kings became the more common image, because of Old Testament texts referring to Gentile rulers and kings coming to acknowledge the Messiah. The Venerable Bede (672-735) considered them representatives of the three continents of Europe, Asia, and Africa – and so they are popularly depicted. The *Venerable Bede* also said that they represent the three stages of human life – youth, middle aged, and old aged! According to Medieval legend, their relics were brought from Constantinople to Milan, and from there, in 1164, to Cologne, where pilgrimages have honored them for centuries. The famous shrine/reliquary, "The City of the Three Kings" is one of the best examples of Medieval metalcraft!




